Sweeney-Vitale Bill To Aid the Homeless Gains Senate Approval

TRENTON – Legislation authored by Senate President Steve Sweeney and Senator Joe Vitale that would respond to the crisis situations that can threaten some of the neediest residents of New Jersey with homelessness was approved by the Senate today. The bill, S-866, would create a permanent housing assistance program to help the disabled, chronically ill and long-term unemployed who are confronted with the abrupt termination of temporary programs.

“Homelessness is a treatable and preventable condition that puts people at risk for other hardships,” said Senator Sweeney. “This is emergency assistance for those who are homeless or threatened with homelessness. If you don’t have a place to live it is difficult to hold a job, maintain good health or provide family members with other basic necessities.”

The state’s Housing Assistance and Housing Hardship Extension programs, which provide assistance to people who have exhausted welfare-based emergency housing assistance and those who are disabled and awaiting social security insurance benefits, expired in July 2016 with no real replacement in place.

“Because the programs in place were temporary, the assistance it offered didn’t provide the security and certainty for people already facing insecure and uncertain living conditions,” said Senator Vitale. “Some individuals have already been left homeless and countless others are struggling to secure housing aid. But they all deserve the stability of a roof over their head.”

In the past, those receiving benefits through the emergency assistance program were granted additional rental assistance beyond the 12 months through

pilot programs implemented by the Department of Human Services. The legislation will replace the three-year “pilot” programs with a permanent emergency assistance plan.

“We often see hunger and homelessness going hand-in-hand,” said Adele LaTourette, director, New Jersey Anti-Hunger Coalition. “This measure extends critical assistance to our most vulnerable residents and makes it permanent. Unfortunately, the need for assistance with housing and food is not a temporary situation for far many people.”

The bill would make the funding permanent for individuals who are very low income, receive general assistance benefits, are Social Security recipients, are in imminent danger of homelessness, disabled or those who care for a disabled dependent, or are over 60 years of age or chronically unemployed.

South Amboy Looks to Prevent Marijuana Sales in Town

SOUTH AMBOY - The city of South Amboy is looking for ways to prevent businesses from selling marijuana in town as New Jersey Gov. Phil Murphy continues his push for the legalization of the substance.

If passed, Gov. Murphy’s proposed recreational marijuana bill would allow for the sale of recreational marijuana to persons 21 and older. The bill states that “controlling and regulating the manufacture, distribution, and sale of marijuana will strengthen [the state’s] ability to keep marijuana away from minors” and “the tax revenue generated from a controlled marijuana manufacture, distribution, and retail sales system in New Jersey will generate hundreds of millions of dollars to bolster effective, evidence based drug treatment and education, and to reinvest in New Jersey communities.”

The bill would also allow up to 98 dispensaries to actively sell marijuana in New Jersey, up from the six that are currently open across the state. Councilman Brian McLaughlin asked if there was a way to limit the sale of marijuana in South Amboy, as a number of towns includ-

ing Point Pleasant Beach, Carlstadt, Garfield, and Hasbrouck Heights have already passed bills blocking marijuana establishments from their towns.

The city currently has an ordinance that restricts certain establishments from opening on Broadway, including tattoo parlors and laundromats. Councilman Tom Reilly asked City Law Director John Lanza if they could include the sale of marijuana to the list of restrictions, which he said they could.

Lanza suggested that the restriction of marijuana sales be addressed in the new zoning ordinance that is being put together by Heyer, Gruel, and Associates. South Amboy’s zoning ordinance is currently being updated for the first time since 1978, so the time to make additions or changes would be now.

This restriction, if passed, would only affect sales on Broadway to start. Council President Gross asked Lanza if he can make the restriction as broad as legally possible.

All council members were in attendance for the business meeting. The next city council meeting will be held on June 20 at 7:00 p.m.

Assembly Approves DeAngelo & Houghtaling Low-Income Home Energy Assistance Bill

TRENTON – Legislation sponsored by Assemblymen Wayne DeAngelo and Eric Houghtaling to require LIHEAP handbooks to be updated annually and provide quarterly trainings for employees on administering the program was approved, 73-0, Thursday by the full Assembly.

The Low-Income Home Energy Assistance Program is a federally funded program that allows the State to provide assistance to help low-income residents cover home energy costs.

On October 12, 2016, the Office of the State Comptroller released an investigative report on LIHEAP titled “Administration of New Jersey’s Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program.” According to the report, LIHEAP benefits were awarded to persons who did not meet the income requirements of the program due, in part, to insufficient checks by the agencies that administer LIHEAP.

“The President’s proposal to eliminate this program would impact nearly 300,000 New

Jersey households,” said DeAngelo (D-Mercer, Middlesex). “Thousands would lose their access to the basic services they depend on. With this bill, we can help remediate any concerns regarding employee training.”

“Seniors and disabled residents and tenants rely on the financial assistance to help with their heating and cooling costs,” said Houghtaling (D-Monmouth). “This was a good recommendation by the Comptroller that, with implementation, will help to improve services.”

The bill (A-2544) would require the department to prepare and annually update its low-income energy assistance program handbook containing the governing policies and eligibility requirements for the federal Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program, and to provide training sessions about the program on a quarterly basis. Under the bill, all employees of LIHEAP agencies who have LIHEAP responsibilities would be required to read and adhere to the updated handbooks, and the supervisors of these agen-

cies who oversee LIHEAP work would be required to attend the quarterly training sessions. In addition, the bill directs the Department of Community Affairs to establish a schedule of days and hours of operation, a toll free number, and downloadable application on its Internet website to facilitate the receipt of benefits under the federal Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program.

An agency that fails to substantially comply with these requirements may be disqualified by DCA from serving as a LIHEAP agency.

The bill was released by the Assembly Telecommunications and Utilities Committee on May 7. It will now go to the Senate for further consideration.

PERTH AMBOY - On June 15, 1921 Eagle Hose & Chemical Co. #4 (later rename Eagle Engine Co. #4) were responding to an alarm. As their truck approached the railroad crossing at Market & Elm the gate was up. The driver of Engine 4 had no idea a train was coming. The Engine began to cross the tracks when the train struck it eventually killing 9 fire fighters.
On Friday, June 15, 2018 the Perth Amboy Fire Department will hold its first memorial service at Market and Elm at 6:30 pm sponsored by the Perth Amboy Fire Fighter's Exempt Association and the Perth Amboy Uniformed Fire Fighter's Historical Association. The public is invited to attend.
This event will be the first of an annual memorial service with a plaque being placed at the train station in 2021, 100 years after the accident. The 1921 Memorial committee will be accepting donations, no matter how large or small, to help pay for the final plaque. This Week in World War II 75 Years Ago

As part of "Operation Point Blank," the U.S. Eighth Air Force on June 11, 1943, raids the German naval base at Wilhelmshaven with 200 B-17s during the day, while the RAF attacks the cities of Münster and Düsseldorf at night. In the Mediterranean, Axis forces on the Italian island of Pantelleria surrender after 11 days of round-the-clock air and naval bombardment. The garrison of 11,000 is taken prisoner. Because Italian propaganda had (falsely) hailed the island — 62 miles southwest of Sicily — as "an impregnable fortress," the Allies decided that it had had to be taken, considering it an obstacle blocking their planned invasion of Sicily and the Italian mainland. In the U.S., coalmine workers — heeding a call for a walkout by United Mine Workers union president John L. Lewis — walk off their jobs for the second time in two months. As the federal government has been overseeing the coal mines since the first walkout, President Roosevelt halts the work stoppage by threatening to draft the miners into federal service.

Reichsführer-SS Heinrich Himmler on June 12 orders the liquidation of all Jewish ghettos in Poland and the deportation of the residents to the various concentration camps. Great Britain's King George VI lands in Morocco on his second visit of the war to British overseas forces. Düsseldorf, Germany, undergoes its heaviest air raid thus far, as 693 Allied bombers drop 2,000 tons of bombs in 45 minutes. The Italian garrison on Lampedusa — Italy's southernmost island, 70 miles from Tunisia and 127 miles from Sicily — surrenders to a Royal Navy lieutenant from the British destroyer *HMS Lookout* accompanied by 95 men of the Coldstream Guards. The Italians had run out of water on the arid island that has no water source other than rainfall.

Wing Commander John "Cat's Eyes" Cunningham, Royal Air Force night-fighter ace, brings down his 16th *Luftwaffe* victim over southern England on June 13. U.S. Army Air Forces Brig. Gen. Nathan Bedford Forrest III is killed when the bomber in which he is riding as an observer is shot down during an air raid on Kiel, Germany. He is the great-grandson of the Confederate Army general of the U.S. Civil War. In Los Angeles, the Zoot Suit Riots finally come to an end. Although there are numerous personal injuries and considerable property damages, no deaths are reported.


In Washington, D.C., the U.S. Supreme Court on June 14 reverses an earlier decision in the case of *West Virginia State Board of Education v. Barnette*, and rules 6-3 that, under the Bill of Rights, schoolchildren cannot be compelled to salute the flag if the ceremony conflicts with their religious beliefs. Elsewhere in D.C., an American scientist — code-named "Quantum" by the KGB (the Soviet security agency) — at a secret meeting at the Soviet embassy, provides classified information about the separation of bomb-grade uranium-235 from uranium, part of the work being done by the Manhattan Project. (Although the FBI and the National Security Agency learn of the meeting — and what transpires at it — from cables sent by the embassy that are intercepted and decrypted, the agencies are unable to identify the scientist.)

The German raider *SS Michel* sinks two Allied ships off the west coast of Australia on June 15. The Nazis begin an attempt to cover up their atrocities: Jewish slave laborers are brought to mass-killing sites near Lviv, Ukraine (formerly Lwów, Poland), and ordered to dig up bodies buried in mass graves and burn them.

The Japanese launch a massive air attack against Allied shipping around Guadalcanal on June 16. However, 93 of the 94 Japanese aircraft involved are destroyed by the Allies. In Tokyo, Indian nationalist Subhas Chandra Bose meets with Japanese premier Hideki Tojo, who promises Japan's help in India's attempt to gain independence from the United Kingdom. In Beaumont, Texas, martial law is declared after race riots there kill two people and injure 11. By the time the violence ends the next day, three are dead, over 50 are injured and more than 200 are arrested.

The British battleships *HMS Valiant* and *HMS Warspite* are ordered to move on June 17 from their base at Scapa Flow, in Scotland, to Oran, Algeria, and Alexandria, Egypt, in preparation for "Operation Husky," the Allied invasion of Sicily. In the Mediterranean, the British troopship *SS Yoma* is torpedoed by German sub U-81 off Derna, Libya. Of the 1,961 aboard *Yoma*, 484 are killed.



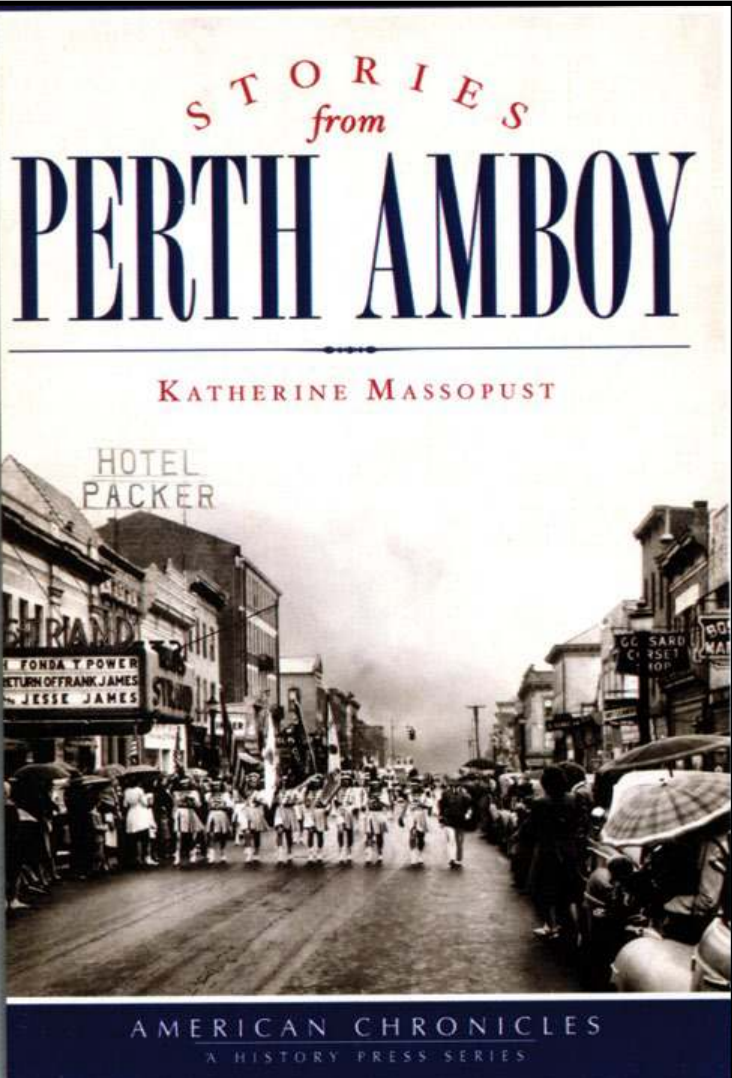

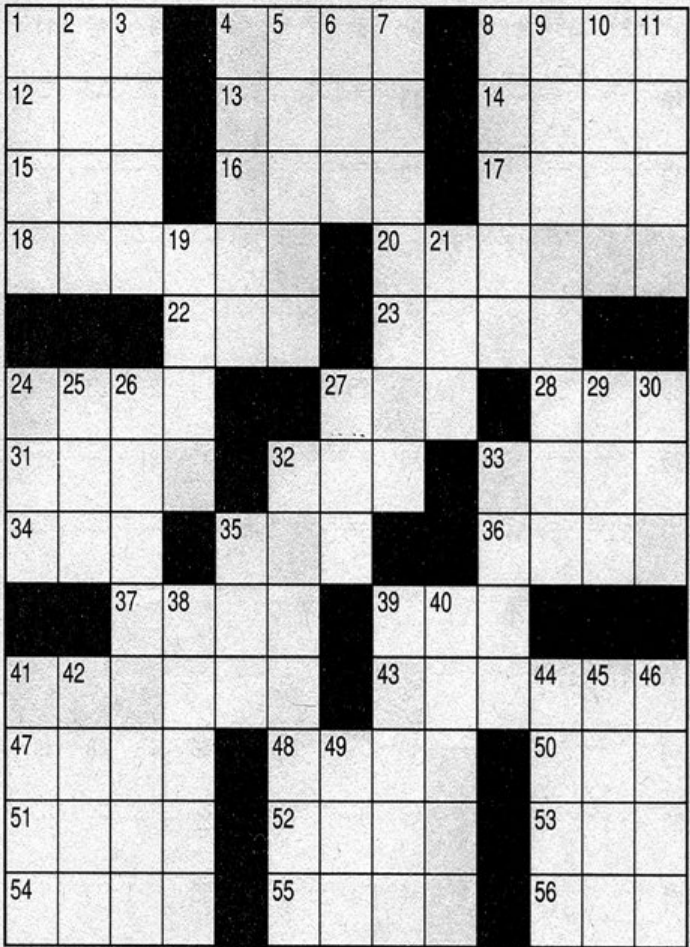
