

PERTH AMBOY - At 13:46 (1:46 p.m.) on 7/27/219, the Department was dispatched to 217 Washington Street for a reported building fire. Fire units quickly arrived and were met with heavy fire conditions engulfing the rear of the structure, also spreading to the neighboring house. Multiple master streams and hose lines were put into operation to contain and extinguish the fire over the course of several hours. All occupants were able to safely evacuate prior to our arrival. Responding units were E-1, E-2, E-4, T-2, C-1, C-2, C-5, C-8 & C-9. The fire escalated to 4 alarms calling in mutual aid from Keasbey, Melrose, Morgan, South Amboy, Iselin, New Market, East Brunswick, North Brunswick & Plainsboro to assist on scene along with the Middlesex County Fire Marshal's Office. Edison and Monroe covered the City for the duration of the incident. The fire ultimately displaced 28 people from 211-213 & 217 Washington St. They were assisted by the City's relocation officers and the Red Cross. The fire is currently under investigation by the PAFD & MCFM.





Moody's rating rationale states, "The upgrade to A2 reflects Perth Amboy trend of improving finances, declining debt burden and reduced unemployment rate."

The summary provided by Moody's indicates that their credit upgrade considered the following:

·The unemployment rate has fallen from historical highs.

·The City's financial position is healthy and has continued to improve due to conservative budgeting practices and growth in construction code fees and other miscellaneous revenues.

·The City's above average (inherited) debt burden is expected to continue to decline.

An Idea

There have been numerous mass shootings in the United States over the years. People are quick to blame the President, the NRA, mental illness, bullying, terrorism, etc.

I do believe people have a right to protect themselves and their families. However, if you look at the photographs of these mass shooters, they all have the same "deranged" look in their eyes. In many cases, the automatic weapons they used were bought legally. The problem is you want to prevent these tragedies before they happen. I propose a solution to this problem.

The present procedure for buying a gun in New Jersey: The first part is to fill out an application with references what gun you are planning to buy and the reason you are buying it. It can take a while to process through the system.

All well and good, but this is what I'm proposing:

The perspective gun buyer should fill out their application, then go through an instantaneous computer background check. If he/she passes the computer check (city, state, federal), the buyer should have a mandatory psychiatric interview/evaluation right then and there. This should take about an hour. The person doing this evaluation should be a licensed psychiatrist who asks a set of standardized questions and depending how they are answered, the psychiatrist can peg someone who is troubled, and probably should not be buying a gun. This serves a dual purpose where if a potential gun buyer that is flagged as potentially mentally ill or severely disturbed, they should immediately be referred to get the help that they most desperately need before they hurt themselves or

There should be tier levels ranging from tier 1 – pellet gun; tier 2 air rifle/skeet shooting; tier 3 – small hunting rifle; tier 4 - shotgun; tier 5 revolver/handgun; tier 6 – semiautomatic; tier 7 assault rifle; tier 8 machine gun. (1 being easiest permit to get). (suggested) These interviews should reflect these tier levels.

Also, during that interview, it should be determined if the applicant's spouse or any children of the house of a certain age would be deemed as a "red flag". (They must go for part of the interview/evaluation, too.) This way, any red flags won't slip through the system.

You pass that, you can get your gun. It used to take 4 hours to get a cell phone. I'm sure a perspective gun owner would not mind sacrificing one day of his/her life to follow this procedure.

One can make an argument that someone can be stable, then a few years later become unstable and there is a problem. That is a possibility, but many times the early warning signs are there.

How does the government pay for it? Charge a small fee of around \$300 - \$400 for the evaluation. That should cover the cost of this position (salary). The psychiatrist doing this evaluation should adhere to standard guidelines to keep his/her own personal feelings or political views out of the decision process. It should be an honest evaluation of a potential gun buyer's mental stability.

Hopefully this procedure will satisfy both sides of the spectrum. Nobody is banning guns and it takes guns out of the hands of people who would potentially be a mass shooter. Do this, and hopefully these mass shootings will finally stop. *K.M.*

Mayor Diaz's Administration Plagued by Sinkholes, Water Quality Concerns, and a Budget Deficit of over \$5 million

Press Release 8/4/19 Courtesy of Sharon Hubberman PERTH AMBOY - Perth Amboy City residents received news from various social media platforms that Mayor Wilda Diaz may be issuing legal actions against the City Council Members utilizing taxpayer dollars to fund a lawsuit. "Even though the Mayor knows that our City budget has over a \$5 million budget gap, she continues to waste taxpayer dollars to pursue her political agenda rather than having solutions that won't increase property taxes to fill the budget gap," said City resident, Sharon Hubberman. "Unfortunately, her mismanagement of the City's resources is becoming more and

more evident each day."

Diaz currently faces a recall issued by three concerned residents. According to the statement issued on the recall notice it states: "Since the three terms of office of Wilda Diaz, mayor of Perth Amboy, our City of Perth Amboy has been plagued

with her mismanagement, lack of transparency, and she has failed to successfully address our degraded water and sewer system despite rising water fees to our residents."

Recently, Perth Amboy has had the biggest 20 foot deep sinkhole on Gordon Street which was caused by the aged sewer system. In a CBS New York news article, the City Engineer City Jeff Rauch is quoted to shed light on the Gordon Street sinkhole. "We have an old brick sewer, it's a single layer of individual bricks that forms the pipe and it collapsed," he said. The CBS New York article further states that he had seen it before, "Not as large as this, but we've had sinkholes develop, small ones and we were able to

catch it before it got worse," he told CBS2's Tara Jakeway.

In addition to the sinkhole, residents received water violation notices where a contaminant called TTHM exceeded the maximum contaminant level in

their drinking water. This level is set by the US EPA and the NJDEP for public safety. "The Mayor's business administrator has chosen to call our water quality concerns a "political stunt"," Hubberman said. "Water is an integral part to human life and it is an important issue that our residents care about. As concerned residents, we initiated the Recall of Mayor Wilda Diaz because we need to do our best to put the City of Perth Amboy Residents First. The council has been more responsive to our concerns, and now they may need to be preoccupied with a lawsuit against them," she said.

The recall committee is still collecting petition signatures for the recall of the mayor; you can visit the recall team's Facebook page called Recall Mayor Wilda Diaz for more information. The recall team will be at various locations collecting signatures from Perth Amboy residents, please visit the facebook page or call 732-800-2017



Credit Reports will Be Available in Spanish And Other Languages Under New Law Sponsored by Lopez, Holley and Schaer

NEW JERSEY - To ensure non-English speaking residents in New Jersey are able to access and understand their credit reports, legislation sponsored by Assemblywoman Yvonne Lopez and Assemblymen Jamel Holley and Gary Schaer to require consumer reporting agencies to make credit reports available in Spanish and other languages was signed into law Friday by Governor Phil Murphy.

"Most credit reporting agencies provide reports in English only," said Lopez (D-Middlesex). "This makes it more difficult for people who speak primarily Spanish or another language to assess their credit reports and see if they are accurate. With nearly one third of New Jersey residents speaking languages other than English at home, credit reporting agencies must make sure they can accommodate all consumers."

The new law (formerly A-5055) requires that information subject to disclosure pursuant to the current credit reporting law be made available to consumers upon request in Spanish and any other language determined by the Director of the Division of Consumer Affairs to be the first language of a significant number of consumers in the state. This determination is to be, at the discretion of the director, based on the numerical percentages of all consumers in the state for whom English or Spanish is not a first language or in a manner consistent with any regulations promulgated by the director for this purpose.

Under the law, the director shall require that consumer reporting information is made available in at least the 10 languages other than English and Spanish that are most frequently

spoken as a first language by New Jersey consumers. A consumer reporting agency that compiles and maintains files on consumers on a nationwide basis must provide notice of reporting services in other languages on their website in a clear and conspicuous location, and in any language as determined by the director.

"It's so important for everyone to keep track of their credit history," said Holley (D-Union) "This law will lift a barrier for non-English speaking New Jerseyans who would otherwise have to seek out a translator to review their reports. The process would be far more simple and accessible to all, just as it should be."

"Navigating a credit report can be challenging enough without an added language barrier," said Schaer (D-Bergen, Passiac). "It's only fair that credit reports are available and accessible in multiple languages so as to not disadvantage those whose primary language is not English."

The measure passed the Assembly in May by a vote of 65-7, and the Senate in March,



To Our Clients and Friends:

It's hard to believe that about 18 months have passed since President Trump signed into law the Tax Cuts and Jobs Act (TCJA)-the largest major tax reform in over three decades. As the IRS continues to release guidance on the new law, we discover tax planning opportunities that could put more cash in your pocket. Some of these opportunities may apply to you, some to family members, and others to your business. Here are some ideas to evaluate this summer while you have time to think.

Individual Income Tax Opportunities

Here are some strategies that may lower your individual income tax bill for 2019:

- Consider Adjusting Your Tax Withholding or Estimated Payments. If you owed taxes for 2018, you may want to decrease the number of allowances claimed on Form W-4. To help determine the number of allowances you should report, consider using the IRS's "Withholding Calculator" available at www.irs.gov. Also, if you pay estimated tax payments throughout the year (you're self-employed, for example), we can take a closer look at your tax situation for 2019 to make sure you're not underpaying or overpaying.
- Pay Attention to Filing Status. If one spouse has substantial unreimbursed medical expenses, he or she may pay less tax by choosing a "married filing separately" status (assuming deductions are itemized by both spouses on their respective returns). That's because for 2019, only medical expenses that exceed 10% of adjusted gross income are deductible. By filing separately, the spouse generally lowers his or her adjusted gross income, which allows a larger deduction for medical expenses.
- Take Advantage of Lower Tax Rates on Investment Income. Income from an investment held for more than one year is generally taxed at preferential capital gains rates. Those rates are 0%, 15%, and 20% for most investments. The rate that applies is determined by your taxable income. If possible, you should get your income low enough to qualify for the 0% rate. If your income is too high to benefit from the 0% rate, try gifting investments (like appreciated stock or mutual fund shares) to children, grandchildren, or other loved ones. Chances are these individuals will be in the 0% or 15% capital gains tax bracket. If they later sell the investments, any gain will be taxed at the lower rates. as long as you and your loved one owned the investments for more than one year. However, beware of the "kiddie tax," which applies to all children under age 18 and most children age 18 or age 19-23 who are full-time students. It may limit your opportunity to take advantage of this strategy.
- Find Ways to Defer Income. If you expect to be in the same or lower tax bracket in 2020, it might be beneficial to defer some taxable income until next year. For example, if you own a business and use the cash method of accounting, you can wait until the end of the year to send out some client invoices. That way, you won't receive payments until early 2020. Also, you can postpone taxable income by accelerating some deductible expenses this year.
- Invest in a Qualified Small Business Corporation. A Qualified Small Business Corporation (QSBC) is generally a domestic C corporation whose assets don't exceed \$50 million. In addition. 80% or more of the corporation's assets must be used in the active conduct of a qualified business By far the biggest benefit of owning QSBC stock is the ability to shelter 100% of the gain from a stock sale. Another major benefit is the ability to roll over (defer) the gain on a stock sale to the extent you acquire replacement QSBC stock within 60 days of the original sale.
- Invest in a Qualified Opportunity Fund. Qualified Opportunity Funds (QOFs) are entities that invest in certain low-income communities (known as qualified opportunity zones). There are two major tax benefits of investing in qualified opportunity zones. The first one is an election to temporarily defer gain from the sale of property if such gain is reinvested in a QOF. The second benefit is an election to permanently exclude from income post-acquisition capital gains on the disposition of QOF investments held for ten years.
- Re-evaluate Your Deduction Strategy. It's best to itemize your deductions if you have significant personal expenses. However, don't rule out the standard deduction. For 2019, joint filers can enjoy a standard deduction of \$24,400. The standard deduction for heads of household is \$18,350, and single taxpayers (including married taxpayers filing separately) can claim a standard deduction of \$12,200. If you're able to itemize, please note that the TCJA suspended or limited many of the itemized deductions. However, we have some planning techniques that may help.
- Set up a Qualified Tuition Plan. Qualified Tuition Plans (QTPs) generally allow parents and grandparents to set up college savings accounts for children and grandchildren before they reach college age. Once established, QTPs qualify for favorable federal (and often state) tax benefits, which can ease the financial burden of paying for college. QTPs may be particularly attractive to higher-income parents and grandparents because there are no income-based limits on who can contribute to these plans.

Planning for Small Businesses

If you own a business, consider the following strategies to minimize your tax bill for 2019.

- Maximize Your Qualified Business Income Deduction. Thanks to the TCJA, business owners may deduct up to 20% of their qualified business income from sole proprietorships and pass-through entities (such as partnerships, LLCs, and S corporations). The deduction, however, is subject to various rules and limitations based on your taxable income, the type of business you operate, and your business's W-2 wages and property. The good news is that there are certain planning strategies that can be considered now to maximize your deduction.
- Acquire Assets. Your business may be able to take advantage of very generous Section 179 deduction rules. Under these rules, businesses can elect to write off the entire cost of qualifying property rather than recovering it through depreciation. The maximum amount that can be expensed for 2019 is \$1.02 million. This amount is reduced (but not below zero) by the amount by which the cost of qualifying property exceeds \$2.55 million. Above and beyond that, the TCJA established a 100% first-year deduction for qualified property acquired and placed in service after 9/27/17 and before 1/1/23 (1/1/24 for certain property with longer production periods). Unlike under prior law, this provision applies to new and used property.
- Employ Your Kid. If you're self-employed, you might want to consider hiring your child as an employee. Doing so shifts income from you to your child, who normally is in a lower tax bracket or may avoid tax entirely due to the standard deduction. There also can be payroll tax savings since wages paid by sole proprietors to their children age 17 and younger are exempt from Social Security, Medicare, and federal unemployment taxes. Employing your children has the added benefit of providing them with earned income, which enables them to contribute to an IRA.

World War II - 75 Years Ago

Florence, Italy, is liberated by South African troops on August 4, 1944. Before leaving, however, the Germans destroy some historically important buildings and bridges per orders of der Führer. In England, RAF Flying Officer T. D. Dean becomes the first pilot to destroy a V-1 flying bomb by "tipping" it. Piloting a Gloster Meteor jet fighter, Dean attempts to shoot the rocket down, the standard defense against the so-called "doodlebugs." However, his guns fail, so he goes into a dive to match the missile's speed, then uses his own plane's wing to tip the V-1's wing downward, sending it off course and crashing to the ground. In the Netherlands, the Gestapo, acting on information from a Dutch informer, raids an Amsterdam house, finding a hidden, sealed-off section. There they find and arrest 15-year-old Jewish diarist Annelies "Anne" Frank and her family, who are deported to concentration camps.

The Polish Home Army (Armia Krajowa) on August 5 goes on the defensive in Warsaw, as 60% of the city is now in its control. Among its activities is the liberation of a German labor camp: 348 Jewish prisoners are freed. In Australia, over 1,100 Japanese prisoners of war attempt a mass breakout from a prison camp at Cowra, New South Wales, west of Sydney. The casualties: 231 prisoners and four guards killed, and 108 prisoners wounded. Escaped prisoners who are not killed by other prisoners or who do not commit suicide are rounded up and returned to captivity within 10 days. No Australian civilians are harmed.

The German Rahmel aircraft factory near Gdynia, in Poland, is attacked by Allied bombers on August 6. The U.S. Third Army, commanded by Lt. Gen. George S. Patton, advances in Brittany, France.

The Red Army on August 7 advances into the foothills of the Carpathian Mountains, near the Slovak, Hungarian and Russian borders. On Guam, there is heavy fighting along the entire front as American forces attack Japanese positions.

The U.S. XV Army Corps occupies Le Mans, France, on August 8. In Germany, some of the participants in the "July 20 Plot" to assassinate Hitler are hanged — with wire nooses. Reprisals continue against their families. Investigations continue, attempting to identify other conspirators. In Warsaw, the Polish Home Army has control of most of the city and has captured significant quantities of German weapons and equipment. From Berlin, SS Lt. Gen. Erich von dem Bach-Zalewski is named to command German forces assigned to put down the uprising. Over the next three days, over 30,000 civilians — insurgents or not — will be killed.

In France, the Canadian II Corps (part of Canadian First Army) continues attacking along the Caen-Falaise road on August 9. The German attacks around Mortain continue to be held up by forces of the U.S. First Army. Meanwhile, the U.S. XV Corps (part of the U.S. Third Army) turns northward from Le Mans. In the U.S., the Forest Service and the Wartime Advertising Council release the first posters featuring the image of Smokey Bear, in jeans and a campaign hat, urging citizens to prevent forest fires.

Guam, in the Mariana Islands, is declared secured by American forces on August 10. All the major Mariana Islands are now controlled by the Allies; they will be used as naval and air bases for attacks against the Japanese homeland. In Paris, a wildcat strike by railroad workers disrupts German troop movements.

The Soviets on August 11, 1944, renew their offensive towards the Estonian border at Pskov. The Warsaw Uprising continues, but the Red Army remains across the Vistula River, apparently uninterested in aiding its supposed allies against the Germans. The Germans assault the old town area of Warsaw from three sides. In France, elements of Patton's U.S. Third Army cross the Loire River. Japanese troops begin retreating from India on August 12. In Italy, elements of the U.S. Fifth Army enter Florence.

On August 13, U.S. Third Army troops capture Argentan, France, and advance on Chartres and Orleans from Le Mans. Nantes, at the mouth of the Loire River is also captured. In New York, "The Jackie Gleason Show," featuring the up-and-coming, Brooklyn-born comedian, makes its debut on NBC Radio.

Franklin Roosevelt and Winston Churchill meet on August 14 at Quebec, Canada, where they endorse the so-called Morganthau Plan that calls for the division of Germany after the war, and its conversion to a purely agricultural country. In Europe, 28 RAF bombers fly supplies from Italy to Warsaw for the Polish Home Army, which is still getting no assistance from the Red Army across the river. Only 11 planes make it through and drop only five tons of goods.

"Operation Dragoon" begins on August 15, the Allied amphibious invasion of the south of France along the Riviera, between Cannes and Toulon. Originally to occur simultaneously with Operation Overlord on June 6, the operation was scrapped due to a lack of available resources. (Churchill also felt that it would be a drain on Allied efforts in Italy.) Now, with ports in Normandy and elsewhere in western France clogged, making delivery of supplies to the advancing Allies difficult, the operation gets the green light. In Normandy, British forces enter the town of Tinchebray, trapping large numbers of Germans between the British and the Canadians to their north and the Americans to their south. The Germans begin a furious drive to the east to escape.

The Red Army, sitting east of the Vistula River, finally begins to move towards Warsaw, Poland, on August 16. The (Free) French II Corps, part of the U.S. Seventh Army, comes ashore in southern France. In Asia, Japanese resistance in northeast India comes to an end.

In Normandy, the Canadian First Army captures Falaise on August 17 while, in Brittany, the German defenders of the citadel at Saint-Malo surrender to the U.S. Third Army. Farther east, the Soviets cross the border into East Prussia from Lithuania. It is the first area of pre-war Germany reached by the Allies.


