



#### Is it Really 2018?

How is it that the people who have the most technology are the ones that are falling behind? You have students in the lowest income countries that are doing better than the students in America. Maybe it's because they appreciate what others take for granted.

Oprah Winfrey opened up a school in an impoverished part of Africa. The students were so excited because they were able to learn and have uniforms. Founded in 2007 by Winfrey to serve the needs of underprivileged girls (from any ethnic group) living in nine provinces across South Africa, the boarding school has transformed the lives of hundreds of students in grades 8-12, providing them with the educational and emotional tools to realize their dreams of pursuing careers in such illustrious fields as medicine, public service and architecture. It would be interesting to have those students from Africa tested in some of the same subjects as our students in America to see the outcome of the results. Pick any of the subjects from the STEM (Science Technology Engineering Math) Program.

Some of those parents who are trying to get their children into those classes are concerned because they may be overlooked, even though their children's test scores were ex-

More studies should be conducted as to why some students in lower income states have high test results. We need to find out what the missing link is. Free tutoring has been available for those who need it.

Another factor attributed to children failing in school is because both parents have to work, or because of single parent households. This isn't new. During WWII, women had to work in factories while their husbands were off to war. Both parents have worked in the past. Also, in the past, there were work-study programs where work was part of the curriculum. I remember not that long ago when some of the members of the Board of Education would have community meetings to allow parents who could not attend Board of Education Meetings to voice their opinions. Maybe Board Members should think about that.

There is a book called: "The Pact: Three Young Black Men Make a Promise and Fulfill a Dream," written by Sampson Davis, George Jenkins, Rameck Hunt, and Lisa Frazier. The book shows three young black men who made a pact to graduate from college and become doctors rather than to succumb to the violence in their community (from Wikipedia). ### Mayor Diaz Must Resign *Immediately*

I am calling on Mayor Wilda Diaz to resign immediately because her deceitful and scandalous public attacks on Councilman William Petrick were beneath the dignity of the office of Mayor of Perth Amboy.

Councilman Caba, who ran on the Mayor's ticket just two years ago and is the Chair of Perth Amboy Democratic Committee, called the Mayor out on the outrageous and untrue political attacks and of course the Mayor failed to re-spond.

I am calling on Mayor Wilda Diaz to resign immediately because her Strategic Planning Task Force members include the President of LUPE PAC Patricia Campos and her husband as well as another member who is a past President of the Latino Action Network. Both of these organizations diminished themselves by following the mayor's lead with untrue press releases condemning Petrick. Other Task Force members from the LUPE PAC executive committee include a failed Perth Ambov Municipal Attorney and two other members, one of which, Naomi Velasquez, is one of the founders of the organization.

Velasquez stated recently that Trump administration leaders "are all evangelical assholes" [her words not mine]. "They are molesters, liars, drunks, racists, bigots". This was at the

same time that Mayor Diaz, LUPE PAC, Latino Action Network and the mycentraljersey editorial board were unfairly attacking Councilman Petrick. Velasquez, who is an aide to Governor Murphy and paid by NJ taxes, received a two-week suspension. The Mayor and the other organizations have issued no statements regarding Velasquez' conduct. The Mayor has not called for her resignation from the task force and LUPE PAC has not called for her resignation or even publicly condemned her statements. The Editorial Board was so eager to give a helping hand to Mayor Diaz' political ambitions that the irony of the Velasquez story conveniently just slipped away. Maybe they should also resign.

She has appointed to the task force a convicted felon.

The Mayor has appointed to the task force an opponent in the 2012 election who she accused of being a MISOGY-NIST. Was she just making that up in 2012? It appears so since the Mayor went on to later appoint the opponent and accused Misogynist to the position of City Prosecutor.

## **Perth Amboy BOE Candidates Education First: Ken Puccio 1L**

PERTH AMBOY - Ken Puccio is a Perth Amboy example of the American spirit of courage and dedication to duty. While serving as a police officer, he put his life at risk, and as a teacher, he helped nurture success in our community's children because he attributes his own success in life to educators that guided him.

Born in Perth Amboy and raised by his mother, a single parent, Ken Puccio attended our city's public-school system. After graduating from Perth Amboy High School in 1974, Ken Puccio enlisted in the U.S. Army, where he served four years in active duty and spent another eight years in the Army Reserves.

While stationed with his army unit in Texas, Ken Puccio participated in the Big Brother Program. He remained involved in community service when he returned home, as a volunteer fire-fighter for 10 years and by serving as coach and president of the Perth Amboy Babe Ruth League.

Ken Puccio became a police officer in September 1983. After seven years in the Perth Amboy Police Department patrol division, he became one of 35 police officers selected by the Middlesex County Prosecutor to bring Drug Abuse Resistance Education (D.A.R.E.) to classrooms from Kindergarten through 12th grade. D.A.R.E. is a drug prevention program that teaches students good decision-making skills to help them avoid highrisk behavior and to ensure they grow up healthy, safe and secure.

In 17 years as a D.A.R.E. Officer, Ken Puccio has taught more than 4,000 Perth Amboy 5th graders. There are 46 police officers (in Perth Amboy and Woodbridge) that are a direct result of Kenneth Puccio's influence on Perth Amboy youth. Puccio also taught the G.R.E.A.T. Program, a law enforcement officer-instructed classroom curriculum with the primary objective of immunizing children against delinquency, youth violence, and gang membership.


Ken Puccio is a recognized expert on street gangs, graffiti, and the juvenile justice system. He has lectured on the subject of gangs at Rutgers, Monmouth, and Rider Universities.

He also taught classes at the Jersey City and NYPD police academies, trained with the Los Angeles Police Department Gang Unit and worked with the FBI, New Jersey State Police, and NYPD gang units.

In his capacity has a gang investigator, Puccio was targeted for assassination by the Latin Kings, Bloods, and Trinatarios, a prison gang that emerged during the early 1990's. In 2007, Puccio was assaulted by members of the Trinatarios.

Throughout his career as a police officer, Puccio has been accredited by other police departments and law enforcement agencies such as the N YPD, FBI, New Jersey State Police, and New Jersey Attorney General's Office. He was called to work with the FBI's Innocent Images Program, an undercover operation to catch pedophiles attempting to lure young sexual victims through the internet.

He has been recognized as

'Police Officer of the Year' three times: 1987 by the VFW, 1995 by the FOP and PBA, and by the Perth Amboy Merchants Association in 2003.

Puccio has earned two valor awards; once for disarming an individual wielding a handgun and for rescuing a victim trapped in a burning building; and a lifesaving award for performing CPR on a 14-month-old baby.

He has been widely recognized for his community service, earning the Perth Amboy Chamber of Commerce Outstanding Community Service Award in 1995 and being recognized by the Perth Amboy Police Department with more than 30 plus letters of commendation. He has been presented with several citations from the Senate and General Assembly.

Puccio served on the Middlesex County Youth Services Commission, as a board member for the Middlesex County Minorities Issues Committee, and on the Attorney General's working group on stationhouse adjustments. He administered the grant that funds Perth Amboy's police stationhouse adjustment program. Since 2004, he has been a member of and participated in the Police Unity Tour, riding his bicycle from Ground Zero to Washington, DC, and raising over \$220,000.00 for the Law Enforcement Memorial.

In addition to having served as a team member of the Juvenile Intensive Supervision Program and as president of the Middlesex County Juvenile Officers Association, Puccio was the commander of the Perth Amboy Police Youth Academy (PAYUP) and Perth Amboy Police Department historian.

In his 24 years as a juvenile detective, Ken Puccio served on the School Leadership Committees of Shull, Ceres, and Perth Amboy High. Since 2003, Ken Puccio has sponsored a scholarship in memory of his grandfather, Giovanni Puccio, to benefit graduates of Perth Amboy High School and the Middlesex County Vocational School.

Puccio was elected to the Perth Amboy Board of Education in 2009. He served as Vice-President of the Board from 2010-2013, and was elected president in 2017.

In addition to being a community-spirited volunteer, advocate for Perth Amboy youth, heroic law enforcement officer, and gifted teacher, Puccio is a dedicated parent who has been gifted with six children and five grand-children.

#### **Perth Amboy BOE Candidates Education First: Anton Massopust 2L**

PERTH AMBOY - Anton Massopust is a lifelong resident of Perth Amboy. His father died when Anton was age 3 and he was raised by his mother, Anne. Anton graduated from Perth Amboy High School in 1958 with an interest in science, nature, and the fire department.

He went to college and graduated from Villanova University in 1962 with a B.S. in biology, a minor in chemistry, and a concentration in religion. He faced hardship when his mother, Anne Massopust, long time art teacher in Perth Amboy High School lost her battle with breast cancer. Alone at age 22 Anton Massopust continued his volunteer work as a Scoutmaster of Troop 10 from Perth Amboy, organizing camp activities. He had earned the honor of Eagle Scout previously and volunteered many hours with the Boy Scouts.

Anton Massopust decided to become a teacher. "Teaching is not an easy job." When asked why he continues to teach Tony replies, "When a carpenter builds a house and drives by it, he'll say I built that house. A teacher helps build people. My students have become firefighters, EMT's, biologists, teachers, politicians and many other vocations. I was a part of that, building their future. Teaching can be tough. You can't rest, and you always have to be on your toes. Every day is opening day on Broadway, and you are the star."

Anton Massopust has taught biology since the day he signed the contract with Perth Amboy High School. His love for nature especially small animals stems from his boy scout days where his scout leader, Mr. Nestle took him all over New Jersey to such places as the Great Swamp and the Pine Barrens.

He was a volunteer firefighter in the PAFD since age 21 and still continues to be active in the fire department. Combining two of his most favorite activities, teaching and firefighting, Tony Massopust teaches firefighting in Perth Amboy along with EMT and numerous other courses.

At age 24 he married Marcella Zaleski, native of Perth Amboy and graduate of NYU and Parson's School of Design and an Art Teacher of forty-four years in the Perth Amboy School System. Later he became the father of two children, daughter, Katherine, and son Anton. Throughout his lifetime, he served as an officer on three historical committees including President of the Kearny Cottage Association for many years, Vice President of the Waterfront Association (an organization for the preservation of Perth Amboy's Waterfront) and a trustee in the Proprietary House. In the late 1960's to early 1970's Tony Massopust served as supervisor of Archeological studies in Perth Amboy. This included excavations at the Proprietary House and the Waterfront Area.

In 1974 Mr. Massopust was Chairman of the City of Perth Amboy Beautification Program.

In 1976 Anton Massopust was Chairman of the Perth Amboy Bicentennial Commission. Mr. Massopust organized a number of events and coordinated the celebration throughout the year. Anton Massopust received a citation from President Gerald Ford

for his work in the Bicentennial. Anton Massopust was also a trustee and the Historic Fair Chairman for the Celebrate Perth Amboy Festival. In the early 1980's, Mr. Massopust served as YCC advisor for Cheesequake Park, in which he built boardwalks and marked the trails at Cheesequake.

Anton Massopust was Science Department Head at Perth Amboy High School for over 20 years. He taught his favorite subject, biology and was beloved by many students who often speak fondly of Biology BSCS at Perth Amboy High School. During this time, Mr. Massopust served through 3 Middle States Evaluations, 3 State Monitoring Visitations and served on a visiting team for Middle States Evaluations. Mr. Massopust actually designed the science curriculum at PAHS and presented a variety of in-service programs and assemblies. In the curriculum in addition to basic Biology, Chemistry, and Physics were such subjects as Astronomy, Criminology, Ecology, Marine Science, and Anatomy & Physiology. Anton Massopust attended the State Education Academy, always improving his skills as both a teacher and department chairman.


He received his Master's in Supervision in 1976 from Monmouth College. He served on 10 committees during his 20-year run as PAHS Science Department. He received 3 mini-grants and 1 ESEA title for Marine Science at PAHS where one student, Karen Zupko was a Westinghouse Science Award Recipient. He received the esteemed Governor's Teacher Award for excellence in teaching in 1987. At Perth Amboy High School, Anton Massopust was active in student life, the advisor of 8 clubs including: The Biology Club, Military Modeling Club, Tropical Fish Club, Ecology Club, N.J. History Club, Softball Club, Angling Club, and Environmental Club. The biology club featured trips to the Pine Barrens canoeing down the Wading River and a trip to the Pine Barrens experiencing nature.

Anton Massopust was also active in the athletic department. He served as athletic Trainer for 19 years in PAHS as a State Licensed Trainer. He was Girls Softball Coach in both Hopelawn Little League and Perth Amboy High School (a combination of 11 years). That is a total of 24 years of active service in the athletic department.

He was a judge in the Decathlon of Knowledge for 3 years. He also participated in the "Faculty Follies", a teacher's show presented annually at PAHS during the 1980's. Anton Massopust initiated the Night School Gardening Program and ran a Nature Program for the Special Education Camp Outs. He designed an outdoor program for the G&T

He served as CYO advisor for Saint Mary's Church for 14 years and served as president of the PTA for 8 years at Ukrainian Assumption School. He is presently a member of the Holy Name Society, and a member of the Ukrainian Assumption Church Cultural Festival Committee.

His service is undisputed in the community. Anton Masso-

pust served as grand marshal of the 1994 Crop Walk. He has also served on the advisory committee of the Crompton-Chevron-Kindermorgan Community Advisory Panel and was president. He has served the city of Perth Amboy as Democratic Committeeman for Ward 3 District 2.

Mr. Massopust has been a volunteer firefighter since he was 21 years old and has now served for 58 years. During 1984-1987 Anton J. Massopust served as Fire Chief in the City of Perth Amboy. He has attended State, County and National Fire Academies and has taken over 36 different courses in Fire Science. These include: Arson Detection, Hazmat Awareness, the State Police Bomb School and Emergency Response to Terrorism Incidents plus a lengthy list of other fire courses. A Level II fire instructor, Mr. Massopust volunteers his time to pass down his knowledge of fire science as Lieutenant and training officer at the Perth Amboy Fire Department. He has been an officer for many years and has remained active for the entire 49 years he has been a member of the PAFD. Mr. Massopust has also served on the Perth Amboy First Aid Squad, and still volunteers as an EMT, CPR, and Bomb awareness instructor. He even had a stint teaching fire science at the Middlesex County Fire Acad-

Even after Anton Massopust retired from teaching at PAHS, he continued to teach at Middlesex County College both biology and the Natural History of New Jersey, a popular class in which students take trips learning all about New Jersey's treasures. He is now since retired from Middlesex County College. He taught as an Associate Professor of Biology in Caldwell College, Caldwell New Jersey from 2011 to 2016. He has also taught at Ukrainian Assumption School, Mount Saint Mary's Academy, and St. Peter's High School. Anton Massopust was inducted to Perth Amboy High School's Hall of Fame in 2006 for Community Service and Secondary Education.

He received a citation from Mayor Wilda Diaz for saving a life at a Ukrainian Assumption Church Dance in 2010. He was honored by the Knights of Columbus earning the Shield Award in 2014.

Anton Massopust is presently the City Historian in Perth Amboy. He served as a member of the Perth Amboy Board of Education for the year of 2013. He returned to serve on the Perth Amboy Board of Education from 2016 to 2018. Currently, he serves as Chair of the Curriculum Committee.

#### Opening statement by Former City Council President Lisa Nanton

PERTH AMBOY - Good afternoon and thank you for coming.

I am Lisa Nanton, campaign manager for PERTH AMBOY FIRST for City Council, and a former Perth Amboy City Council President.

Our service began years ago. We have been on opposite sides of issues. But we always respected each other and are capable of disagreeing without being disagreeable.

The common denominator that unites us today is the LOVE of our city. The decades of hours spent serving our residents is the evidence.

And that passion is why we have all come together to endorse Joel Pabon, Bill Petrick, and Milady Tejeda for city council—the PERTH AMBOY FIRST team.

ty." He questioned the Mayor's outrage now instead of in 2016 and 2017. "I fell for her tactics. Petrick's Facebook Page had reposts views that were pro and con against all political parties. He did not comment on any of them. Petrick wanted to inform and stimulate conversation. There were over 400 postings on Petrick's pages, but the Mayor cherry-picked a few of those postings (from Petrick's Facebook page). Mayor Diaz, you owe an apology to Bill Petrick, his family, and also the community. I have relatives who have been victims of abuse. You have disgraced them. My offer still stands to what I have stated in previous letters. I will take a polygraph test to prove that."

Councilman Joel Pabon talked next and said, "I am proud of what Petrick and I have accomplished. There have been no tax increase and we opposed an increase in the Mayor's budget. We've fought against wasteful spending and tabled rezoning. We have your (the community's) back and will vote for your best interest. The Mayor needs to work with the Council and not oppose us. I want to thank the former Council Members for their support."

Council President Bill Petrick spoke next. He thanked the current and former Council for their support. "Our opponents

are making dishonest attacks." He then commented about a member of Governor Phil Murphy's staff (who made recent racist and insulting comments aimed at religious and other organizations). That person is a member of LUPE PAC and neither our Mayor or anyone from that LUPE PAC commented about those insulting comments. Mudslinging will not fix our problems. We need to discuss issues affecting our daily lives. Our opponents have no community service. I started serving at the age of 18. Our combined team has over 80 years of community service. Milady Tejeda came up to speak, "I am the current Vice

President of the Board of Education and am on my third term. I came to Perth Amboy as a teenager and spoke no English. I graduated college with a bachelor's degree. I want the same opportunity for all students. We have a lot of overdevelopment, high taxes, and a poor infrastructure. I want to be a liaison between the City and the Board of Education."

At the end, Lisa Nanton summed it up. "We don't need people who are puppets for the Mayor. We need honest people and people who are there as a self-sacrifice and not for self interest."

#### South Amboy Council Approves Marijuana Ban 10/17/18 Council Meeting

By: Joseph L. Kuchie SOUTH AMBOY - The South Amboy city council unanimously passed an ordinance that will ban the growth and distribution of marijuana throughout the en-

tire city.

Ordinance No. 15-2018 states that businesses engaged in the growth or sale of medicinal or recreational marijuana or paraphernalia that facilitates the use of marijuana are prohibited in all zoning districts. The passing of this ordinance adds South Amboy to the list of nearly 40 towns in New Jersey that have officially banned marijuana from being sold.

The ordinance now goes to the desk of Mayor Fred Henry, who will need to provide final ap-

proval before it is published as provided by law. Mayor Henry announced after the vote that he would have no problem approving the ordinance.

"I'd like to thank the council tonight for passing ordinance 15(-2018) that shows the city's continued commitment to help stop drug use," Mayor Henry Said. "Obviously I'm going to have no problem signing that particular ordinance."

The sudden movement by these towns to ban marijuana throughout New Jersey is the result of the potential legalization of marijuana throughout the entire state by Governor Phil Murphy. The bill to legalize marijuana isn't expected to be introduced for another few

weeks, but cities like South Amboy have already made their opposition very clear.

South Amboy, like all other towns that have banned marijuana, are allowed to ban businesses but will not be able to collect any tax revenue if marijuana is legalized and sold through New Jersey. According to the ordinance, however, South Amboy determined that there is no area in the city that can safely house a business engaged in the growth, sale, or distribution of medicinal or recreational marijuana.

Councilman Brian McLaughlin was not in attendance for the meeting. The next city council meeting will be held on November 21 at 7:00 p.m.

### **BOE Candidates Forum 10/17/18 PAHS**

By: Katherine Massopust PERTH AMBOY - The Board of Education Candidates Forum took place on 10/17/18 at Perth Amboy High School. The forum was sponsored by the Perth Amboy Federation and the League of Women Voters who monitored the event. There were 6 candidates present at the forum. Candidates Maria Rodriguez and Anton Massopust were not present.

The forum began with an opening statement presented by each candidate

Isamar Pavano: I'm born and raised in Perth Amboy. My parents came to America for the American Dream. I have a bachelor's degree. I attended the Perth Amboy Public Schools and graduated in 2008. Currently I work for the City of Perth Amboy Teen Center. I'm positive I will focus on what's best for our schools.

Beth Lieberman: I've taught for the last 20 years. I was a teacher mainly in the Patten School. I retired last year. I still want to contribute to the school. As a working teacher, one needs not only vision but what's best for educators such as myself. My experience over the years makes for better ideas, better results.

Damaris Ramirez: I am a lifelong resident of Perth Amboy. My parents moved here 64 years ago. I'm involved in a lot of organizations in the City. I do policy writing. I have ideas for our children. Networking is very important in our commu-

Ken Puccio: I was born and raised in Perth Amboy. I was raised by a single parent (my mom) and graduated in 1974, was in the army 4 years and lived here since that time in 1978. I first was a fireman and then a police officer. I'm now part-time. For 24 years I've worked in juvenile division (of the Police Department). I'm a passionate advocate for kids. I chose to stay here the last 10 years. I was the Board President for the last 2 years, and the Board Vice President for 3 years.

Stephanie Márquez-Villa-

fañe: I've attended Board of Education Meetings religiously for the past 6 years. I'm an advocate for the handicapped community. I led a movement in the district to save the Honors Program. We completed that goal. I started a non-profit 501c3. We helped with updates to the curriculum, to help students get books when they had no books. 20-30 students should be the class size. For years I have tutored for free. Changes need to be made. People need to change.

Danielle Brown: I'm an Honors Student and 3-Sport Athlete and graduated Cum Lada. I've been a teacher for 5 years in Richmond, Virginia Public Schools. I now serve at the Cathedral (International). In 2006 I became involved in the youth minister program which is geared toward tutoring.

Anton J. Massopust was unable to come to the debate, but gave a statement: The students come first, second the parents third, the Board as a unit, fourth are the People of Perth Amboy. The ultimate goal of our educational process is to produce an productive individual who will be a good citizen.

Question: What do you see as the greatest challenge in Perth Amboy Schools?

Danielle Brown: A lot of my work now involves providing services to families for those that can't afford necessities such as school supplies. So many factors come into the classroom. Test scores have made progress, but more can be made.

Beth Lieberman: Sitting on this side of the table is a different perspective. It's important to create transparency.

Stephanie Márquez-Villafañe: As someone who has seen the district grow, one has to find a balance of finances and resources with the staff. If the staff doesn't have the manpower, they can't do what needs to be done. It's that feedback from staff that makes sure they get what they need to serve the students.

Isamar Pavano: Resources make sure the staff has the best materials. We must do what we can for what's best for the students. There is a language barrier – many students come from different countries. Many parents want to get involved but don't know how to. We should be able to engage them.

Ken Puccio: I've been here when things are bad. I've seen improvements. We have room for more. 1.) Parental involvement. 2.) We need more room. Down the road we'll need more space. We're on course on the Board of Education and we're moving in the right direction.

Damaris Ramirez: Parents are fearful because of immigration status. The bridge between the staff and children – some parents don't have resources and there's a language barrier. They're scared to ask for help. They don't know what's going to happen.

Question: What do you as a candidate offer as a Board of **Education Member?** 

Beth Lieberman: I've known the classroom for 28 years. I've seen just about everything that goes on in a classroom. My eyes offer a different perspective than what the Board sees.

Stephanie Márquez-Villafañe: My experience working with parents, students, are a fresh pair of eyes. I graduated high school in 2016. I know the dynamics and how the Board of Education works. I've advocated with the Union.

Isamar Payano: I work with volunteers, hundreds of kids writing different political collaborative and different community partners. There's lots of different things students tell us consistently. I've dedicated my life to this. I've been on the other side as a student.

Ken Puccio: I will continue to be open minded and contribute to insure the school district is run properly and fairly.

Damaris Ramirez: When students, staff, and parents need help, I'll bridge that gap and express their concerns to help the staff and parents.

Danielle Brown: I'm a former educator and will bring experience to the Board. I have been an adjunct. I'm a product of the City of Perth Amboy. I was a

3-sport athlete in high school and college. As a college athlete, I have a history of teamwork. My life's work has been in the community and I have the energy for the Board.

Question: What is the role of a School Board Member?

Stephanie Márquez-Villafañe: Doing what's required, run the business of the school district, working with parents and staff, knowing the dynamics of the school system, and the community. Working with parents and staff in what benefits the students, staff and parents. Come with new ideas and be there overall.

Isamar Payano: To set policy, advocate, plan, promote students with vision. To plan how to improve the district. To establish policies that are feasible on what we want and advocate for the community. Measure benchmarks for the goals.

Ken Puccio: I've sat here and gone through all the groundwork. We make policy and make sure the district runs properly. We establish a relationship with the Superintendent, and make sure students, teachers, staff and parents work together. We are the advocates of Perth Amboy, not only here, but to the City itself.

Damaris Ramirez: To make policy. Make sure everyone involved benefits. Makes plans that are feasible and to set policy with the Board and Superintendent that are going to work.

Danielle Brown: To call for and provide accountability and I will support those who we hire to have accountability and measure progress.

Beth Lieberman: Advocate and ensure for entire school community in manner as best as possible and to have responsible education.

Question: What qualities make for an effective school board member?

Isamar Payano: I'm open to change and improvement and funding in the community and care for the well-being of our youth. To understand to compromise and work together effectively and compassionately and do what is best for our children.

Ken Puccio: One must respect one another and their opinions. We don't always agree. Work as a team and come to a conclusion. Advocate and work together for the kids and staff, whatever personal bias you have stays at the door. It's important we all get along.

Damaris Ramirez: Take yourself personally out of the equation. Respect each other.

Danielle Brown: I have a finger on the pulse of the community and what will impact Board decisions. What's the bigger picture for the entire district.

Beth Lieberman: Collaborate, communicate, both with the administration, Board Members, parents and students. Problem solving is important. I'm a good listener. You make decisions that will impact the children.

Stephanie Márquez-Villafañe: Transparency with the community needs to be a good foundation. When you're on a committee, know the specifics of that committee. Be a good sorter and a good researcher. Know what's the truth and what's not, know what can be done - what policies are good and what needs to be changed. Transparency is most important. Question: How would you balance the budget pressures against the growing needs of the community?

**Ken Puccio:** Perth Amboy is a special needs district. Over 80% of our budget is from outside the City. 20% of the budget comes from the taxpayers - their fair share. \$27 million in taxpayers' money comes from the City. We really should be paying \$46 million, - their fair share, but for certain reasons we don't. Our budget is around \$300 million. We are the watchdog on what is spent and if it is spent wisely. We should be ever vigilant.

Damaris Ramirez: We have to be very vigilant. When all our expenses we have our budget needs, so the rest doesn't have to bear the burden.

**Danielle Brown:** Giving needs of the community funding and identify the needs of the dis-

trict. You must prioritize needs and have an understanding what comes to the table for the needs of many. We don't want anyone to lose out. We must be careful when making these decisions.

**Beth Lieberman:** We all deal with these types of budge decisions at home. It's the same thought process. It's similar with the Board of Education. Keep the priorities.

Stephanie Márquez-Villafañe: It's a very intricate priority of the Board of Education to make sure the school district run smoothly. There are many priorities for the state. Perth Amboy does not pay its fair share and it's important to the School Board to focus on what the needs of our staff and students are.

**Isamar Payano:** The way is prioritizing. We have to be diligent. Prioritizing and evaluating the budget. At the end of the day, what is the best way to handle the issue.

Question: What factors are critical to education? What would you do to improve this?

Damaris Ramirez: Our graduates are not on par with students in other districts. Things can be done to improve that. Allow students to do more on the computer.

Danielle Brown: Classroom size is important. It is nearly impossible to teach (in a huge teacher to student ration) which starts chaos. Classroom size impacts where the students learn. Students need the tools to compete.

Beth Lieberman: A decent ratio of teacher/children is important to learn. When you have parents that are involved, the students can have a better education.

**Stephanie Márquez-Villafa- ñe:** A few years ago, Perth Am-

boy paid a lot of money (for a research study on this subject). In the first 1½ years many of our K-1 students are behind by 6 months. By 2<sup>nd</sup> & 3rd Grade, they are 1½ years behind, by the 4<sup>th</sup> Grade many students are on a 1<sup>st</sup> Grade reading level or 2<sup>nd</sup> Grade Math level. Looking at those immigrant children, status is irrelevant to education in my opinion, our students are at a major disadvantage. I see the need to close the gap.

**Isamar Payano:** Send teachers to the right professional development. The culture and energy of families are giving them the equipment they need for their education.

Ken Puccio: Our most important vessel is the classroom teacher who gives all the students need. A happy staff is a productive staff. We need to find a happy medium. It all begins with the classroom teacher. Question: Many new staff members are leaving and retire as soon as eligible. What would you do to retain staff?

**Danielle Brown:** Make decisions to alleviate the pressure. Create a work environment with understanding this is a district where you support the educators.

Beth Lieberman: I believe decision making and what is happening now in our district. We are not that different than other districts. We are not the lowest priced district. Salary is not the single answer. Raise the bar just like in the other districts. Stress exams and what teachers need to do to function.

Stephanie Márquez-Villafañe: This was recently brought up at the Board of Education Meeting. Teachers, staff, personnel come and go. That's the reality. Colonia High School was given the bronze medal, and teach-

ers there were paid less than here. Make sure morale is up. Teachers feeling valued and that knowing their opinions matter is important.

**Isamar Payano:** More teamwork. Feeling appreciated. More staff involvement in decision making. The ratio of classroom size is important.

Ken Puccio: I'm a team member of the Board of Education. What's happening to teachers is not only in Perth Amboy, but statewide and across the nation. A lot of pressure is put on teachers today. We should improve morale. People who do choose to leave, find out the reason. We need dialogue with staff. There should be an exiting interview. Never close the door with them. Damaris Ramirez: should be an open-door policy. Feel comfortable everyday discuss something. Help them do a good job.

Question: Where do you stand on privatization of schools?

**Beth Lieberman:** I'm a firm believer in public school education. Education should not be based on money.

**Stephanie Márquez-Villa- fañe:** I'm a strong believer of public-school education. We must do what's best for our district. Ultimately what we do for the district will affect us.

**Isamar Payano:** It's important to have the best education. I believe in a public-school education.

Ken Puccio: No. I would never vote to privatize any part of the school system. Most of our employees live in this town. For example, instead of outsourcing for the need of additional landscaping, the maintenance department is doing it. It usually hurts the little people (to privatize services). I would never vote to privatize any de-



The presentation was on the HIB Self-Assessment of Readiness for College and Careers (PARCC) which was presented by Assistant Superintendent Dr. Vivian Rodriguez, Assistant Superintendent Mr. Richard Chromey and Anti-Bullying Specialist, Ms. MaryJo McAdam. ### This Week in World War II 75 Years Ago

On October 15, 1943, German troops surround Rome's Jewish A second day's bombing of Kassel, Germany, by the RAF takes place on October 22, 1943. The 416,000 incendiaries dropped by 569 bombers cause a firestorm that keeps flames burning for seven days in the city of 236,000. Over 10,000 people — mostly civilians — are killed and 150,000 are rendered homeless.

A German torpedo-boat flotilla on October 23 sinks the Royal Navy cruiser *HMS Charybdis* and the destroyer *HMS Limborne* in an attack in the English Channel. From Japanese-occupied Singapore, the provisional government of Azad Hind ("Free India") declares war on the United Kingdom and the United States. In Italy, almost 1.5 million people begin evacuating Naples in fear of a rumored bombing threat that, in fact, never materializes. The Soviet 28th Army — after many days of heavy street fighting — drives the German Sixth Army out of Melitopol, in southeastern Ukraine.

In the Bismarck Archipelago, Allied aircraft on October 24 raid Rabaul, New Britain Island, for a second time in two days. One Japanese destroyer and five merchant ships are sunk in the raids. At Aitape, Papua-New Guinea, captured Australian commando Sgt. Leonard Siffleet is executed by beheading. A photograph taken just a moment prior to Siffleet's execution by a swordwielding Japanese soldier is found six months later by American soldiers on the body of a dead Japanese officer at Hollandia, Papua-New Guinea. The photo — believed to be the only picture of the execution of a POW by a Japanese soldier — is published in Australian newspapers and in LIFE magazine in the U.S.

On October 25, the Japanese open the infamous 258-milelong Burma-Siam Railway, connecting Bangkok, Thailand, with Rangoon, Burma. The Japanese used 61,000 British and Commonwealth POWs and some 220,000 Burmese forced laborers to build the railroad. Over 90,000 Burmese and 12,000 prisoners died during construction. (The building of the railroad was the setting for Pierre Boulle's novel [and a subsequent motion picture], The Bridge over the River Kwai.) In Europe, the Red Army's 3rd Ukrainian Front captures Dnipropetrovsk, Ukraine's fourth-largest city.

An amphibious invasion of the Treasury Islands, south of Bougainville in the Solomons, is made on October 26 by the New Zealand 8th Brigade, which defeats the Japanese garrison stationed there. Following the islands' capture, U.S. Navy Seabees build an airstrip used for attacks on the Japanese base at Rabaul. In Germany, a prototype of the Dornier Do 335 heavy fighter makes its first flight. The plane will be the Luftwaffe's fastest piston-engined aircraft during the war.

The first prototype stainless-steel airplane — the twin-engined RB-1 Conestoga cargo plane, designed for the U.S. Navy by Philadelphia's Budd Company — rolls off the assembly line on October 27. The craft never becomes operational, however, due to steel-price increases, production problems and excessive fuel consumption.

In the U.S., unresolved disputes have caused coal miners to once again start walking off their jobs. By October 28, thousands are on strike and the work stoppage is gaining momentum. In the Pacific, 650 U.S. Marines of the 2nd Parachute Battalion led by Lt. Col. Victor "Brute" Krulak, land on Choiseul, in the Solomon Islands. Their mission is to conduct raids against Japanese army and navy facilities on the island to divert attention from planned Allied landings on Bougainville at Empress Augusta Bay.


