## Fire Chief Volk Answers Resident Siberry's Concerns - Caucus 9/24/12

PERTH AMBOY - Resident John Siberry appeared before the council in regards to the new radio communications system put in place by the Fire Department which he thought was not as reliable as the old system.

He felt this put the residents in danger. Volk responded, "The new system was put in place August 1, 2012 but I do not see it as a danger to the citizens. We have worked on the problems with the radios for 2 months and I have talked different personnel in respect to this situation. Some problems had to do with operator errors. We have other systems in place in case the trunk system fails. Woodbridge has used the system that we are using now for 2 years. Woodbridge has the backbone of the trunk system which has enhanced the Perth Amboy System. South Amboy and Sayreville can communicate with the department. Audible signals will let you know if you have lost communications and to change your channels."

Business Administrator Greg Fehrenbach said in 2008,

Woodbridge, Perth Amboy, South Amboy there was a study between shared services between the towns. Woodbridge picked up the cost of the study. Woodbridge replaced all of their radios and all antennas which gave Perth Amboy 90% coverage. South Amboy was also covered. Fehrenbach continued that, "In 2010 Volk and Lt. Cattano also in charge of Emergency Management reviewed changing frequencies and teaming with Woodbridge on their trunk system. Motorola got the contract to replace all radios and this was

completed in late August, early September of this year."

Councilman Bill Petrick wanted to know if the City could change back to the old system in case of an emergency.

Volk replied, "The FCC (Federal Communications Commission) gave us the band of frequencies and the original frequency is still in place. The department is keeping track of where there are dead spots. Motorola is being notified of them. Presently we have 98% coverage."

## Judge Jose Cameron Will Not Be On The Ballot

### Filing Petition Requirements Not Met

PERTH AMBOY - A week and a half ago, the New Jersey Superior Court had restrained the Perth Amboy Municipal Clerk and the Middlesex County Clerk from printing and distributing mail-in ballots.

The reason for this was so the court could hold a full hearing to determine the reasons why the Perth Amboy Clerk excluded Cameron from the ballot.

Judge Jose Cameron had brought a suit in Middlesex County Superior Court so he could be included in the ballot

for the November 6, 2012 election for Perth Amboy Mayor. (Jose Cameron vs. Elaine M. Jasko et. al. Docket No.: MID-L - 6265-12).

Cameron was able to appeal this decision to the Appellate division of the Superior Court.

Cameron's motion was denied by Judges Ellen L. Koblit and Marie P. Simonelli on Friday, October 5, 2012.

New ballots with Cameron's name on it do not have to be mailed out by the Middlesex County Clerk Elaine Flynn.

This information is based on the Appellate Division's deci-

## Residents Raise Environmental Questions; Mayor Henry Announces "Beach Sweeps"

SOUTH AMBOY - Mayor Fred Henry announced the 27th annual "Beach Sweeps" during last week's South Amboy council meeting.

Beach Sweeps is a program created in 1985 to clean up the beaches in New Jersey. Volunteers record each piece of debris they pick up on data cards, and that data is compiled into an annual report that provides evidence to reduce litter and educate the public about pollution.

South Amboy will be home to two separate "sweep sites" on October 20th from 9:00 AM to 12:30 PM, one being the Raritan Bay Waterfront Park and the other at the Fisherman's Parking Lot. Mayor Henry believed that this could start at the beaches and eventually lead to a citywide cleanup.

"Hopefully people will get involved and help keep our beaches clean, but I also want to expand this to the rest of the city," Henry said. "If you can't get down to the beach then maybe you can start cleaning around the front of your home and sidewalk. I hope people can show pride in their homes and city and help clean it up."

While on the topic, many residents had questions about the environmental cleanup of certain sites in South Amboy during the public session. George Forrer pointed out two locations near his home that needed immediate assistance.

"I agree with you Mayor about cleaning up, how about the Rosewell Market and the Wasp Terminal, the two biggest eyesores in town," Forrer said. "The Rosewell Market is boarded up with broken windows and weeds growing all over. If we do something to

clean it up it should be a help for my neighborhood at least."

Mayor Henry told Forrer that he would notify the code enforcer and send him down to inspect the area the next day. He also said that the owners of the property have been reminded to keep it clean in the past.

Vince Mackiel, who has fought for a better environment in South Amboy for years, believed bigger corporations like Shell should come in and assist with the cleanups with these properties. He believed that Shell Oil and the Wish properties, the name of the WASP Terminal, should do something to clean up the area.

"From consulting with a former environmental official, the city of South Amboy is the likely chief legal participant in the cleanup conflict," Mackiel said after the meeting. "It is my opinion that a company such as Shell, with billions in profit, can be brought in to join in the cleanup of the site."

Councilwoman Noble was not in attendance, but the rest of the council was present. The next South Amboy council meeting will be held on Wednesday, October 17th at 7:00 PM.

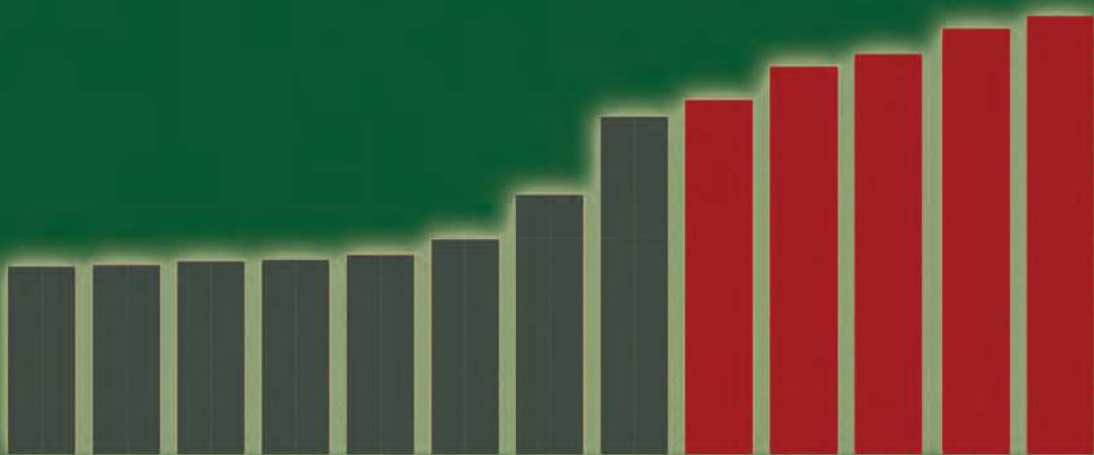

gotiations, and management experience. I am one of you, and I'm going to do everything possible to get the job done prudently."

Hubberman reinforced that growth does not come from developers, or transit plans but it comes from innovation. "What drives an economy are individuals like you who are full of ideas and innovation. I know that in Perth Amboy we have talented people...this is the future we need to focus on," Hubberman said.

The city's garbage problem is seen by Hubberman as a key potential revenue component. Her renewable energy initiative incorporates a practical approach to the city's needs: "Transforming municipal waste and biological waste to Renewable

Parvo, or CPV as it is more commonly known, is a highly contagious viral disease that is one of the most common causes of diarrhea in dogs and is now one of the most common serious dog disease problems encountered in animal shelters.

Dr. Faith Perrin, the shel-

ter's veterinarian, has instructed that the shelter be closed for two weeks so that animal control personnel can clean and disinfect the shelter property. The doctor will also start a vaccination protocol for the other dogs at the shelter starting next week.

The shelter will remain closed and no animals will be accepted until the cleaning process is completed. It is important to note that this virus is only harmful to dogs and not humans.

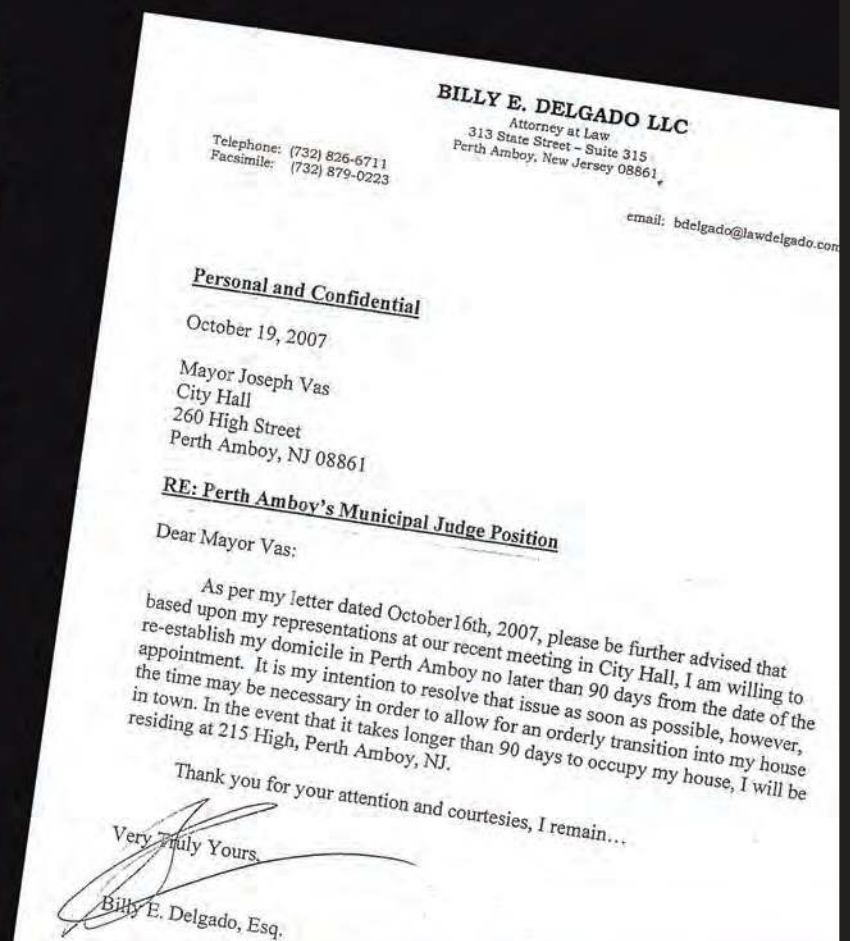

# Bait Shop Report

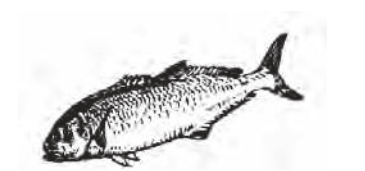

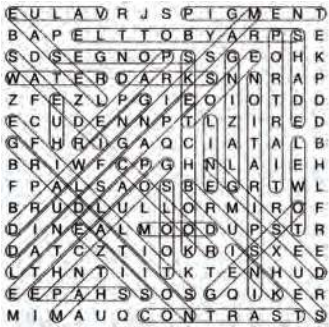
