Public Advocate Needed? Water Spike Hike Questioned

PERTH AMBOY - Local Businessman Paul Daniel-czyk spoke at the 3/12/14 Council Meeting on behalf of his mother who lives in Perth Amboy. Danielczyk was concerned because his mother's water bill is usually between \$40 to \$60. The last bill was \$732. Her five gallon tank had been replaced by a 1.6 gallon tank.

"My mother is 89 years old. I called the B.A. who suggested she could be put on a payment plan. My mom who is very alert says she is not paying this bill. The plumber came and said there is nothing wrong with her toilet."

Danielczyk believes that there may be an electronic or billing error. B.A. Greg Fehrenbach said, "Two to three people looked at her meter and electronic logs are done for all readings. I don't know how often calibrations are done. The meter was even sent out for testing. An USAPA employee did a radio and visual on it. There's no evidence that the meter had false readings or tampering done. Mr. Danielczyk was concerned that there was no paperwork from the City. He would like the City to contact the plumber about this problem so we can have this bill resolved. The B.A. reported that Luis Perez Jimenez (Director of Operations at the at the USAPA (Utility Service Associates Perth Amboy) Middlesex Water Company)

called the plumber, but there was no solution."

Fehrenbach said, "Perez agreed that this resident's water bill had consistently been in the \$40 to \$60 range except in that one month where there was a large spike. Then it went back down."

Resident Alan Silber said that he knows this woman and she has never been late on her water bill. "For her bill to be that high, it would be as if she was filling three huge swimming pools. Like I said before, this town needs a Public Advocate. A Public Advocate would free up time for City Employees. Residents can contact that advocate when they are having a problem such as this woman with her water bill. He/she would be able to field questions from the residents, contact the necessary departments and report back to the residents a possible solution to their problems."

A Council Member asked Silber if he wanted the job.

Resident Stanley Sierakowski said there could be a simple solution to this high bill. "It could be a billing error. Was a decimal point put in the wrong place? Check it out."

Residents have complained about a large spike in their water bills at previous meetings.

Resident Dave Szilagyi suggested how you can test the water in your toilet tank for leakage by using food coloring. (You can Google it!)

By: Carolyn Maxwell & Katherine Massopust SOUTH AMBOY - Mayor Fred Henry gave his annual State of the City Address. It was held on Friday, March 14, 2014 at 12 Noon at the Charles A. Hoffman Senior Center located in the YMCA. The Mayor thanked all for taking time out from their busy day to attend. He acknowledged the City Council, Local and Middlesex County Representatives, City Employees and Department Heads, volunteers and community leaders. Henry gave an overview of some of the problems that the City has encountered in the past, what is now in place to correct some of these issues and plans for a promising economic growth.

He enlisted the help of Police Chief Darren Lavigne. Lavigne gave an overview of how

the Police Department has worked with the community, the Council and the Mayor for the betterment of the City. Lavigne said, "Without any cost to the City, some of our members attended a specialized training course at Texas A&M dealing with Homeland Security. We developed lasting relationships with police departments from other states who attended the course at the same time. This training was invaluable." Lavigne thanked NJ Transit for their assistance.

Mayor Henry acknowledged Councilman Mickey Gross for his work at the St. Patrick's Day Parade and said Gross will again head the City's plans with Perth Amboy for a joint 2014 fireworks scheduled for July 3. The fireworks were cancelled last year due to Superstorm Sandy. "We are now

in the first stages of planning the joint celebration. The cost to the cities will be the same as last time – none." The plan is for the fireworks to be paid for by private donations.

Henry spoke about two important anniversaries coming up: the 100th Anniversary of the Sadie Pope Dowdell Library, and the 125th Anniversary of the South Amboy Fire Department. Mayor Henry thanked both organizations for all of their years of service.

Mayor Henry continued his speech, stating that all the Firehouses, City Hall and the Police Department now have generators in case of another disaster such as Superstorm Sandy. Henry thanked JCP&L (Jersey City Power & Light) for donating the generators.

The First Responders now have a new rescue equipment truck where all their equipment is stored in one place. Congratulations were given to the South Amboy First Aid Squad who were number one in OEM (Office of Emergency Management) response.

Police Chief Darren Lavigne acknowledged the passing of Detective Daniel Kudelka and others who served in the Police Department. Besides his own department, he acknowledged the heads of the Fire Department and First Aid Squad for their service. Lavigne said, "There is a new communications system in place for the Police Department. It was Mayor Henry who initiated getting the NIXLE System in place. The NIXLE system is up and ready and free to the public. South Amboy Public TV (Channel 15) is also used as a community bulletin board."

The Chief also talked about how City Officials assisted during Superstorm Sandy. "Mayor Henry can be a tough taskmaster. I was with him 24/7 during the storm and afterward." Lavigne thanked the Department of Public Works who jumped through hoops during the storm. "I want to thank the current and former Council Members for listening to us and meeting our needs. They always have open ears. I thank B.A. Camille Tooker for her tireless work in the City." Lavigne then thanked, "My Number Two." Captain Matarangolo.

"As far as the concerns of our residents, some of our Detectives and Officers responded to and were successful in apprehending individuals dealing in illegal drug activity around the schools," Lavigne said.

"There was an armed robbery and one of our Officers along with the assistance of the Sayreville Police not only apprehended the suspect, but recovered illegal handguns and other paraphernalia that was in the vehicle," Lavigne





I'm Puzzled

People are elected sometimes by a large margin and sometimes they just squeak by. The bottom line is they are accountable to all the residents in the City no matter how big or small their margin of victory.

This is why I was puzzled at a recent Perth Amboy Council Meeting. A resident made a comment to a specific Council Member that they barely won their seat.

I didn't see that resident's point for making that statement. If you look on the City's website, each Council Member has their contact information listed. I didn't see an asterisk next to any of the Member's names stating their vote count.

For that matter, if a resident has a problem, I don't believe an resident would refrain from discussing a problem with any Council Member based on the number of votes that the individual received.

Our neighbor South Amboy despite having a much smaller population and square miles has a ward system. Depending on what section of town you live in, you are represented by one particular Council Member and they also have Council Members-at-Large.

Would this system work in Perth Amboy? Personally, I don't think there would be enough people interested in running in each ward. It wouldn't surprise me if people were elected by write-in votes based on the ward they are in. I talked to some residents who frequently speak at the Council Meetings. I suggested that they should run for office. I told them that they aren't afraid to speak their minds and are often approached by others to speak for them. Sometimes because they fear speaking in public, especially at Council Meetings. Plus the residents I urge to run often come to the meetings with statistics, articles and other information to backup what they are saying.

I remember when one of these residents I spoke to about run-

ning said that they already had a job and are too busy to be on the Council. Frankly, you are already doing the work! Need I remind you that some of the Council Members have full time jobs.

Another argument of theirs was that they were of the 'wrong ethnic persuasion' to win. All I can say is: I'm not buying that. If people see that you are a fighter, especially if they feel you are fighting for their cause, surprises can happen. Just remember, it is very difficult to be in the hot seat. Once you are an elected official, you can become target practice.

But there are definitely some things that you can control or bring more light to. You may have difference of opinions with your fellow Council Members. By talking things out, you may be able to persuade them to come around to your point of view.

There may be things that you want to change when it comes to how Municipal Board Members are appointed. Pay to Play could be better monitored if you were on board. Developers may think twice about promises they know would be impossible to keep and you could play hardball just as skillfully as they do.

I know all of this is hard work. If you show the same passion when you get up to speak at the Meetings, I am sure that you'll be more than up to the challenge.

A friend of mine called me and said he heard that nine people are running for Council this year. I told him, "I can't be concerned about that right now. What matters are not the number of people who say they are going to run, but who will qualify after their petitions are handed in? Then, let the games begin!" Are you in?

He cited other officers of the police department who successfully performed CPR to save a resident's life.

"South Amboy is a tight knit community. Every radio transmission is recorded and reviewed."

Lavigne spoke about recent burglaries of valuables left in parked cars. "The SAPD went on foot and worked with Councilwoman Zusette Dato handing out pamphlets. This is a message that we will not tolerate this kind of activity. But we need the cooperation of the public."

Mayor Henry took the floor again and listed all the new businesses that opened up downtown.

"The Venetian Health Care Center which is practically across from the Y is scheduled to open June 2014." He thanked Michael Jacobs, Vice-President of Windsor Health Care for bringing this multimillion dollar project and ratables into South Amboy."

Mayor Henry then gave an update on the Ferry Service returning to South Amboy.

"Phase I (the bridge) is done. Phase II (the road extension) is done. Phase III (the parking lot and terminal) – We are waiting to hear from the State."

Henry then thanked the Redevelopment Agency. "Many facets make up a community."

South Amboy Historical Society President Gerard Pizzillo also spoke. He gave an overview of the organization's activities and their mission statement. He urged the residents to come to their open house on Saturday, March 29 from 1 p.m. to 3 p.m at the Senior Center. "We want to pass our history to future generations." He mentioned historic events that took place in South Amboy which included the first railroad in New Jersey that took place in 1833 between Camden and South Amboy. He also mentioned the First Airmail Flight which was between South Amboy and Perth Amboy and took place on July 4, 1912.

Mayor Henry gave an update about Superstorm Sandy related repairs. "We've received two million from FEMA to overhaul the walkway on March 24."

The Mayor thanked the Mid-

dlesex Water Company who spent \$5 million in the Rehabilitation of the infrastructure of the water system in the City.

"The Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) will provide the community a means to fulfill a wide range of needs. In September 2014 we will begin the Curb and Sidewalk Repair Program." He was pleased to announce that the summer programs for the kids will continue as well as activities for Seniors that will be no cost to them.

Henry thanked City Clerk Kathy Vigilante and Linda Garnett from the Mayor's Office for their service. They will be leaving soon.

A moment of silence was held for City Employees who recently passed away.

Henry presented two bouquets of flowers: one to his mother and one to his wife thanking them for their sup-

Balut Questions Council About Waste of Money

There were outstanding pieces of litigation that the City could not take action on. Eddie Trujillo who is the sole member of Victory Center LLC made a payment of \$140,000 in back taxes."

Balut also questioned R-146: Introduction of CY 2014 Budget Public Hearings be held on 4/9/14. "This should be in the Mayor's budget, if it's for her security." Balut also took notice of the Police Officer at the Council Meeting. "We need them on the street - not here at City Hall. I don't think people attending meetings are threatening."
