South Amboy Awards Contract for Ferry Terminal Design and Permitting

11/7/18 Business Meeting

By: Joseph L. Kuchie SOUTH AMBOY - The city of South Amboy took a very large step in making a new ferry terminal a reality at last Wednesday's city business meeting.

The city council unanimously voted to pass Resolution No. 164-2018, which awards a \$1.475 million contract for the ferry facility's design and permitting to French & Parrello, Associates. The city anticipates permitting and design to take six months once the resolution is approved by Mayor Fred Henry, and they hope to go out for bid for the terminal's construction by Summer 2019.

"It's a huge step, I know all of you have been up to your necks in it for a very long time," Business Administrator Glenn Skarzynski said. "We have a very aggressive timeline for that. Mr. Tardy from French & Parello said if they were approved on the 7th, they'd intend to have people out there on the 8th getting started. We're hoping by the summer to be in a position to go out for bid for actual construction of the terminal."

"There are only a couple people who really know all the things we've gone through over the years to get these things accomplished and how often things changed for whatever reasons whether it was the federal government, whether it was D.O.T., whatever the case may be," Henry said. "I'm just so happy that

this is the next step and as Glenn said, they are on a schedule to have this done within six months and they are very confident that they will get it done."

"It's closer than we think," he added. "We've been saying that for many years, but it's just been a long process for a number of different reasons."

The city formed a small committee to get this bid done and approved, which including city representatives including Skarzynski, Mayor Henry, and former Business Administrator Camille Tooker. Tooker was in attendance to see the resolution get passed, and Council President Mickey Gross thanked her for the work she has done.

"She has been working behind the scenes forever with this ferry terminal, and my hats are off to Camille Tooker for all the great work you have done and great work you still need to do, so thank you Camille."

The city council also passed two resolutions by a vote of 4-1 that amends the resolution regarding the Manhattan Beach Project and authorizes the execution of the agreement. Resolution No. 162-2018 states that "SARA (South Amboy Redevelopment Agency) and the city have approved the proposed conveyance of the BNE (Real Estate Group) Site to BNE for the construction of a residential rental project consisting of approximately 500 units in two

discrete components."

Resolution No. 163-2018 goes into the redevelopment a bit further, highlighting that "Phase 1" will consist of 291 market-rate and 15 affordable residential units including parking spaces and an amenity space, and Phase 2 will include 210 market-rate and 11 affordable residential units. The current timeline would have construction on Phase 1 beginning in November 2020 and ending in November 2023, and Phase 2 construction beginning in November 2023 and ending in November 2025.

Corresponding ordinances were taken up on first reading that amend the beach club district redevelopment plan and approves applications for a long-term tax exemption regarding the redevelopers. The ordinances will be reviewed by the planning board, and the council plans to have a public hearing on the two ordinances at their next business meeting on December 5 at 6:00 p.m.

Councilman Brian McLaughlin was the lone councilperson to vote no on both resolutions and ordinances. All council members were in attendance for the meeting.

The next city council meeting has been changed from November 21st to November 19th at 7:00 p.m. The meeting will still take place at city hall.

coming to the United States at the age of 4 from the Dominican Republic. "I watched many war movies, especially "Saving Private Ryan," which I've seen multiple times. Electoral Voting

Perth Amboy Man Charged in Fatal Stabbing of Pregnant Woman

County Prosecutor Andrew C.
Carey and Chief Roman McKeon of the Perth Amboy Police
Department announce that a man was arrested and charged today in the fatal stabbing of a city woman who was killed last night in Perth Amboy.

Benny M. Pichardo Santos Arias, 25, of Perth Amboy, has been charged with murder in the first degree, possession of a weapon for an unlawful purpose in the third degree, and hindering his own apprehension in the third degree in the fatal stabbing of a 20-year-old woman who was six months pregnant.

On November 8, 2018, at approximately 9:09 pm the Perth Amboy Police responded to the intersection of Sayre and Steadman Avenue and found a 20-year-old woman with mul-

tiple stab wounds.

The victim, Esmeralda Cedeno, was transported to Raritan Bay Medical Center in Perth Amboy where she was pronounced dead from her injuries, the baby also did not survive. Autopsies on both are pending with the Middlesex County Medical Examiner's Office.

The incident is being investigated by Detective Frank Cristiano of the Perth Amboy Police Department and Detective Erik Larsen of the Middlesex County Prosecutor's Office.

The defendant is being held at the Middlesex County Correction Center in North Brunswick pending a Detention Hearing.

Former School Security Guard Charged with Sexual Assault and The Endangerment of Minors

in Perth Amboy was arrested
yesterday on charges of sexual
assault and endangerment of
minors.

Elios Arias-Aguilar, 25, of Perth Amboy was charged with one count of aggravated sexual assault in the first degree, one count of sexual assault in the second degree, one count of aggravated criminal sexual contact in the third degree, one count of criminal sexual contact in the fourth degree, and two counts of endangering the welfare of a child in the second degree.

An investigation is being conducted by Detective Riscardo Rosado of the Perth Amboy Po-

lice Department and Detective Ryan Tighe of the Middlesex County Prosecutor's Office

The investigation has determined that the defendant, who was a school security guard, engaged in sexual intercourse at his home in Perth Amboy, New Jersey, with a minor who was known to him. The investigation further revealed that the defendant sent nude photographs through social media to two minors, who were known to him.

Aguilar was employed at the McGinnis Middle School as a security guard for approximately two years.

The defendant is being held at the Middlesex County Adult Corrections Center pending a Detention Hearing.



2019 Social Security Changes Announced

The Social Security Administration announced a 2.8 percent boost to monthly Social Security and Supplemental Security Income (SSI) benefits for 2019. The increase is the largest in seven years and is based on the rise in the Consumer Price Index over the past 12 months ending in September 2018.

For those still contributing to Social Security through wages, the potential maximum income subject to Social Security tax increases 3.5 percent this year, to \$132,900. A recap of the key amounts is outlined here:

- SSI is the standard payment for people in need. To qualify for this payment you must have little income and few resources (\$2,000 if single/\$3,000 if married).
- A full-time student who is blind or disabled can still receive SSI benefits as long as earned income does not exceed the monthly and annual student exclusion amounts listed above.

These figures are reflected in the self-employed tax rates, as self-employed individuals pay both halves of the tax.



This Week in World War II 75 Years Ago

The Germans on November 12 overrun British forces in the Dodecanese Islands, a group of Greek islands in the Aegean Sea off the coast of Turkey. In Australia, Japanese planes bomb Darwin, the capital of the Northern Territory. Since February 19, 1942, Darwin has been bombed 63 times. In Italy, British troops capture Atessa, in Abruzzo, on the Adriatic coast.

In Italy, Gen. Sir Harold Alexander, Supreme Allied Commander of Ground Forces in the Mediterranean, on November 13 orders his 15th Army Group, comprising the U.S. Fifth Army and the British Eighth Army, to rest and reorganize after fighting against determined German forces. The war in Italy is proving to be very attritional.

In the Pacific, American heavy bombers hit Tarawa, in the Gilbert Islands, on November 14. In the Atlantic, the destroyer USS William D. Porter — during a torpedo drill — accidentally fires a live, armed torpedo at the battleship USS Iowa, which is carrying President Roosevelt, Secretary of State Cordell Hull and multiple military and civilian advisers to North Africa for summit meetings at Cairo and Tehran with Winston Churchill and Joseph Stalin. Frantic efforts using signal flags and lamps to warn Iowa of the danger are unsuccessful (the vessels are under orders to maintain radio silence). Finally, Porter breaks radio silence, and the battleship turns hard to avoid the torpedo, which explodes in *Iowa's* wake. *Porter* is immediately ordered to Bermuda, where the officers and crew are placed under arrest for an inquiry into the affair. The *Iowa* incident is ultimately judged to have been an accident, and USS William D. Porter — with its captain and crew intact — continues its wartime service. (The crewman responsible for failing to remove the torpedo's primer [thereby rendering it harmless] is later individually tried, convicted and sentenced to hard labor. President Roosevelt, understanding that the mishap was an accident, intervenes and commutes the sailor's sentence.) Axis partner Bulgaria is bombed for the first time, as 91 American B-25 bombers attack Sofia.

On November 15, Great Britain resumes its Arctic convoys to the Soviet Union. In London, the Allied Expeditionary Force, for the invasion of western Europe, is officially organized. In Germany, *Reichsführer-SS* Heinrich Himmler orders that nomadic gypsies and "part-gypsies" are to be considered "on the same level as Jews and placed in concentration camps." The first 20 Roma (gypsies) reach Auschwitz on this day.

The Battle of Leros, a Greek island in the Aegean Sea, ends on November 16 with the Germans capturing 8,850 British and Italian troops. RAF and U.S. planes bomb the "heavy water" plant at Telemark, Norway, which the Germans are attempting to repair. The plant — crucial to Germany's atomic-weapons program — was heavily damaged in a raid by Norwegian commandos in February 1943. In the South Pacific, the American submarine USS Corvina, on patrol south of the Japanese base at Truk, is hit by two torpedoes fired by Japanese sub I-176 and sinks with the loss of all 82 crew members. *Corvina* will be the only U.S. sub to be sunk by a Japanese submarine during the war.

On the Eastern Front, Soviet forces on November 17 advance toward Korosten, Ukraine, and Gomel, Belarus. On Papua-New Guinea, the Battle of Sattelberg — between Australian and Japanese troops — begins on the Huon Peninsula.

On November 18, 440 Royal Air Force planes bomb Berlin, but cause only light damage.




