South Amboy Receives A+ Bond Rating CDBG Funds Allocated 3 New Police Officers Sworn In

By: Katherine Massopust SOUTH AMBOY – Municipal Auditor Gary Higgins gave a brief presentation about the financial status of South Amboy. He stated that the City went up from an A- to an A+ Bond Rating. Higgins gave recommendations on what options the City had regarding financing due to the increase in Bond Rating.

Mayor Fred Henry then spoke and thanked everyone for their hard work. He remarked that it was the policies of the administration for the past 8 years that resulted in the improvements of the financial status of the City.

Business Administrator Glenn Skarzynski announced he had met with the committee and they had decided how the CDBG funds will be allocated. He stated that the City had received an increase of \$10,000 in CDBG (Community Development Block Grant) funding.

Skarzynski stated that there will be a match dollar for dollar up to \$2,500 in sidewalk grants for seniors with qualifying income for sidewalk improvements in their homes. \$9,841 for produce voucher programs for senior citizens.

Skarzynski explained that they are going to give funding for history and arts programs throughout the year. "The committee was happy in the direction we're going in. We will submit the paperwork by the March 1st deadline."

No one spoke at the public

portion.

Three police officers: Gloriann Rutkowski, Patrick Kelly, and Timothy Kales were sworn in.

Police Chief Darren Lavigne made a few comments. "I'd like to welcome the new police officers. It's not an easy task to go through the selection process. They go through a rigorous program. Not everyone can make it. I stressed the importance to getting back this agency to a 30-Man Police Department. The Mayor was very in tune and very receptive. He pushed for these appointments."

Lavigne shared a private text that he sent to Former Captain David Kales on the day of graduation of his son, Timothy. "I want to extend the sentiments in this text to the parents of Patrick Kelly and Gloriann Rutkowski because I think they are extremely important: Congratulations on great accomplishments. As parents, these are the days we dream of and life itself doesn't give us enough of them. I am extremely cognizant that this did not happen by accident, but rather from a culmination of thousands life lessons taught by loving parents. I congratulated your son personally, but now extend this to yourself and your wife. Well done, Mom and Dad."

Mayor Fred Henry stated that being a police officer is no easy task. "It can be dangerous. We know there is evil in the world."

Henry went on to state that often many of the recruits in the police academy do not complete the training. He is proud of the three officers who were sworn in.

Councilwomen Zusette Dato and Christine Noble congratulated the new officers.

Councilman Tom Reilly commented that Officer Kelly had already started his career of service to South Amboy as a volunteer on the South Amboy Baseball Team. He mentioned there is a Bluegrass Concert coming up. He also spoke about kicking off Government Week which is from April 7th – April 14th. "We're going to coordinate with the schools and speak at the high school. We're going to encourage them to participate coop programs and wrap it up with honoring the city's volunteers."

Councilman Brian McLaughlin asked about repairing the Hole in the Wall.

B.A. Skarzynski stated that repairs will begin anywhere from one week to the next month.

Mayor Fred Henry congratulated the new police officers. "They'll be a fine addition to our Police Department." He also stated, "It's been 8 years to get where we are today. It's the things we did to have a sound financial future."

All Council Members were present.






Most Rev. Borys Gudziak Appointed New Metropolitan-Archbishop of the Ukrainian Archeparchy of Philadelphia

PHILADELPHIA, P.A. - On Monday, February 18th, 2019, it was announced that the Pope Francis has appointed Most Rev. Borys Gudziak as Archbishop of Philadelphia for Ukrainians and Metropolitan for the Ukrainian Catholic Church in USA.

Born in 1960 in Syracuse, New York, he is the son of immigrants from Ukraine. He earned a bachelor's degree in philosophy and biology from Syracuse University in 1980 and then studied in Rome, in the circle of Patriarch Josyf Slipyj. He received a STB degree in theology from the Pontifical Urban University in 1983 and then returned to America to pursue a doctorate in Slavic and Byzantine Cultural History at Harvard University which he successfully defended in 1992.

He was ordained as a priest on November 26, 1998 and in 2012 he was appointed Bishop of the Ukrainian Greek Catholic Church in France, Belgium, the Netherlands, Luxemburg and Switzerland. Bishop Borys was an active supporter of the Maidan movement for human dignity and appeared regularly on leading global TV channels and media providing expert commentary. Borys Gudziak is the founder and president of the Ukrainian Catholic University in Lviv, Ukraine and the head of Department of External Church Relations of the Ukrainian Catholic Church. Borys Gudziak has received other numerous awards and distinctions. He has written articles in popular magazines, newspapers, commentary on political, cultural, and religious affairs, position papers

MOVIE REVIEW: BOHEMIAN RHAPSODY

"Queen is whatever I say it is!"

Bohemian Rhapsody won the Golden Globe for Best Picture and Rami Said Malek won the Oscar for Best Male Lead Actor and a Golden Globe for Best Actor as his portrayal of Freddie Mercury. Bohemian Rhapsody was nominated for an Oscar for Best Picture.

Bohemian Rhapsody is the story of Freddie Mercury lead singer of the rock band Queen. The man who became Freddie Mercury (Farrokh Bulsara) was working at Heathrow Airport, London as a baggage handler. He used to write songs in his spare time, but he could sing. He goes to a small concert for college kids to see a band called "Smile" and convinces them that he can sing for them after their lead singer just quit. Queen then recorded Bohemian Rhapsody. Some people loved it while some people hated it, but everyone paid attention to it. The song was such a gamble because it was too long, that the record company did not want to release it as a single, so Freddie Mercury took a risk and gave it to the radio stations himself by literally walking in the door of the radio station and doing it. The song and the album became huge hit.

The movie delves into Queens success and Freddie Mercury's path to self-destruction with struggle with his own sexuality, living in an abusive relationship, and his alcohol and drug addiction. Eventually Freddy straightens out his own life and Oueen came back together for "Live-Aid" to benefit the Ethiopian famine relief and was the hit of the concert. Tom's Tax Tips

How to Correct Common Financial Mistakes

You're working at the office, getting stuff done around the house, or hanging out with family when - wham! - a phone call, email or text alerts you that something is wrong with your finances. When a negative financial event hits, don't let it take you down. Here are some common mistakes and steps to remedy each situation:

- You overdraw your bank account. First, stop using the account to avoid additional overdraft fees. Next, manually balance your account by reviewing all posted transactions. Look for unexpected items and fraudulent activity. Then, call your bank to explain the situation and ask that all fees be refunded. Banks are not obligated to refund fees, but often times they will. The next steps vary based on the reason for the overdraft, but ultimately your goal is to bring your account back to a positive balance as soon as possible.
- You miss a credit card payment. Make as big a payment as possible as soon as you realize you missed it. Time is of the essence with late credit card payments - the longer it goes, the more serious the consequences. Then call the credit card company to discuss the missed payment. You might be able to get a refund of the late fees, and perhaps a reversal of the interest charge.
- You forget to file a tax return. Gather all your tax documents as soon as possible, and file the tax return even if you can't pay the taxes owed. This will stop your account from gathering additional penalties. You can then work with the IRS on a payment plan if need be. The sooner you file, the sooner the money will be in your bank account if you're due a refund. If you wait too long (three years or more), any potential refunds will be gone forever.
- You lose your wallet. Start by calling all of your debit card providers, then your bank and the credit card companies. Next, set up fraud alerts with the major credit reporting companies and get a new driver's license. Finally, if you think it was stolen, file a report with the police.
- You miss an estimated tax payment. Estimated payments are due in April, June, September and January each year. If you are required to make estimated payments and miss a due date, don't simply wait until the next due date. Pay it as soon as possible to avoid further penalties. If you have a legitimate reason for missing the payment, such as a casualty or disaster loss, you might be able to reduce your penalty.

Remember, mistakes happen. When they do, stay calm and walk through the steps to correct the situation as soon as possible.

People commented on Amazon's failed plan to move into New York City. Amazon promised 25,000 jobs for employees paying \$150,000 annually. Is this possible? No, workers







This Week in World War II 75 Years Ago

As the climax of the Allies' "Big Week" bombing campaign, 830 bombers of the U.S. 8th Air Force and 150 bombers of the U.S. 15th Air Force conduct a daylight raid on the Messerschmitt works at Regensburg and at Augsburg on February 25, 1944. Losing a total of 65 planes themselves, the Americans claim to shoot down 142 German fighters as well as destroying 1,000 German fighters on the assembly lines and 1,000 more in lost production. In Reykjavik, the Icelandic Parliament declares the island's independence from Denmark.

The Allies' "Big Week" bombing campaign of German industrial cities — deemed a success by planners — comes to an official conclusion on February 26. On the Eastern Front, the Soviet 54th Army captures Porkhov, Russia, about 50 miles from the Estonian border. In six weeks, the Red Army has inflicted tremendous damage on German Army Group North, wiping out three divisions, routing 17 more and capturing 189 tanks and 1,800 artillery pieces. In addition, local partisans have killed over 21,000 German troops, destroyed 300 bridges and derailed 136 German military trains. Some 600 Soviet bombers attack Helsinki, Finland — fires started by the raid can be seen from 250 miles away. In South America, the source of the Orinoco River is discovered near the Brazilian-Venezuelan border by the crew of a U.S. Army Air Forces plane flying a patrol out of British Guiana

U.S. military authorities report on February 27 that about 60,000 Japanese are trapped on New Britain and New Ireland. These enemy troops will be bypassed.

On February 28, the Admiralty Islands, part of Papua-New Guinea, are invaded by the U.S. Army's 1st Cavalry Division. This leaves the Japanese Pacific Headquarters at Rabaul, on New Britain in the Bismarck Archipelago, bypassed and isolated. Gen. Douglas MacArthur pays a one-day visit to the Admiralties. Arab governments lodge a protest with the U.S. regarding sentiments expressed in Congress concerning creation of a Jewish state in Palestine. In Germany, test pilot Hanna Reitsch visits Hitler at Berchtesgaden to receive a second Iron Cross and suggests the establishment of a squadron of suicide bombers who could pilot a modified version of the V-1 rocket. Reitsch volunteers to become a member of such a squadron, but *der Führer* is not receptive, feeling the war situation does not presently warrant such a unit. He does, however, authorize a research program to explore the idea.

In Italy, the Germans launch a third major offensive at Anzio on February 29 but fail to break through. In southeast Asia, five leaders of the Indonesian Communist Party are sentenced to death by the Japanese.

On March 1, 1944, massive anti-fascist strikes occur in Mussolini's Italian Social Republic in northern Italy, with as many as 1.2 million workers walking off their jobs. Farther south, Vatican City is bombed a second time, this time by an Italian plane that drops six bombs on the edge of the papal enclave, killing a workman and wounding a seminarian. In Germany, the "Jägerstab (Fighter Staff)" is formed, under Karl-Otto Saur, acting under the authority of the Armaments Ministry led by Albert Speer. Consisting of government officials, SS personnel and representatives of the aircraft industry, the task force's objective is to boost production of the Me-109 and Fw-190 fighter planes. The group decides that — in the wake of the Allies' "Big Week" bombing attacks — assembly lines will be located in mines and in tunnels to protect against air raids. After two weeks of heavy fighting, the Germans abandon their attempts to eliminate the Allied beachhead at Anzio.

On March 2, the U.S. government cuts off Lend-Lease aid to Turkey because that nation is reluctant to join the war on the Allied side or to make any other contribution to the Allied war effort. At Balvano, Italy, about 50 miles east of Salerno, a steam-powered freight train stalls inside a tunnel; 521 illegal riders are asphyxiated by smoke and carbon monoxide fumes. (Because of major food shortages, they were headed to farms in the countryside where they could barter goods and commodities given to them by Allied soldiers for fresh produce.) In Yugoslavia, Allied planes conduct their first bombing mission in support of Tito's Partisan forces, near Knin, Croatia, an important transportation junction between Zagreb and Split.




