Perth Amboy Fire Battalion Chief Charged in Theft

Press Release 12/1/17 PERTH AMBOY - Middlesex County Prosecutor Andrew C. Carey and Chief Roman McKeon of the Perth Ambov Police Department announced that a city Battalion Fire Chief was charged yesterday for using a city owned computer to acquire compensatory time that was unearned.

Sammy Arroyo, 42, of Perth Amboy was charged with one count of theft by unlawful taking in the third degree and one count of computer theft in the second degree.

He was charged during an investigation by Detective Panagiotis Bouleris of the Perth Amboy Police Department. The investigation began when city officials uncovered the theft and contacted police.

The charges were filed after it was determined that between March 2016 and May 2017, Arroyo was double-dipping from the city and county by putting in for time instructing at the Middlesex County Fire Academy while also getting paid by the City of Perth Amboy for the same period of time.

Arroyo, who has 19 years of service with the City of Perth

Amboy surrendered to the Perth Amboy Police Department, was processed and then released. He has been suspended without pay.

The investigation is active and is continuing. Anyone with information is asked to call Detective Bouleris of the Perth Amboy Police Department at (732) 324-3800, or Detective Chiorella of the Middlesex County Prosecutor's Office at (732) 745-3848.

As is the case with all criminal defendants, the charges against Arroyo are merely accusations and he is presumed innocent until proven guilty.

In accordance with New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection (NJDEP) regulations for "Notification and Public Outreach", NCP Perth Amboy Holdings is required to provide information relating to environmental conditions and remedial activities being conducted at the above referenced site.

Former operations conducted at the site include copper smelting and refining from the late 1800s through the early 1970s and steel rod production from 1979 to 2009. Chemicals associated with site operations include, but may not be limited to, metals, polycyclic aromatic hydrocarbons (PAHs), and polychlorinated biphenyls (PCBs) and were initially detected in the soil in 2003. Metals have also been detected in groundwater underlying the Site. Since this time, the person conducting the remediation has determined that the contamination in the groundwater has migrated from the site towards the Raritan River. The groundwater contamination has not migrated to off-site surrounding properties and is not expected to at any point in the future.

NCP Perth Amboy Holdings has completed investigative activities and will soon commence remedial (cleanup) activities in accordance with the requirements of the NJDEP to address the chemical contaminants detected. The person conducting the remediation has evaluated the environmental impacts from the site including the potential for the contamination from this site to affect drinking water wells and/or the quality of indoor air to ensure that any impacts from the contamination are promptly mitigated.

Sensible Gun Laws





This Week in World War II 75 Years Ago

The U.S. Army Air Forces launches its first attack against Italy on December 4, 1942, as 20 B-24 bombers raid the port of Naples; two cruisers are sunk and the harbor is damaged. In the U.S., President Roosevelt receives a petition from 244 Congressmen in support of establishing a Jewish homeland in Palestine.

In Papua-New Guinea, strong attacks at Buna by U.S. troops are bloodily repulsed by the Japanese on December 5. Malaria and heat prostration are taking a heavy toll on the Americans. In the U.S., President Roosevelt, to solve lingering manpower problems on the home front, suspends the drafting of men 38 years of age and older into the military. He gives responsibility for balancing the labor needs of agriculture, industry and the military to the War Manpower Commission (established in April 1942).

On December 6 in Africa, two German tank columns try to retake Medjez el Bab, about 35 miles southwest of Tunis. They are repelled by a combination of Allied armored units, artillery and aircraft. In Europe, 93 RAF aircraft make a daylight attack on Eindhoven, the Netherlands, targeting the Philips Radio Works.


On December 7 — the first anniversary of the Japanese attack on Pearl Harbor — the *USS New Jersey*, America's largest battleship, is launched. (It is commissioned five months later.) Eleven other naval vessels are also launched on this date. A daring raid is made by 13 British commandos on the harbor of Bordeaux, France. They row 50 miles up the River Gironde in canoes and attach limpet mines to German shipping, sinking four vessels and irreparably damaging two others. Six of the raiders are captured and executed per Hitler's Commando Order; two others die of hypothermia.

U.S. troops establish a beachhead south of Buna in Papua-New Guinea on December 8, cutting off Japanese forces there. In Tunisia, German forces take the port city of Bizerte, capturing sixteen French vessels: four destroyers, nine submarines and three other warships.

The Marines turn responsibility for Guadalcanal over to the U.S. Army on December 9, with Gen. Alexander Patch of the Army's XIV Corps relieving Gen. Alexander Vandegrift of the 1st Marine Division as Commander, Operations, Guadalcanal. The Australians capture Gona, Papua-New Guinea, from the Japanese.

As of December 10, Australian troops control the entire Gona area in Papua-New Guinea. In North Africa, German tanks and infantry troops again attack at Medjez el Bab, Tunisia, but are repulsed by the Allies.






