

Joel Pabon Stands Alone

Votes "No" on Resolution-113-3 Opposing Both S2364 and A3553 (See Below)

PERTH AMBOY - Several residents spoke about bills passed by the Senate and Assembly which will allow New Jersey residents to vote early.

Local resident Stanley Sierakowski said that the State and County would pick up most of the cost associated with early voting. Sierakowski also wanted to know which Council Members asked to have this resolution put on the agenda.

City Clerk Elaine Jasko said that this was drafted as a pro-

posal by the League of Municipalities.

Resident Ricky Aviles urged the council to table R-113. "The states that have more progressive voting laws have a higher voter turnout. I don't mind paying more money for more democracy in voting. If you expand the voting time frame more people will come out. You should err on side of more voter participation - not less!"

Chairwoman Leslie Dominguez-Rodriguez agreed with Aviles, that this resolution should be tabled. "Let's see what's going on in other states. We have to educate voters on partisan and non-partisan elections. It's best if we table this resolution.

Council President Joel Pabon said, "The reason he voted no on R-113 is that he is in favor of early voting - anything to help increase the residents voter participation."

"Councilman Kenneth Gonzalez said, "We already have vote by mail which cuts down on voter fraud. Voting "Yes" also will save on the City's finances. The two bills will duplicate what is already in place."

After the resolution was passed with the "Yes" votes by Gonzalez, Petrick, Nanton and Irizarry, resident Ricky Aviles spoke again addressing Councilman Gonzalez first. "I appreciate that at least Mr. Gonzalez (although I didn't agree with him) that he gave a reason why he voted for R-113." Aviles also appreciated Council President Joel Pabon, "For you giving your reason for

voting "No." I would like to know from each of you (Council Members) the reasons you voted yes to this resolution."

Councilwoman Lisa Nanton said, "I didn't feel a need to explain, but it would cost the City, plus there would be a duplication of services."

Councilman Bill Petrick said, "He agreed with fellow Councilman Kenneth Gonzalez's explanation for voting "Yes" on R-113."

Leslie Dominguez-Rodriguez stated, "Votes by mail get lost and you also have the problem of change of addresses. Early voting will not cost Perth Amboy a dime."

Resolution Opposing S2364/A3553

WHEREAS, Senate Bill S-2364 and Assembly Bill A3553 propose to create a system of early voting in the State of New Jersey; and

WHEREAS, the goal of accommodating voters in pursuit of greater participation in the democratic process is a worthy goal; and

WHEREAS, these bills would in reality increase workloads, add more costs to the election process, and ultimately serve to confuse voters more than it would accommodate their needs; and

WHEREAS, these bills would require for each primary and general election a public facility, except a public school, located in each municipality in an area of a high concentration of population to be open

and available to registered extra costs and provide an voters starting 15 days before an election for early polling, possibly conflicting with if not pushing out other important uses for these buildings, causing inconvenience to residents; and

WHEREAS, these bills require retraining of poll workers and dramatically increased hours, as well as chain of custody requirements to protect the voting process, despite the fact that recruiting and training polls workers is already a difficult process; and

WHEREAS, these bills would increase costs to municipalities, including overtime pay for workers; and

WHEREAS, although these bills allow municipalities to request reimbursement for

appropriation, the appropriation does not outline a specific amount nor dedicated funding, only that which the State Treasurer and the Director of the Division of Budget and Accounting deem necessary, and they do not outline the procedure for a municipality whose reimbursement request is denied; and

WHEREAS, the opportunity for "Early Voting" already exists in the State of New Jersey through the Vote by Mail ballot process.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that governing body of the (insert name of municipality) in the County of (insert name of county) does hereby oppose S2364 and A3553; and

I knew Jack for the past fifteen years. He was a very intelligent and thoughtful person. Paul asked Jack to be his best man in our wedding since Jack was such good friends with Paul's brother, Dale Morris who had suffered a heart attack in 2002. The paramedics brought him back, but Dale suffered global brain damage and is in a nursing home. Jack was happy to be our best man.

During the wedding Jack sat for hor'devours with the bridal group. There was a monsoon that day. Jack sat down and water dripped from the ceiling of the Armory onto Jack's head. Jack moved his seat. Like in a bad cartoon, the water then dripped on his head in his new seat, and it stopped dripping in his old seat!

I gave one dance to Jack at the wedding. He seemed a bit awkward dancing, but I think he enjoyed himself.

Jack loved Halloween and liked to sit at the Cottage handing out candy to trick or treaters. Jack, of course would eat too much of the candy himself, then get sick.

Jack loved history, especially the history of Perth Amboy. In 2007 when Paul and I were writing Then and Now: Perth Amboy, Jack loaned Paul his photos, many of which were used in the book.

Jack had written a brief history of Perth Amboy for the Tercentennial of the City. I had used it as one of my sources in Stories From Perth Amboy. Jack always made certain of

detail and wanted everything to be perfect. I had asked him to help me with my book and he loaned me some books to help me with my research. He knew what books said what and which ones were the most accurate. He offered his insights on the earlier drafts. I gave the book to him to proofread, but by then his health wasn't the same and he wasn't up to it.

Jack also loved the Civil War and loved to go to Gettysburg. He also loved World War II history.

Jack, Paul & I went to see the Mets with him in 2005. I don't remember if the Mets won or lost that game, but I do remember we had a great time.

Jack came to Paul's 50th birthday party in 2007, but left early due to the death of a relative. Jack was a pallbearer when Paul's sister, Faith's husband, Miguel died.

He was an active member of the Kearny Cottage Historical Society, but in the last few years his health prevented him from attending many of the events but he always held a special place in his heart for the Cottage.

Jack had a lot of health problems and his health got worse in the past two years. He spent a lot of time indoors reading and he didn't go out too much anymore.

For me, when Paul's sister, Angel unexpectedly died of an aneurism in 2010, it was a wake-up call that God can call you any time, any place at

any age. Now that Jack died, it was a wake-up call that when you argue with people, regardless of who is right or wrong, you should make your peace. Paul's disagreement with Jack over who should get credit for who put the roof on the Cottage was not only ridiculous and stupid, but now the point is moot and the argument is over. I never held any ill will toward Jack, no matter what he said. Rest in peace, Jack.

My memories of Jack goes back over 40+ years when Jack was friends with my brother, Dale. To me, Jack was a substitute for my brother, Dale who took ill. Jack and I had a lot in common: history, old horror movies, The Prisoner Series with Patrick McGoohan.

Back in '96 I remember meeting Jack out taking pictures of the Blizzard. I remember Jack's fondness for Halloween and the fall. He used to come out to the Cottage and hand out candy.

He is going to be greatly missed. As much differences we had recently I never truthfully stopped thinking of him as a friend and as a brother. The only problem I had is that his life was cut short too soon. He was the one who got me back into the Cottage. Jack had a tendency of recruiting people into organizations such as the Odd Fellows, Kearny Cottage, the Historical Commission, etc. In a very funny way, Jack could see potential in individuals that could be benefit to these organizations.

Recently Jack and I had disagreements. It was apparent in the paper. It was a personal disagreement. To me, it didn't take away the good Jack has done for the City. Like with any family members you have disagreements, then move on. Jack will always be a friend and family in my thoughts. *P.W.*

I first became familiar with Jack when I worked with Bill George at the Amboy Beacon.







Consider Your Sleeping Habits During Daylight Savings Time

By: David Goldstein, MD PERTH AMBOY - We all lost an hour of sleep when daylight savings time began March 10; making it a good time to think about our sleeping habits. Just like any traits you are born with, the amount of sleep needed to optimally function may be different for you than for someone of the same age and gender. But, studies suggest that healthy adults have a sleep need of seven to eight hours every night, even more for adolescents at least nine hours every night.

Sleeping too little can not only inhibit your productivity and ability to remember and consolidate information, but also can also lead to serious health consequences and jeopardize your safety and the safety of those around you. In fact, short sleep duration is linked with increased risk of car accidents and greater likelihood of obesity, diabetes and heart disease. Psychiatric conditions including depression and substance abuse have also been linked to lack of

Recent studies have pointed to regular exercise to improve the amount of healthy sleep you get each night. Vigorous exercise is best, but even light exercise is better than no activity. Be sure to avoid exercise within 3 to 4 hours of bedtime, since this may disrupt sleep and check with your healthcare provider first to see if you are healthy enough for exercise. The following tips can also improve sleep:

- Create an environment that is conducive to sleep that is quiet, dark and cool with a comfortable mattress and pillows.
- Practice a relaxing bedtime ritual, like a warm bath or listening to calming music.
- Go to sleep and wake at the same time every day, and avoid spending more time in bed than needed.
- Use bright light to help manage your "body clock." Avoid bright light in the evening and expose yourself to sunlight in the morning.
- Use your bedroom only for sleep to strengthen the association between your bed and sleep. It may help to re-

move work materials, computers and televisions from your bedroom.

- · Save your worries for the daytime. If concerns come to mind, write them in a "worry book" so you can address those issues the next
- If you can't sleep, go into another room and do something relaxing until you feel tired.

However, if you are experiencing excessive daytime sleepiness, snoring or "stop breathing" episodes in your sleep, contact your healthcare provider for a sleep apnea screening.

Two Weeks Left To Register For Federal Disaster Assistance

TRENTON - Hurricane Sandy survivors who had storm-related damages in New Jersey have just two weeks left to register with the Federal Emergency Management Agency. Federal disaster assistance applications are due by Monday, April 1.

April 1 is also the deadline to return applications to the U.S. Small Business Administration for low-interest disaster loans, which is the primary source of federal funds for long-term rebuilding. Survivors can apply for an SBA disaster home or business loans by filling out an online application at Disaster-Loan.SBA.gov/ela.

Survivors who applied for federal disaster assistance are urged to stay in touch with FEMA and SBA. Applicants should notify FEMA and SBA of changes to their mailing addresses, phone numbers or email addresses.

Survivors can register online and check on the status of their applications at DisasterAssistance.gov, via smartphone or tablet at m.fema.gov. They also can call 800-621-3362

or TTY 800-462-7585. Those who use 711-Relay or Video Relay Services can call 800-621-3362. Recovery assistants remain available daily from 7 a.m. to 10 p.m.

There are nine disaster recovery centers open in Atlantic, Cape May, Hudson, Monmouth and Ocean counties. FEMA staff is available at the centers to provide clarification to letters, assist survivors with finding a temporary home if their primary residence was damaged or destroyed, check on the status of applications for assistance or refer survivors to other agencies that may provide additional help. Survivors can locate their nearest center by going to FEMA.gov/DRC.


