Mayor Diaz Holds Press Conference Condemning Petrick's Facebook Posts; Calls for Petrick's Resignation

10/3/18 Press Conference

PERTH AMBOY - Mayor Wilda Diaz called for a press conference on 10/3/18 at City Hall Circle to condemn Council President William Petrick for Facebook posts that she found offensive. She called for Petrick's resignation as a Councilman.

Diaz began speaking, "As the City of Perth Amboy, we are addressing negative comments against the City of Perth Amboy. It's t social media in the most negative way. Many Latinos have made a home in New Jersey. It's why we are so outraged. We as a community cannot be portrayed in such a negative way.

Patricia Campos Medina, President of Latinas United for Political Empowerment (LUPE) PAC of NJ came up to speak at the podium, "Thank you, Wilda Diaz for having the courage to come out. When women run for office, it's to make for the common good, for children, for the community. We have actively opposed Donald Trump. We have been constant that kind of language does not belong in Perth Amboy. It's bad enough Donald Trump does not behave appropriately. It's important for women not to be devalued. We at this moment are proud to be Democrats. Although my organization is bipartisan, I'm a Democrat. As a progressive Democrat, I'm appalled to see this language. If you sit at he computer, you have to at some moment believe what you are displaying on the computer. Trump and Right-Wing Republican blame women and immigrants for the problems in our country. Bill Petrick has to be held responsible and he should resign immediately. He objectively has disparaged women and it's disgraceful. A misogynist and a racist can be nice to you, but hide their true beliefs. What Petrick did hurt the community and children. William Petrick needs to know we will not stand quiet until he resigns!"

There were riots (in Perth Amboy) in 1988 when comments were made about Mexicans that were obscene. We have to say something. We cannot tolerate that kind of rhetoric in Perth Amboy. Comments made by the White House against Mexicans were terrible. In Chicago, there were some people attacked or raising the American Flag. This opens up floodgates for you to

be attacked. Comments were shameful and hurtful. This is not new – it's continuous. The picture shown was of the Dominican Republic. South Amboy Meeting Focuses on City Improvements & Master Plan

10/3/18 Business Meeting

By: Carolyn Maxwell SOUTH AMBOY – During the Council Comments, Councilman Tom Reilly spoke and was concerned about the results of a survey (by Beacon Planning) that was given to the Fire, First Aid, Police Department and the School Superintendent regarding their concerns for the City.

Reilly asked if this report is for public knowledge. "I would like to get full feedback from the Departments (above). I didn't get any reports back from the OEM (Office of Emergency Management)."

B.A. Glenn Skarzynski spoke up and said, "I was at these meetings, but there was no records or recordings of the interviews."

City Attorney John Lanza was asked to give his thoughts about the survey. He responded that he wasn't familiar with this survey at all and it was the first time he even saw it.

Mayor Fred Henry spoke up, "This survey was conducted by an outside group."

Lanza then stated, "If this report is not confidential, it could be made public, but it's the first time I'm seeing it. I need to know who sponsored it."

Reilly spoke up again and stated, "I'm hearing from people who were interviewed in different departments that the report was not wholly inclusive. School Superintendent Diaz said what was in the report was not exactly what he said."

B.A. Skarzynski explained, "Everything was not verbatim that was in the report."

Reilly continued, "I'm not getting accurate information."

Councilwoman Zusette Dato suggested that the report be given back to those departments who participated so they could clarify the statements that they made

Reilly continued, "This report will have a huge impact on the town. I talked to the Fire Chiefs and they said the statements in this report are not reflective of what they said."

B.A. Skarzynski made addi-

tional comments, "Additional (residential) units will have an impact on the town, but they have built in sprinkler systems."

Reilly's also mentioned that the Woodmont Properties are adding 13 students to the school system.

Mayor Henry added, "Just have all the people who were involved in the study get the report and make any changes necessary."

Law Director Lanza said, "The report was requested by McManimon, Scotland & Baumann and I will call them."

Reilly ended the discussion by stating, "I have a lot of questions and concerns and would like to have McManimon & Scotland go over this report. Maybe we can them come to a special meeting."

Towards the end of the Meeting, McKinley Mertz from the Heyer Gruel & Associates came in to talk about the Master Plan and the new zoning ordinance. She stated, "The City's Master Plan is prepared by your Planning Board. Many of your City Departments plus the public had input. Several Zones no longer exist. You'll be bringing in more residential units in Zone #1 which will include single family detached units and open spaces for parks. In your R2 Zones will include single and two-family (which could be stacked) homes and private schools. This is the Roswell Street Area. Some homes in both zones may be nonconforming. The R3 Zone which includes Gordon Street will have medium density for example such as Woodmont and Ryan Homes. We're looking at medium density for the Waterfront. The R3 Zone will be very discreet. Multifamily (16 units per acre) and Townhouses will be 12 units per acre. The M1 Zone (Light Industrial) will not change. The B1 Business Zone is very small (Broadway). It will have to be reevaluated for permitted uses.



"Perth Amboy First" Candidates Challenge Their Opponents: Stop Fighting & Let's Talk About Real Issues

Amboy First' candidates today challenged their City Council opponents to stop hiding behind Mayor Wilda Diaz and finally focus on relevant city issues of greater concern to people and families.

"Personal attacks must end. They do not benefit city residents who, I am sure, would rather hear about our records of service and our visions for Perth Amboy's future," said Councilman Joel Pabon, a 'Perth Amboy First' candidate.

"Today, we are challenging our three opponents – actually on the Nov. 6th ballot – to raise the level of campaign discussion. Let's focus on important city issues that people truly care about," said Pabon, a two-term

incumbent seeking re-election on Nov. 6th with Council President Bill Petrick and school board member Milady Tejeda.

Petrick agreed. "Our opponents have, so far, hidden behind Mayor (Wilda) Diaz. They let her speak for them and make unjustified attacks. This is a disservice to both campaigns and, worse, to voters," Petrick said. "Let's stop distracting people from what's really important in their lives."

"Residents and potential voters would rather hear how the Mayor's slate has worked for them over the past few years," Petrick said. "I urge them – as my running mates are doing – to campaign on their individual merits and achievements. Then, allow voters decide. That is a fair request."

Tejeda, a three-term school board member, added that she is running for Council to end City Hall's hostility toward the Board of Education. "Ongoing antagonism does not benefit our families and certainly not our children," Tejada said.

"People would be better served by a cooperative, respectful partnership between City Hall and our school district," said Tejada. "Once elected, that's what I hope to achieve."

Mayor Janice Kovach of Clinton, NJ spoke next, "Here we are in 2018 and still dealing with sexist remarks. This concerns me. I'm a survivor of Domestic Violence. You must talk to your family about racist remarks. You must call them out because if happened to you, you would want the support from your family and community. I've been friends with Wilda for years and she's never been part of the "Good Old Boys"club. There has been an opposition to hold everyone accountable. We may not be able to fix Washington's sexist, racist behavior – we have no room for that. The only way change will happen is up to all of you!"

Mayor Diaz came back up to speak, "I'm glad to work with these statewide leaders. I was chastised for being the one bringing forth these comments that were made from 2016-2018 which degraded Haiti and the Dominican Republic. There's lots of families here in Perth Amboy from the Dominican Republic. They come here to work and are part of the community. One post was from 1/14/18 and is a new post. Petrick completely abused his position! I'm a woman and a mother and a now a grandmother. I'm going to fight for the women now and of the future. We have a lot of women who built this country. I will not tolerate this. It disconnects the community. I

gave Petrick time to think about this and I'm asking for Petrick to resign. They're not going to use us, discard us and disrespect our community. It will spread to other communities. The is President is spreading this and it's not okay. We work hard and contribute tho this country. If we allow them to get away with this iust because the President says this, doesn't mean it's right. Our families work hard and that's the American Dream. As Americans, everyone should be treated equally! We cannot stay silent! Had it been a Republican, you'd see a crowd from all over New Jersey here in City Hall Circle. Thank you for coming out."

One woman at the press conference came up to speak, "I've had a business here for 23 years. Many people have come here (Perth Amboy) to do business here. What is their (the Council's) duty? They're only looking for problems by not doing anything in this town. I want to tell you about this. They earn a salary in that role. I ask them to fix problems - not create problems. We can take care of that in November! They like to take credit for what Wilda Diaz does. We need to be open and everyone to know we are equal."

One question was asked of Mayor Diaz during the Q&A period by a reporter, "Do you feel that all Republicans are racists?"

Diaz answered, "Not all Republicans are misogynists and racists, but the far right are."

No residential units will be permitted on the ground floor. You want to embed in an ordinance that the style of storefronts be kept. You can increase the maximum height of the structures (to 3 stories). The B2 (Route 35 Corridor) is an impervious lot coverage and you'll have to develop parking standards. Broadway/Main Street should be broken into certain districts. The M2 Zones will be eliminated. A solar ordinance can be put in place for appropriate locations. You can use provisions for a farmer's market. Parking spaces for bicycle infrastructures can be placed in the redevelopment areas, but not bike lanes. Our contract with the City expires June 2019."

At the end of the Meeting, it was explained that Beacon Planning was asked by the Redevelopment Agency to do the survey mentioned at the beginning of the Meeting.

A MESSAGE FROM WILDA DIAZ

Two weeks ago, as Mayor, I released a letter to the residents of Perth Amboy with regards to the improper conduct of Council President William Petrick, notifying the community of his non-democratic views and actions as a member of the governing body.

I want to be clear, I have supported all of the sitting councilman at one time or another. They ran for election and reelection touting my Administration's accomplishments, while committing to continue pursuing a vision of growth and development for the City. I have always been a team player and by supporting them, I sought to build a team that believed in a common vision and inclusion of all our residents' diversity.

However, in addition to expressing his non-democratic views on Facebook in **2016**, **2017** and in **2018**, Council President Petrick has a record of obstruction and of official abuse of power that I feel is important to bring to light given his current attacks against my administration and our employees:

Abuse of Power, Council President Petrick has:

- Most recently, inquired about a medical procedure of a female employee of the City.
- Improperly questioned employees of city business by directly messaging and contacting employees via Facebook and other means.
- Knowingly appointing a man to a public board with a questionable background involving moral turpitude, after I suspended him from one of the boards, based on qualifications.
- Attempting to run a shadow government, violating State Statue and the City's form of government under the Faulkner Act.
 - o Usurping my (Mayoral) appointment rights
 - o Hiring their own attorney, while the law allows for the retention of a city attorney who is responsible for advising both mayor and council.
 - o Requesting to have their own dedicated server and a private IT employee, in order to prohibit access to their emails.
- Circumventing OPRA and sharing government documents with selected political allies.
 - o Sharing a draft city budget prior to its formal and proper introduction to the general public.
- Undermining the administration:
 - o Council President had privately met with a developer (Kushner Companies) and could have potentially compromised contract negotiations, as he still has not disclosed what was discussed.

Last year, a Superior Court Judge stated on two separate occasions that the council had completely violated our form of government, costing the residents thousands of tax dollars.

Disagreements between the Legislative body and the Executive body of any city are part of governing in a Democratic process, and I welcome that. However, his record of obstruction and abuse of power outlined above are targeted at City Employees and residents and cannot be ignored. I will speak out against it.

This is about an elected official and his inability to serve our community because of his non-democratic views and constant violation of state statues, as a member of the governing body. As elected officials, our duty is to serve the people.

For 10 years now, as Mayor, as a mother and as a woman of color, I am committed to fostering an environment that is safe and secure and free from ethnic, sexual and gender-based discrimination and harassment, sexual violence, and other related misconduct.

History has shown that Perth Amboy has always been resilient, we have overcome much together. I want to remind the council that my years as Mayor have been transformative.

My administration has kept its promise to be fiscally responsible, grow our economy, create future jobs, enhance our quality of life and expand services for our residents.

Friends, I am proud of what we have achieved together. We have put our hands to the plow. As residents, you can trust that my administration and our employees will make every effort to serve you.

I call on all the members of the Council to do the same.





Tom's Tax Tips

Education: Tax Changes You Need to Know

WHAT IS GONE

Continuing Education as an itemized deduction: In previous years, you could deduct expenses paid for job-related continuing education as a miscellaneous itemized deduction. This deduction has been eliminated. However, if your employer will pay for the education, they can cover up to \$5,250 tax-free.

Home equity line of credit (HELOC) interest for education expenses: A popular method of generating cash to pay for school expenses is taking out a HELOC. Beginning in 2018, you can only deduct HELOC interest if you use the loan proceeds to buy, build or substantially improve your home. This means that if you plan to obtain HELOC for purposes of paying for education expenses, the interest will not be deductible.

WHAT'S NEW

529 plans cover K-12 tuition: Funds from Section 529 savings plans can now be used tax-free to pay for up to \$10,000 in K-12 private school tuition per year. Books, supplies or other K-12 expenses are not included in this change, but they are still eligible as legitimate college expenses. Be careful - not all states have adopted the K-12 inclusion, so they might still be taxable at the state level.

Endowment tax of 1.4 percent on certain private colleges: Congress added an investment income tax on private colleges that have large endowments. The tax is expected to impact roughly 30 schools, including Stanford, Harvard and Notre Dame. The effects of the new tax are yet to be determined. However, tuition may increase or reduced financial aid award amounts may be implemented to offset the cost.

WHAT STAYS THE SAME

Student loan interest deduction: You may deduct up to \$2,500 in student loan interest in 2018 as an adjustment to income. To qualify, your adjusted gross income must be below \$80,000 (\$165,000 for married couples). Phaseouts start to apply at \$65,000 (\$135,000 for married couples).

American Opportunity Credit, Lifetime Learning Credit and tuition and fees deduction: All three of these educational tax benefits are available once again. A chart with basic information on these three options is below:

This Week in World War II 75 Years Ago

Great Britain on October 8, 1943 — under terms of a treaty signed 570 years earlier, in 1373 — establishes military bases on the Azores, neutral Portugal's islands about 850 miles west of the Iberian Peninsula. In Greece, the first vestiges of guerrilla warfare give indications of the possibility of a civil war there. In the Atlantic, Polish destroyer *ORP Orkan*, escorting a convoy between Halifax, Nova Scotia, and Liverpool, England, is torpedoed and sunk by German sub U-378. Only one officer and 43 sailors of its crew of 190 survive.

In Italy, the U.S. Fifth Army's move northward is stopped at the Volturno River on October 9; all the bridges have been destroyed by the retreating Germans. In the Solomon Islands, the seven-week-long Land Battle of Vella Lavella ends in an Allied victory. Following the island's capture, the Allies build an airbase there that is used against the major Japanese base at Rabaul, on New Britain Island.

Sensing that the war's tide is beginning to turn, Spain's government on October 10 orders its 250th "Blue" Division (of volunteers) home from the Eastern Front, where it had been fighting alongside the *Wehrmacht*. A few thousand Spaniards, however, refuse to abandon their "struggle against communism" and enlist in a so-called "Blue Legion" that is attached to the German 121st Infantry Division in northern Europe. The German city of Münster is heavily bombed in the first daytime raid by bombers of the U.S. Eighth Air Force. The raid comes at a cost: of the 236 planes sent out, 30 are shot down and 105 are badly damaged, with the loss of 308 aircrewmen.

The Red Army reaches the Kerch Strait on October 11, completing the liberation of the northern Caucasus. In the Soya Strait, near the Sea of Japan, the American submarine USS Wahoo is attacked by Japanese air and sea forces. Depth charges sink the sub with the loss of its entire 60-man crew.

The Allies, as part of "Operation Cartwheel," begin a bombing campaign on October 12 against the Japanese Pacific Headquarters at Rabaul. 87 B-24 bombers hit the base, sinking a transport ship, damaging two destroyers, destroying or heavily damaging nine planes, and leaving the base's fuel-storage area in flames. In New York City, the National Broadcasting Company sells its Blue Radio Network for \$8 million to the newly organized American Broadcasting Company. NBC continues to operate its Red Radio Network.

Italy declares war against Germany on October 13. In the Pacific, the whole of the New Georgia group of islands in the Solomons is now held by the Allies.

The U.S. Eighth Air Force delivers a heavy attack against German ball-bearing plants at Schweinfurt on October 14, but damage is limited. However, of the original force of 291 B-17s, 198 are either shot down or damaged beyond repair, while the *Luftwaffe* loses only about 40 fighter planes. In Poland, Jewish prisoners at the *Sobibór* extermination camp launch an uprising. Several Ukrainian guards are killed, as are 11 SS officers, and 300 of the 700 camp inmates escape (all but 50 or so are killed or recaptured outside the camp). Afterward, inmates who did not escape are ordered to raze the camp and obliterate all traces of it. When finished, they are executed.






