Back on the Beat Bring Back Neighborhood Foot Patrols

PERTH AMBOY- Convery Boulevard Resident Arthur Brewton was looking out for Senior Citizens when addressing the Council at the 8/13/14 Meeting. Brewton stated, "I worked with a lot of Seniors," suggesting to the Council that there should be more of a Police presence. He said, "This could minimize the amount of loud music and drug activity taking place. Back in the day (when I was growing up) the cops used to walk the beat. I suggest they should go back to this. I don't see the presence of Auxiliary Police. The loud music coming from cars during the days and weekends frightens a lot of the Seniors."

Resident Angel Leon suggested that the noise ordinance also be translated into Spanish.

Landings Resident Christine Dispenziere was concerned about all the noise taking place on the Waterfront between the hours of 11 p.m. to 4 a.m. "The kids are all over the Waterfront during those hours. We need a Police Patrol there. The lights still haven't been replaced

since Superstorm Sandy."

Department of Public Works Director Frank Dann said, "The Landings Property Owners are responsible for the lights along their walkway."

Neville Street Resident Jane Herron still has complaints about large vehicles (trucks) and private ambulance services on her street. "These privately owned ambulances are not transporting emergency patients. There are no enforcements of laws that you (The Council) passes. My neighbors have not only complained about this to you, but to previous administrations. There are no crosswalks on Neville and Groom Streets and the law states that you have to have them."

Resident David Caba still complained about developers getting their money while residents pay high taxes. He also complained, "30 Police Officers have retired, but only 3 Officers were hired."

There was still a battle from residents from Mary Street which recently was made into a one-way street.

One resident said that her parents who have lived in Perth Amboy a for long time always thought that Mary Street should have been made one-way. She said she was happy about this, "On behalf of myself and family, I want to thank you (the Council) very much."

Another resident didn't mind Mary Street being made one-way, but was very unhappy to only have parking on one side of the street. "I have limited company and family coming over because of this lack of parking. People with driveways still have a lot of cars they park on the street. I can't park on the street myself sometimes."

Perth Amboy Democratic Chair Leslie Dominguez-Rodriguez complained about new property owners on Chamberlain Avenue. "Loud music is often played." She suggested that residents on Mary Street should be able to get residential parking stickers.

4 Police Officers Sworn In, 2 Promoted in South Amboy

By: Joseph L. Kuchie SOUTH AMBOY - South Amboy swore in four police officers and promoted two others to sergeant before last week's city council meeting.

Officers Jacob Murray and Daniel Holovacko were promoted to Sergeant after a combined 16 years of service with the South Amboy Police Department. They will fill the void left by Sgt. Glenn Malkiewicz and Sgt. Jamie Norek, who are retiring from the South Amboy Police Department.

Murray served in the United States Marine Corps. from 1999-2003 before making South Amboy his home in February 2003. He joined the police force in 2007 and has been crucial in implementing modern technology to the department including computer upgrades, in-vehicle computers and software, and automated license plate readers.

Holovacko joined the South Amboy Police Department in 2005 after working as a police officer with the Middlesex County College Police Department. He was elected by his peers to the executive officer of Secretary for the South Amboy PBA in 2009 and was assigned to the duties of Assistant TAC officer in May 2012.

Police Chief Darren Levine had kind words to say about each officer who was sworn in to their new position. He also praised the work of Sgt. Malkiewicz and Sgt. Norek and thanked them for their service to the city.

"We are losing two very fine officers...guys who dedicated many years to the city of South Amboy, chose to raise

their families here, and were really invested in the process here," Levine said. "I'm sorry to see both of them go but at the same time I'm happy for them and hope them nothing but God speed in their retirements."

South Amboy also welcomed officers Robert E. Besner, Jr., Alexander G. Miranda, Dane P. O'Grady, and An S. Wang to the police force. All four officers are veterans of the United States military and will start patrol in December or January.

"They really successfully achieved a rigorous testing process...not only did they pass the prerequisite civil service examination but a rigorous medical testing procedure as well as psychological testing," Levine said. "Each and every one of them has a unique set of skills and talent they are bringing to the table here and I'm extremely enthusiastic about this batch coming on board."

The entire council wished the all the officers sworn-in their very best. The next city council meeting will be held September 17th at 7:00 p.m.

Not Doing the Job

PERTH AMBOY - Some residents of Market Street had previously complained of flooded basements and still were not happy with the lack of response from the City and the Water Company.

Market Street Resident Miriam Quiles said that Rick Risoldi from Middlesex Water Company was not doing his job. She said, "If the backup of water in the basements of my neighborhood was caused by excessive storms that we had. It was an act of God, then why is it only happening in our area?" (Near Watson Avenue)

Business Administrator Jillian Barrick had remarked earlier about a flash flood that the sewer system could not sus-

City Attorney Mark Blunda suggested that the residents affected can file a claim but he couldn't guarantee that they could get any money. He said, "Each resident who had a flooded basement should check the valves in their basements to see if they may have failed."

Barrick also said, "The Netting Chambers were inspected by the Water Company. There were similar conditions at the catch basins that prevented water from going down and flooding occurred. We are developing a guide on how to prepare for flash floods."

Councilwoman Lisa Nanton said, "We have been trying to replace the infrastructure and at the same time we're trying to pay off the City's debt."

Councilman Kenny Gonzalez said, "Plumbers should inspect the flooded basements to make sure there are no valves that need to be replaced."



The Past Creeps Into the Present Here's Hoping for a Brighter Future

Under threatening skies on 8/23/14 the 2014 Ukrainian Independence Day was celebrated at a flag raising ceremony and program at City Hall, Perth Amboy.

Those who participated included from the Ukrainian Catholic Church of the Assumption included the Pastor, Rev. Ivan Turyk and Principal of Assumption Catholic School, Michael Szpyhulsky and President of the St. Ann's Society Melanie Fedynyshyn.

Mayor Wilda Diaz presented a proclamation to the Pastor.

The most poignant speeches were made by Melanie Fedynyshyn and Alexander Gologovski.

Fedynyshyn gave a brief history of how the Ukrainian nation came about and the hardships that it endured at the hands of the Communist Dictator Joseph Stalin. She spoke about the Ukrainian language and history. Many people want to have its history diminished, rewritten or written in what she called, "invisible ink."

She spoke about the famine in the early 1930's where between 6 to 9 million Ukrainian men, women and children were deliberately starved to death under the dictatorship of Joseph Stalin. At that time Ukrainians were dying at a rate of 30,000 people a day.

Food and grains were stolen from the homes of Ukrainian

farmers by Stalin's soldiers.

She also talked about Ukrainians who served under George Washington. Some of the last names included: Bizun, Lator, Rolyn and Zubley, among others.

Then she became very personal, talking about family members who served in Military and in the City of Perth Amboy. (See Page 11)

I personally (Carolyn) used to play in Rudyk Park quite often not realizing that it was named for the first Ukrainian American to give his life in World War II, Army PFC Stanley Rudyk. This is something that I learned from Melanie Fedynyshyn when she mentioned that in her speech.

Fedynyshyn talked about how the Ukrainians built up a



Could AFib Be Making Your Heart Race?

PERTH AMBOY - September is Atrial Fibrillation Awareness Month. If you or someone you know has ever said that it feels like their heart is racing, the culprit may be Atrial Fibrillation - also known as AFib or AF - an irregular heartbeat that affects more than 2.5 million U.S. adults and accounts for approximately one-third of hospitalizations for cardiac rhythm disturbances.

AFib is characterized by a rapid and irregular heartbeat caused when the top chambers of the heart (the atria) quiver (fibrillate) erratically, sometimes faster than 200 times per minute. The condition can have a significant negative impact on an individual's quality of life, causing heart palpitations, chronic fatigue, and debilitating pain.

AFib can also increase the

risk of stroke five-fold. As the world population ages, the prevalence of AFib is projected to increase. In fact, in the next 30 to 40 years, the number of people diagnosed with AFib in the U.S. is expected to more than double. Increased public awareness of AFib, including its symptoms, warning signs and available treatment options, is an important strategy to help control the damage caused by AFib.

Treatment for AFib depends on how often you have symptoms, how severe they are, and whether you already have heart disease. General treatment options include medicines, medical procedures, and lifestyle changes.

If you are wondering whether you are at risk for atrial fibrillation, or whether you might have it already, the best recommendation is to talk with your primary care physician or cardiologist. Your physician can help increase your knowledge about AFib, help improve your quality of life if you are living with AFib, and help you avoid an AFib-related stroke or other debilitating incident.





This year there are three important anniversaries regarding Perth Amboy's historic past.

City Hall is now 300 years old, as it was first constructed during 1714. Over the centuries the facade & roofline of our City Hall have changed along with a few additions. Initially, City Hall was the Middlesex County Court House. Therein, law cases were judged with some penalties being quite harsh. In a few matters colonial judges had the sheriff take the guilty party directly outside to the Market Square's stocks & whipping post, where the sentence would be carried out! City Hall also functioned as New Jersey's capitol building, where the Provincial Assembly, and later the State Assembly, voted on important issues of the day.

That brings us to another milestone, that is, the 225th anniversary of the signing of the Bill Of Rights. On November 20, 1789, the first ten amendments to the United States Constitution were ratified within City Hall. As we all know, the Bill Of Rights was the first document to guarantee our liberties & freedoms. And Perth Amboy has the honor to be the first place where it was signed!

Finally, we come to the Proprietary House, which was completed in 1764. This 250 year old structure was originally designed to be the Royal Governor's Mansion. It was here that Royal Governor William Franklin was arrested & removed during June of 1776. It has gone by many different names since then, e.g., the Government House, the Rattoone residence, the Brighton House, the Bruen homestead, and the Westminster. In addition to all of the rich history that occurred within the Proprietary House, it remains an architectural treasure. Here Federal & Georgian styles are tastefully combined in this very unique historic building.

So, in 2014 we have anniversaries dating back 225, 250, and 300 years! Without a doubt, our amazing history is one of many things that make Perth Amboy a very special place!



The Cost That Freedom Demands

PERTH AMBOY - Americans of Ukrainian ancestry
join with residents of Perth
Amboy and the surrounding
communities to acknowledge,
commemorate, and celebrate
the independence of Ukraine-the land of our heritage.

Ukraine has long known the cost that freedom demands. As a nation whose very name implies "borderland", we have heard the sound of the boots of invading armies. We have known manipulation by empire builders, treachery from false allies, and loss due to war and artificial famine. As a result, our people have developed a fierce desire for self-determination, personal God-given liberties, and equal justice. This aspiration for independence has prevented us from falling away.

The fact remains that Ukraine has its own language, history and culture---Ukraine is a nation. Many have tried to rewrite our history, even now, almost hoping to dissolve us or make us into a people whose history is written with invisible ink ---and we can never let that happen.

The land of our fathers is the 2nd largest country in Europe with a population of over 46 million, lying roughly between Poland and Russia, Some say that they love the colorful costumes, dancing, food, music, and rich Ukrai-

nian traditions, especially during the Holidays. When asked about what they know about Ukraine, some remember from school that Ukraine is known as the "Breadbasket of Europe." Very few know about our famine in the early 1930's, where between 6-million and 9-million Ukrainian men, women, and children were deliberately starved to death on orders by Communist dictator, Joseph Stalin. He was determined to "teach a lesson through famine" and liquidate the backbone of Ukrainian nation. There on that rich black earth that could yield such agricultural abundance, Stalin's soldiers swept through villages confiscating hidden grain and any and all food in the homes of Ukrainian farmers. At the height of the famine in 1932, it is estimated that the death rate was 30,000 a day. Stalin continued to export millions of tons of Ukrainian grain to other nations, including the U.S. Those who perished in the Great Famine, or Holodomor as we call it, died the slow and demoralizing death by hunger inflicted by the Soviet government--- a directive that has been all but ignored by history books. Is THIS not genocide?

A decade later, millions of Ukrainians suffered incredible hardships and death in the German slave labor camps of WW II. After the war, those who could find sponsors came to this country to start new lives, learn and speak the American language, and build churches and schools for their children and grandchildren. They all had stories, incredible stories of survival and hope, and a belief and love for these great United States. They knew the cost that freedom demands and they came to become Ukrainian Americans.

But history knows that Ukrainian Americans have long known the cost that freedom demands, for the archives show that they fought in the war for America's independence. General George Washington's register lists the names of Mykola Bizun, Ivan Lator, Petro Rolyn, and Stepan Zubley, among others. Likewise, Ukrainian immigrants served in the Union Army during the American Civil War, while their sons and daughters served in World War I. The Second World War saw thousands of Ukrainian Americans serve in the armed forces, and many from our own Perth Amboy served bravely, were injured, some captured, and some gave their lives. My late father in law, Army corporal John Fedynyshyn, took part in the invasion at Normandy. Although he survived the carnage of Omaha Beach, he was captured by the Germans and taken as a prisoner of war to one of their camps where he remained for the duration. He

demands. He went on to enjoy a full life and later became a lieutenant in the Perth Amboy Police Department.. My uncle, my father's only brother, Navy Lt. Peter Slahetka, served on the mine sweeper USS Montegomery, where he was killed in the South Pacific. He knew the cost that freedom demands. Another Ukrainian American and son of Perth Amboy, my cousin, Army Lieutenant Stephan Kosmyna was a recipient of the Silver Star as well as having received a battlefield commission for bravery under fire. A plaque to commemorate his accomplishments hangs in the Perth Amboy High School Hall of Fame together with others of Ukrainian ancestry. These are just three that have personal significance for me but there are many others whose stories can be told. And let us not forget that Perth Amboy's Rudyk Park, on State Street, was named for the first Ukrainian American to give his life in World War II, Army PFC Stanley Rudyk. All these men, as well as the men and women who served In Korea, Viet Nam, Iraq, and Afghanistan, as well as those who served in peace time have known the cost that freedom demands. Ukrainian Americans have

knew the cost that freedom

long loved and served the city of Perth Amboy, in the fields of law enforcement, educa-

tion, medicine, chemistry, pharmacy, history--- the list goes on. There is now even a bank, the Ukrainian National Federal Credit Union, standing proudly at the intersection of Amboy and Hall Avenues. A short distance away, beginning with our church on Alta Vista Place, our people have built an entire block in this city, driven by our desire to worship God, to assemble our people, and to educate our children. Our Assumption Catholic Church, rectory, school, and convent--all lovingly maintained with a sense of love and civic pride--contribute to what is good, unique, and beautiful about this city.

From the first wave of Ukrainian immigration in the early 1900's until today, we members of the Perth Amboy community with Ukrainian heritage have known how precious freedom is. As we stand today, near a replica of America's own liberty bell, we raise the standard of blue and yellow to fly next to the red, white and blue. May they both fly as symbols of virtuous patriotism, God -given personal rights, and equal justice. May the memory of the blood that was shed for America's freedom and the blood that continues to be shed for Ukraine keep us ever mindful of the cost that freedom demands.




