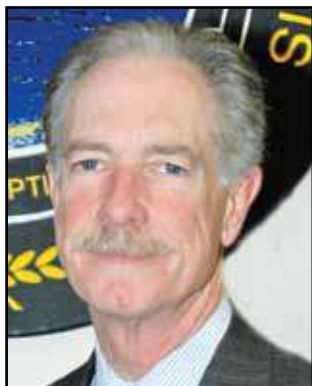

Balut Defends Fehrenbach and Blunda at 3/28 Perth Amboy Council Meeting

PERTH AMBOY - "You should see the piles of unopened mail and shredded paper and we are still paying bills from the year 2000. If I could have 1% of what was shredded when we came into office in 2008 we could probably find more evidence of wrong-doings to recover money owed to the City." These were some of the remarks made by Council President Ken Balut at the 3/26 and 3/28 Caucus and Council Meetings. Balut also said he calls the Department of Community Affairs or the Attorney General's Office at least once a week to ask them to continue to investigate money that was stolen from the City. Balut was responding to critics who turned a blind eye to what this present administration is being faced with. There was gross mismanagement from the Vas administration that we are still paying for. "Business Administrator

Greg Fehrenbach and Attorney Mark Blunda are worth every cent that we have paid them," stated Balut. "They have saved the City a lot of money by uncovering a lot of the misappropriation of funding and they are taking the brunt of most of the criticism."

When Fernando Gonzalez made the statement that "We have the highest paid Mayor and Business Administrator in Middlesex County." Is when Council President Balut defended Fehrenbach and Blunda.

There was more friction at the meeting when Councilman Fernando Gonzalez commented about the budget not being fair to the citizens of Perth Amboy.

Fernando Gonzalez stated, "We are the highest taxed municipality in Middlesex County." He then went on to say, "We should lower taxes - not just stabilize them. In the year 2011 six neighbor-

hoods got an average of about \$1200 in reduction for their property taxes. In 2012 other neighborhoods received about \$900 in property tax reductions and I believe that all properties should have been adjusted at the same time."

"I am shocked about Mr. Fernando Gonzalez comments," stated Councilman Joel Pabon. Pabon especially was taken aback when Fernando G. said he made about fifteen suggested budget cuts that were overlooked. Pabon responded, "I disagree with you."

Councilman William Petrick said he would be happy to request that a resolution be drawn up asking \$250 million in aid from the governor's office. This was in response to resident Stanley Sierakowski's comments about why Perth Amboy only requested \$2 million in transitional aid.

SOUTH AMBOY - After a high volume of questions about the lighting situation in South Amboy, the city council had a representative from Jersey Central Power and Lighting speak at last week's meeting.

Gerald Ricciardi spoke during a special presentation at South Amboy City Hall that updated residents on the progress being made around town. He noted the hard work that was being done to fix the lighting problems and what other improvements were being made.

"As of today, I have zero repair orders for the streets of South Amboy," Ricciardi said. "We have line crews that work twenty-four hours a day, seven days a week that work to fix the street lights as soon as possible."

Ricciardi made it clear that he is always open to answer questions that residents may have about the lights in South Amboy. He urged the council to give out his contact information so he could help in any way he could.

"I'm the guy you come to about any questions about Jersey Central. Whatever you need answered, I'll take care of it," he said. "I've left my business card with the council.

They can get you my information and I will gladly speak to anyone with questions or concerns."

Ricciardi also went over the future plans for lighting in the area, including new poles that will be installed in the next month or so. There will be four lights placed near the YMCA and a new 200-watt light placed near the firehouse.

Although not many residents made it to the meeting on Wednesday, those in attendance appreciated someone from the company coming down to speak. Vince Mackiel's concerns about the street lights out in town were addressed and he was thankful for Ricciardi's update.

"I'd just like to mention that there were representatives of the city, not just police, at recent meetings that were worried about this lighting problem," Mackiel said. "I appreciate you doing whatever you can do improve the safety in the area."

There have been a number of complaints from residents over the past few months on the street and traffic lights in the area being faulty, and it was addressed by Business Administrator Camille Tooker that over 57 lights were out or faulty in the area at the same time. Mayor Fred Henry

There was also a conflict between the other Council Members and Fernando Gonzalez when it came to the matter of reinstating into the budget the amount of \$2000 for the auxiliary police. The Council also wished to add \$2400 to a new program called “Sisters Under Sail.” Bill Petrick moved this amendment and Ken Gonzalez seconded the motion. F. Gonzalez was the only Council Member who voted “no” on this matter.

The \$2000 that was taken out of the line item for auxiliary police was done so because there was surplus money left over from the previous year for that entity. Petrick asked that for this \$2000 to be reinstated because each year has different needs. He alluded to the fact that we will be having extra activities this year that were eliminated previously. The \$2000 for the auxiliary police will be needed when these events take place again.

PERTH AMBOY - Local businessman and Perth Amboy Resident David Caba also spoke about changing the form of government in the City. He specifically addressed Councilman Petrick about this matter. He looked at Petrick directly and said to him, “Where were you when I and local resident Alan Silber and the late Richard Piatkowski were here complaining about Vas. If we had a different voting system we would not have disagreements about what neighborhoods would get tax reductions.” Then Caba directed his next comments to F. Gonzalez, “Your health benefits should have been voted on by the Citizens. Anyone who thinks about themselves will not go anywhere.” With that said Caba turned his thoughts to the investment firm of Goldman-Sachs.

Recently an executive from that firm resigned with a guilty conscience bothering him. Behind closed doors the Goldman-Sachs Executives would talk about their clients in a very disrespectful manner. “We need to change our form of government to encourage our young people. We have several candidates running for mayor and it’s easy to run when you have a clean house.”

PERTH AMBOY - Councilman Kenneth Gonzalez questioned B.A. Greg Fehrenbach to be more specific in explaining the new anti-nepotism policy.

The B.A. explained that it would basically affect non competitive summer, seasonal, per diem, clerks or laborers. “There are three tiers: 1.) If you have candidates that are equally qualified but not related to a current employee. 2.) Residents that are related to current employees. 3.) Non-residents.

They all refer to nonclassified or non-competitive positions.

Ken Gonzalez asked specifically about cases where you have those who want to be in the fire and police department that are following in a family tradition to be of service to their community. “For instance if there is a father who is a fireman and the son also wanted to be a firefighter would the son be at a disadvantage if the father is already employed?”

Fehrenbach said, “This policy will not pertain to those departments”

The New High School:
Where Should It Be?

This has been one hot topic that has been going on for years. The present High School located on Eagle Avenue has been overcrowded for a very long time and the only solution is to have a new High School.

There have been two locations that have been talked about for building a new school: one would be the Delaney Homes on Convery Boulevard which recently had twenty of the twenty-nine buildings demolished. Some of the ideas that were tossed around for that vacant land were businesses located there with residential apartments on top.

The Celotex Property which is located on the intersections of Convery Boulevard and Smith Street is the other site. There have been back and forth discussions as to whether or not the Celotex Property is contaminated and if there are contaminants how severe is the problem? The Celotex Property has also been very controversial because of an archeological dig that was supposed to take place last year. Also that property is privately owned and the property owner has expressed interest in the archeological aspect of the site.

School Board Member Israel Varela is very gung-ho about the High School being built at the Celotex Property. There are 75 acres of Celotex Property and it should be probed to see what part of that land can be used for a school.

Others have expressed an interest in Delaney Homes Property. Councilman Fernando Gonzalez who is also a Commissioner of the Housing Authority states that there is still a possibility that the Authority can sell some of the Delaney Homes Property to the Board of Education to build a High School. The Delaney Homes is owned by the Federal Government and that

is one sticking point to having a new High School built there.

In about 90 days from 3/28/12 the Housing Authority may be willing to discuss selling that property to the Board of Education. Fernando Gonzalez said that Executive Director of the Housing Authority Doug Dzema should be in on discussions about the High School being built on the Delaney Homes Property. He invited the public to attend all Housing Authority Meetings.

Jeanette Gonzalez who is the parent liaison to the PTO has a petition circulating and a letter of support to be forwarded to the SDA (Schools Development Authority). This is to make them aware that the whole town is behind Perth Amboy getting a new high school. She also stated that there is a six month time line where the SDA to have shovels in the ground if this is to go forward.

At the Board of Education Meeting 3/29/12 local resident Stanley Sierakowski told those in attendance, "They should put in an OPRA (Open Public Records Act) request to the Department of EPA in regards to the Celotex Property. All you have to do is fill out the information what the lot and block number is. Once you have that information, submit the form to the EPA and ask for the latest data on the Celotex Property (in regards to any contaminants)."

At previous School Board Meetings speakers have told the Board Members that a new High School had been discussed when their children were freshmen in high school. Now those freshmen are sophomores in college. In those six years nothing has been done about a High School.

In the meantime Perth Amboy's student population has continued to grow. When a

Tax Appeals
Fair Game!

I read with interest Ms. Maria Garcia's comments regarding Mr. Joseph B. Vas's tax appeal work with the local community. The article was titled "outrageous" and it was printed in the last community section of the Amboy Guardian. Ms. Garcia seems to be very critical of Mr. Vas (son of the former Mayor Vas) for doing nothing more than work as an attorney to make a living. Mr. Joseph B. Vas is an attorney and works on tax appeals. Generally, homeowners file their tax appeals on their own or can choose to have an attorney in the process.

Those who do choose their attorneys from advertisements, prior experiences or even word of mouth. Mr. Vas's tax appeal advertisements are allowed under the First Amendment of the Constitution. There is nothing wrong with advertising, our Supreme Court has decided, and there are beneficiaries to that particular art, such as the Amboy Guardian itself. Ms. Garcia indicates that she was inspired to write about it because she finds Mr. Vas's letters misleading. She seems to find troubling that Mr. Vas's is the son of the former mayor, the fact that Mr. Vas states in his letters that his services are free, the lack of notice in the letters that revaluation of the property was conducted when his father was mayor and various other conclusions that she seems to derive from her own rather faulty analysis, like Mr. Vas should work for free. It seems obvious that despite all of these concerns the top issue is the relation between Mr. Vas

and the former Mayor Joseph Vas. It is rather unfortunate that people could be targeted for criticism when all they are doing is simply working only because they are related to someone who may have had a history in the past. It should not be. Mr. Vas's letter clearly states that he charges a contingency fee for his services and that is totally proper to do. Lawyers work on contingency fees in many areas, personal injury, for instance, and have done so for many years. Of all the tax appeal solicitation letters received by Perth Amboy taxpayers, such as myself, not one of them so much as mentions when properties were reassessed in Perth Amboy or under whose administration. None of these letters were mentioned by Ms. Garcia or called "misleading." Why then is Mr. Vas being singled out?

Incidentally, municipalities are supposed to reevaluate properties from time to time to ensure that properties are taxed based on a "full and fair" value. Revaluations may be needed when properties in a municipality are "not being assessed at the same rate of true market value and/or are being assessed substantially below true market value." If a revaluation has not taken place for 10 or more years, one may be needed. That was the case in Perth Amboy in 2006. At the time, property values were only assessed at a fraction of value and as a result assessments were not likely based on a fair or accurate market value. The reevaluation is not the reason for properties being over assessed, instead, it is a reflection of the housing crisis that hunts the

entire country. No one, not even the former mayor could have possibly suspected the bottom would fall out from the housing market as it did and when it did.

That's why residential taxpayers and corporate ones alike are filing appeals. Corporate taxpayers like Chevron and Westminster have received sizeable reductions. This fact, which was pointed out in Mr. Vas's letter of advertisement, was not only accurate but also documents the market differences from 2006 to 2012.

Many legal matters can be handled without an attorney but everyone has a right to seek counsel. Mr. Vas's letter neither states nor implies that you have to have an attorney to proceed with a tax appeal.

The fact remains that, for many people, proceeding on their own may not be an option, while for others it may be the best option. I find nothing misleading or outrageous about Mr. Vas's letters. What is outrageous is that someone finds the need to project their own obvious personal anger towards former Mayor Joseph Vas onto his son.

It's a shame that he be criticized for the name he bears and not for the merits of his conduct. Joseph B. Vas has the rights to free speech, to work as an attorney in New Jersey where he has earned a degree and most especially in the town where he was born and raised. Ms. Garcia's personal attacks are the only outrageous things here.
