Fight to Ban Marijuana Continues in South Amboy 6/20/18 Regular Meeting

By: Joseph L. Kuchie SOUTH AMBOY - Residents voiced their concerns about the potential legalization of marijuana during last Wednesday's South Amboy city council meeting.

Kim Seber, who has been one of the city's most vocal residents behind overdose and opioid awareness, presented her learnings from a recent summit she attended pertaining to the education of legalization of marijuana. Presenters at the summit included Middlesex County Prosecutor Andrew Carey, Dr. Kevin Sabet from New Jersey RAMP, Sayreville Chief of Police John Zebrowski, and a representative from the Rocky Mountain High Intensity Drug Trafficking Taskforce in Colo-

"I wanted to brief you guys on what I've learned and have been learning at these summits I've been attending because each one of them I go in with an open mind and then I come out even more concerned than when I walked in," Seber said.

Colorado Amendment 64 was passed in 2012 to address the personal use and regulation of marijuana for adults 21 and over within the state, and the commercial sale of marijuana to the general public began two years later in January 2014. The summit Seber has been attending highlighted the following statistics relating to the legalization of marijuana in Colorado and the effects it is having in the state:

- Opioid overdoses have increased in Colorado, not decreased
- Homelessness has skyrocketed Traffic deaths have increased
- Hospitalization related to marijuana poisoning have increased, with children between the ages of 0-5 showing a 185% increase.

She also mentioned that there are currently over 513 medical marijuana dispensaries and 491 storefronts in Colorado, which is more than the amount of Starbucks and McDonalds in the state combined.

According to Mayor Fred Henry, the city has already begun the process of developing an ordinance to limit the sale of marijuana in South Amboy following the city's business meeting on June 6. Councilman Brian McLaughlin made the recommendation to look into the matter after learning other towns have done the same, including Point Pleasant Beach, Carlstadt, Garfield, and Hasbrouck Heights.

"We've already spoken about this at a business meeting and I have directed our Law Director [John Lanza] to come up with an ordinance that will ban," Mayor Henry said. "We are pretty much all in agreement up here that this is not something we want in South Amboy, and John has already been looking into other ordinances to see how we can craft ours."

"I think we're all in agreement that something has to be done," Council President Mickey Gross said. "I can't speak for the other members of the council but I will tell you publicly right now I'm against it...I am definitely going to vote that we do not have a pot store here in the city of South Amboy. Period."

"Brian [McLaughlin] had actually brought it up, he said 'let's start now and we'll figure it out, if we're doing it wrong then let's figure out that we're wrong but at least get the wheels rolling'," Councilwoman Christine Noble said. "That has been talked about, more than talked about it's going to happen."

Council President Gross asked Law Director Lanza and Acting Municipal Clerk Laura Kemble to have the ordinance placed on the agenda for the city's next business meeting, which will be held at city hall on July 11 at 6:00 p.m. The next city council meeting will be on July 25 at 7:00 p.m.

All council members were in attendance for Wednesday's council meeting.







We remember with great anticipation the return of Fireworks to Perth Amboy and South Amboy in 2012. We were over the moon when we were invited to go to WCTC in Somerset, NJ to see a live broadcast that was hosted by Radio Personality Bert Baron. Perth Amboy's Public Relations Spokeswoman Noelia Colon contacted us because Perth Amboy Mayor Wilda Diaz and South Amboy Mayor Fred Henry would be speaking. They would also be joined by Co-Chairs Perth Amboy Councilman William Petrick and South Amboy Councilman Mickey Gross and Real Estate Developer and Chair of Celebrate the Amboy's Barry Rosengarten. Barry was and still is to the day, the main catalyst of the fireworks.

Garden State Fireworks has put on the show since the annual event was revived.

Upon arriving at WCTC, we were warmly greeted by the staff, and they also provided refreshments for us to enjoy prior to the broadcast. We remember how Bert Baron made everyone feel very comfortable when he was interviewing them, asking questions that they answered as if they were pros. After the broadcast, a group photo was taken that included Katherine and myself.

On the day of the fireworks, Bert Baron and his crew did a live broadcast in the afternoon from the Raritan Yacht Club in Perth Amboy. Again, it featured Mayors Wilda Diaz and Fred Henry, Councilmen Bill Petrick and Mickey Gross and Barry Rosengarten along with some of the sponsors of the fireworks. That afternoon, I was able to shoot two short videos when Mayor Diaz

and Rosengarten were being interviewed at the Yacht Club, and then Katherine Massopust was on the air with Bert Baron and his crew and talked about Perth Amboy's history and the fireworks in general.

The fireworks exceeded our expectations. There was excitement before, during and after the fireworks. It was an experience we'll never forget.

So, we thank the Cities of Perth Amboy (especially the BID) and South Amboy (especially Mickey Gross) for giving us the opportunity to be a part of this celebration of this revived annual tradition. Special thanks to Chair Barry Rosengarten for his resolve and vision and WCTC's Bert Baron for promoting the event and giving a shout out for the first time in 2012 to the Amboy Guardian during both broadcasts (in the studio and at the Yacht Club).

Unfortunately, later that year in October, Superstorm Sandy hit, and both Perth Amboy and South Amboy's Waterfront sustained considerable damage and the fireworks could not take place in 2013. However, the fireworks came back strong in 2014, then again in 2015 (where we were joined by Staten Island for one year) and 2016 and 2017.

This year, there will be a Patriotic Boat Parade to kick-off the celebration. Fireworks are Tuesday, July 3, 2018 (rain date July 5, 2018) Have a happy Fourth of July! See you July 11, 2018. Check our website for any breaking stories during our off week.

Speaker Coughlin Statement on \$36.5 Million Budget Sent to Governor

Democratic Legislative Spending Plan Approved by Both Houses

TRENTON – Assembly Speaker Craig Coughlin (D-Middlesex) released the following statement on the \$36.5 million budget sent by the Legislature to Gov. Murphy on Thursday:

"This budget represents months of hard work, dedication and a commitment to mitigating the financial burden that weighs heavy on the shoulders of New Jersey taxpayers. It represents our values and priorities as Democrats, and our responsibility to provide valuable

services to our working families while reducing the cost of government.

"I commend Assembly Budget Chair Eliana Pintor-Marin and the rest of the budget committee for their tireless work and commitment to this process to ensure the budget we moved today meets the needs of our residents.

"This is a responsible budget based on sustainable revenues. It makes a considerable investment in education, restores the homestead rebate, expands the earned income tax credit, creates a Child and Dependent Tax Credit to help families with the rising cost of child care, and restores valuable social programs while minimizing the financial impact on our working families. This budget operates with the best interest of residents in mind.

"We have done our due diligence and put forth a budget we believe in and one that puts New Jersey on a path towards a revitalized economy."

Assembly Passes Bill to Crack Down on Powerful New Synthetic Opioid Far Stronger Than Heroin

Mazzeo, Armato, & Kennedy Bill Would Criminalize U-4 or "Pink" Which Has Been Responsible for Nearly 50 Deaths Nationwide

TRENTON – Legislation sponsored by Assembly Democrats Vince Mazzeo, John Armato, and James Kennedy to crack down on a powerful, new synthetic opioid flooding the market that has proven far stronger than heroin was cleared to advance by the full Assembly, 76-1, on Thursday. The bill will now go to the Senate for further consideration.

The bill (A-2169) would criminalize the manufacture, sale, and possession of the powerful opioid commonly known as U-47700, U-4, or the street name "Pink," by adding it to this state's list of controlled dangerous substances. U-4 is a synthetic opioid analgesic drug described as eight times stronger than heroin.

"The proliferation of synthetic and highly potent narcotics is a dangerous and scary phenomenon," said Mazzeo (D-Atlantic). "It's important that we send a strong message before this drug becomes even more widespread. We will not tolerate the distribution of yet another opioid that threatens the lives of our residents."

"This drug warrants swift action because law enforcement believes it poses the highest risk to high school and college age students," said Armato (D-Atlantic). "In addition to the penalties this bill will levy, parents should also keep a close eye on their children's online activity because that is one way the drug can be purchased."

According to the Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA), U-47700 acts similarly to morphine in animals, and has not been approved by the Food and Drug Administration (FDA) for human consumption. There are currently no known accept-

ed medical treatment uses for the drug in the United States. Moreover, since 2015, there have been at least 46 confirmed fatalities associated with the abuse of this drug according to the DEA, including 31 in New York and 10 in North Carolina.

"There have been a number of reports of heroin being mixed with U-4 or replaced entirely by it, which makes it all the more dangerous given that this drug is much more potent than heroin, making users far more susceptible to overdoses," said Kennedy (D-Middlesex/Somerset/Union). "We need to send a swift, strong message that this will not be tolerated."

The bill would make it a crime of the second degree to manufacture, distribute or dispense U-47700, in a quantity of one ounce or more, which would carry a potential penalty of 5-10 years in prison. It would be a crime of the third degree when the quantity is one ounce or less, which would carry a penal-

ty of three-five years in prison.

Additionally, the bill makes it a crime of the third degree to obtain or possess U-47700, in a quantity of one ounce or more and a crime of the fourth degree when the quantity obtained or possessed is one ounce or less, which would carry a potential penalty of up to 18 months in iail.

The bill also criminalizes the manufacture, sale, and possession of isomers, esters, ethers, salts and salts of isomers, esters, or ethers of U-44770.

The sponsors noted that "Pink" is currently illegal in four states: Georgia, Ohio, South Carolina and Wyoming.

The bill was advanced by the Assembly Appropriations Committee on June 4. It will now go to the Assembly Speaker for further consideration. It was approved by the Assembly Law and Public Safety Committee March 5.

Andrew & Leslee Fiveland: Fulfilling One's Dreams

PERTH AMBOY – Recently the Amboy Guardian met Andrew and Leslee Fiveland at the Raritan Yacht Club in Perth Amboy. They sat down with the Amboy Guardian for an interview.

Andrew has the distinction of being someone who built his own boat from scratch. The boat, which he named after his Grandfather, The Samuel Fiveland was moored in Raritan Bay at the Yacht Club.

Andrew and Leslee told us their story:

Andrew Fiveland was born in Orange, New Jersey to Arthur and Gladys Fiveland. Andrew grew up in Manasquan, New Jersey. "I taught myself to sail. I love Clipper Ships and always was fixing up boats since age 12. In my mid-20's to late 20's I was looking toward a goal. I wanted to build my own boat and get girls and sail around the world. I didn't want to do what anyone else was doing. I wanted to see the world. I had no idea what I was getting into. To achieve a goal, one must invest time, money, or both. Life got in the middle of the project, we got married, and we adopted a son, Daniel."

Their son, Daniel is now 28 years old and serves in the Marine Air National Guard. "He's a focused, mature person. He loves motorboats and knows how to sail."

Leslee was born in Manhattan but grew up in Pittsburgh. She graduated from Randolph-Macon Woman's College in Lynchburg, Virginia and was a librarian in Princeton Theological Seminary Library, a Ministry for the Presbyterian Church

in Princeton. "I was a Spanish major in college," Leslee states. She worked for two South American Companies in the 1970's for Chile in the World Trade Center." She became a Spanish Teacher when she moved to Maine.

Leslee is a real good sailor, learning to sail from her first husband's father who was a member of the Yacht Club in the 1960's. In 1981, Leslee's first husband, David Heal died. "There's a trophy downstairs with his name on it." Leslee continued, "The Yacht Club Members have always been a friendly group. The people here were a huge support for me. I was crewing on other people's boats. In 1983, there was a Boat Race with a friend, Nelson Macan and early residents of Bayside Villa. I was working in the area. Nelson said that he wanted me to meet someone. He introduced me to Andrew here (at the Yacht Club) and we proceeded to talk. Our first date was at the Harbor Lights Restaurant (in Perth Amboy). Things are a lot different here than 30 years ago. Perth Amboy has come a long

Andrew has a twin brother that lives in Perth Amboy and a younger sister.

Andrew spoke about the first boat he ever built. "The first boat I built was a plywood kayak. I didn't finish it." Andrew's Father, Arthur served in the Army Air Corps. He firmly believed a person should finish what they start. "My father said if you're not going to finish it, you have to get rid of it. I cut it up, because I didn't finish it. I was 13 years old. I made a promise to finish anything else I

started."

When Andrew began building his boat, he got the accessories first. He is a great fan of Popular Science and Popular Mechanics Magazines. He learned a lot from those magazines.

The laying of a keel is often the first step in building a boat. In 1979, Andrew laid the keel of his boat. "When building a boat, you have to figure out how to do things. It took a lot of years. There were a lot of years I did nothing on it. We built a house in Maine and built the boat in a Pole Barn (a giant garage that is really tall with a roof, but no sides (similar to a car port)). I started working as a pipefitter in Jersey, then went to Maine. The Boat took 38 years to build, but it was built from scratch."

The boat includes a main cabin, galley, head, aft cabin, and an engine room. It fits 6 comfortably. It's a big boat: 53' long and 16' wide. The draft is 7'. "It's a very seaworthy, heavy boat. It's made of steel. There are 18,000 lbs. of lead in the keel. The motor has a diesel engine. The sails are 1250 sqft. made out of Dacron (a type of synthetic cloth used for ship sails and ropes). It sails comfortably from 15 to 20 knots of wind."

When asked how the boat handles storms, both Andrew and Leslee smiled, "We get our gear on when we know it's going to rain. We have harnesses with a hook to a red jack line," Leslee explained.

The boat has a one-person navigation system, and you need a helmsman to steer the boat. "Mike Magee was the ship's carpenter. We go way back. He helped with the woodwork and Andrew did the metalwork.

Mike is a very experienced carpenter," said Leslee.

When the boat was nearing completion, Andrew said to himself, "This is a serious project. I spent more than half my life building this boat. My father built a sailboat out of wood and named it a real name. I asked myself: "What should I name this boat?" I decided I should name it after my grandfather. It felt right to name it after him."

Andrew's Grandfather, Samuel Fiveland was a Norwegian Sailor who served in the Norwegian Navy during WWI. Samuel was in a boat when it was torpedoed by the Germans. The crew were put on lifeboats going to Italy. The Italians rescued them, and he managed to make it back to Norway. In 1922, Samuel came to Ellis Island with his wife, Tobine.

The Samuel Fiveland was launched on August 11, 2017. Andrew and Leslee both enjoy living on the boat. The couple have plans to go back to Maine with intentions of making four different improvements that

need to be made on the boat. The couple always wanted to sail in New York Harbor, and recently did so. Andrew plans to visit the Caribbean but is waiting for winter to come to make the trip. He also wishes to see the Panama Canal and Ireland.

Andrew stated that on his travels he has seen marine life such as dolphins who swim around in circles. "They're a lot larger than you think they are. I saw an osprey in Chesapeake Bay."

Leslee stated that one of the things she really enjoys about traveling is meeting interesting people all over the world. "I enjoy hearing all the different stories of how they got into boating," Leslee states.

"It's always an adventure, just a little different than I expected," states Andrew.



This Week in World War II 75 Years Ago

The RAF conducts a heavy raid on Elberfeld, in Germany's Ruhr, on June 25, 1943. In Washington, Congress passes the Smith-Connally Act over President Roosevelt's veto. The legislation permits the federal government to seize and operate industries that are threatened by or under strikes that would interfere with war production. The French Resistance blows up a locomotive works near Lille.

More than 200 crewmen from six different German U-boats based in Norway mutiny on June 26. The men refuse orders to put to sea because Allied forces have been damaging and destroying German submarines at a great rate since May. The mutineers are arrested and incarcerated in a prison in Oslo. Fritz Schmidt, German Commissioner-General for Political Affairs and Propaganda in the Occupied Netherlands dies when he "falls, jumps or gets pushed from" a moving train. In Poland, a unit of the Jewish Fighting Organization launches an uprising in the Jewish ghetto of Częstochowa. The next day, the Nazis shoot 250 children and old people in reprisal. The uprising ends on June 30 with 1,500 Jews killed in the fighting. The Germans ship the 3,900 Jews who remain to various concentration camps.

On June 27, a U.S. Army Air Forces Lockheed P-38 Lightning fighter on a training flight — whose pilot had bailed out when the plane caught fire — crashes onto a crowd of beachgoers at Huntington Beach, California. The plane explodes on impact, injuring 49 people, three fatally, including two children.

The cathedral in Köln (Cologne), Germany, is badly damaged in an air raid on June 28. The edifice is the largest Gothic-style church in northern Europe. Construction was begun in 1248 and completed in 1880. (Work had been halted between 1473 and 1842.) On the coast of France, along the English Channel, the Germans begin building four reinforced-concrete rocket-launching complexes for firing missiles at the United Kingdom. Adolf Hitler visits the Peenemünde Army Research Center, on Usedom Island in the Baltic Sea, where he observes a successful test of the A4 rocket, later widely known as the V-2.

Germany begins withdrawing U-boats from the Atlantic on June 29 in anticipation of an Allied invasion of Europe. In the U.S., the Senate votes to establish a \$20-million fund for providing federal child care for mothers who are engaged in warproduction work.

In a continuation of "Operation Cartwheel," Allied forces on June 30 invade Rendova Island, New Georgia, in the Solomon Islands. They run into heavy Japanese resistance at Vangunu, an island south of New Georgia.

In Germany on July 1, Martin Bormann — Nazi Party Minister and Hitler's private secretary — gives SS Lt. Col. Adolf Eichmann full authority to use the Gestapo (Secret State Police) to enforce "the permanent elimination of Jews from the territories of Greater Germany." Within hours an order goes out: All Jews are to report to the Gestapo. In the U.S., the Women's Auxiliary Army Corps changes its name and status to the Women's Army Corps, with U.S. Army Maj. Oveta Culp Hobby as Director.




