The Grill: Tag Teams 5/11/15 Caucus Meeting & 5/13/15 Council Meeting

Special Election coming up the following day, Residents Ken Balut, David Caba and Alan Silber put the Council on the spot.

Ken Balut was concerned about Woodbridge Attorney James Nolan who has been awarded City contracts. "Would this be considered Pay-to-Play? Did he get penalized? He was indicted for voter fraud," Balut said.

Caba was concerned about out-of-towners who contributed to candidates running for office in the City election. He compared this to a mafia money trail. He said, "There were a lot of out of town people working in the Diaz Campaign Headquarters. Were you (the Council) looking out for the interest of people in town or outsiders? Sergio Diaz was fired from an \$80,000 a year City job."

When Resident Alan Silber came up, he was beside himself. He talked about the Etan Patz trial in New York. (Etan Patz was a young boy from New York who was kidnapped in 1979 and disappeared. He is feared to be murdered. His body was never found. Pedro Hernandez was arrested after he confessed to the murder. He went on trial for the murder but was acquitted because one juror was not convinced Hernandez was not guilty because of lack of evidence.)

Silber looked straight at Council President Lisa Nanton, "Miss Nanton, you stated that Fernando Gonzalez had something to do with the election fraud, even after Superior Judge Currier found that neither candidates were involved in it. You (Nanton) knew what Geneske (Former Chair of Democratic Party) was doing. You, yourself were a Commiteewoman for 22 years. You

> Alan Silber asked Nanton if she had anything to say.

> Nanton turned to the City Attorney Mark Blunda and said, "I will ask him to respond."

Blunda had no response.

During the Council Comments, the Council Members answered some of their critics:

"To those who accuse me of not wanting the residents to say anything during the meetings - this is not true. I'm not saying that you can't say anything you want. But what you say sometimes is not beneficial to the City," stated Councilman Fernando Irizarry.

Councilman Joel Pabon said, "I didn't know a lot of the contributors and they shouldn't call me if they're looking for something from me. I am me, no matter how much money is given to me."

Councilman Bill Petrick said, "We are all approachable for all City Residents."

Council President Lisa Nanton said, "There was a lot of speculation here tonight. I am grateful for the Senators, Congressmen, Assemblymen that recognize how valuable this City is. Our Waterfront is valuable and so is our location to major highways. There was no way to verify those votes."

Petrick spoke again and said, "People complain about politicians when they show concern for our City, yet they will complain if these same politicians ignored our City. They should be happy that they are coming

Nanton concluded by saying, "You should ask the people who supported the opposition while they are now supporting

Fernando Gonzalez In; Sergio Diaz Concedes

PERTH AMBOY - 5/12/15 **Special Election Results:** Fernando Gonzalez:

Machine - 1273 Vote-By-Mail - 215 Provisionals - 40 Total 1528

Sergio Diaz:

Machine - 1298 Vote-By -Mail - 78 Provisionals - 30 Total 1406

Fernando Gonzalez is the victor by 122 votes.

Fernando Gonzalez will again be seated as a Councilman. On 3/25/15 he was removed based on the ruling of Superior Court Judge Heidi Currier calling for a new election between Fernando Gonzalez and Sergio Diaz. This ruling was based on what Currier determined was election fraud. This fraud did not involve either candidate.

At the 5/13/15 Council Meeting Fernando Gonzalez was still seated in the audience pending a new swearing in date.

Fernando Gonzalez' family and some of his supporters were in attendance and extended their well wishes and concerns about how the campaigns were conducted.

Residents came forward to speak about problems that have been lingering for a long time and new ones that have arisen.

Market Street Resident Gudelio Gonzalez Jr. came up to speak. You could plainly see that he was severely handicapped. He said he was a diabetic and had several operations because of diabetes plus other injuries. "Parking is very hard where I live. I was turned down for a handicap parking space. I have to pay for a cab to go to my doctor's appointments and it's especially hard in the winter time. Although I have a handicapped placard, I still get tickets. There is a church nearby and when they have services, they take up all the parking spaces on the street and surrounding streets."

dressed Gonzalez' situation. "We cannot remove the parking meter in front of his house to put a handicap spot in that area."

City Attorney Mark Blunda, "We would have to amend the ordinance for that area."

Barrick made a suggestion, "We can get you a residential sticker so you can park at a meter all day long and not get a ticket."

Council President Lisa Nanton said, "In the meantime, we should get him a residential sticker." B.A. Barrick agreed.

Resident David Caba said, "The election is over. You guys (the Council) lied to us

nando Gonzalez is the only one who we see even when there is no election. We need to see you (the Council) every day, not just at election day."

Resident Stanley Sierakowski voiced concerns about a large amount of Veteran Poll Workers being replaced. "A lot of them were Senior Citizens who are not political like I am. Frankel (Daniel E. Frankel, Commissioner of Registration of Middlesex County Board of Elections) did not answer emails or phone calls until after the May 12, 2015 election was over. A lot of the poll workers who worked that day came from out-of-town and are politically connected. By Frankel allowing this, it hurt the Seniors who rely on poll money to help with expenses."

A State Street Resident stated, "In last month and half things were said about Fernando Gonzalez in reference to fraud charges. This said more about the people who accused him of this than Fernando himself. You didn't care about wasting this money. There are good people, but a few rotten apples spoil everyone. I didn't get up for the Pledge of Allegiance because some of the people said the Pledge are hypocrites."

Resident Cathy DePow agreed with the people from Bricktown Commons (High Street) about their parking issues. She was also concerned abut the quality of life, especially the loud noise situation. "We need to take action."

Resident Steve Nascimento who is also on the Planning Board came up to speak, "The Planning Board Attorney said I had to recuse himself from discussions on Harbortown and could not even be in the audience during these discussions. There is a walkway promenade on the premises that is 8 feet below street level. The public offering said that pools and a water park would be a part of our amenities. Instead, we got a parking lot. There were stockpiles of concrete with steel pipes sticking out and children are playing on them."

Councilman Fernando Irizarry told Nascimento, "We need to have Code Enforcement look into this."

Resident Alan Silber came up to speak. He said, "Vitale said the election is over and we should move on. He (Vitale) and his money should move on. To the Freeholders, County Clerk and Mrs. Nanton: you owe Fernando Gonzalez an apology. You knew a lot of the people who were straw donors. What happened to the poll clerks was terrible."

Businesswoman Virginia Lugo was sympathetic to the plight of Gudelio Gonzalez Jr. of Market Street. "This gentleman who is diabetic and handicapped should be helped."

Fernando Gonzalez' son, Daniel came up to speak. He talked about the Harbortown Walkway and agreed with the assessment that Steve Nascimento gave on the situation. He gave congratulations to Perth Amboy, "It's not about Fernando. It's about the people. I can't begrudge politicians for participation, but not to circumstance the votes. Trial Courts often get it wrong. That's why we have higher courts. The way things were done was disgusting. A motion was made by Fernando Gonzalez to recuse Scotland & McManimon (A lawfirm that has contracts with the City and Sergio Diaz' lawyer). It was a blatant pay-to-play. Being his (Fernando Gonzalez) son and campaign manager, it was disgusting because you all love Perth Amboy, but some are not loving it in the right way. Let's stop letting outsiders control

Resident Arthur Brewer from Convery Boulevard was very concerned about the traffic situation near the Sayre Avenue Bridge. "The hours between 3 p.m. to 6 p.m. are terrible and that's the time when most traffic accidents occur." He then turned his attention to the quality of life, especially near the Richardson School. He talked about the Remington Hotel (on the intersection of Smith and Bertrand Avenue) "The police have been called to that establishment several times because of the drug activity taking place during the day and evening hours. Move those people somewhere else."

Israel Varela who owns a business near the Remington Hotel spoke, "I've been complaining about this for 10 years. I've had police sit in my office looking at all the illegal activity going on at this hotel. This hotel has been getting money from the State because of the type of residents living there. My life and my family's life have been put in danger because of this. There is a house on Bertrand Avenue that allows all sorts of illegal activities to go on. I'm inviting the Council to come to see for themselves. All you hear is the foul language. Some police are doing a fine job, but they still need your (the Council's) help."

A Police Captain came up from the audience to talk about the situation at the Remington Hotel. "We need the public's help to do our job. An anticrime unit is assigned to the Remington Hotel. We even have keys to the hotel, but we don't have the manpower to monitor the problem 24 hours. We utilize unmarked police cars. We've had many sting

Memorial Day: To Honor Those Who Have Made the Ultimate Sacrifice

When You Get the Chance - Will You Sit it Out or Dance? The Majority sat it out. Well, last Tuesday, May 12, 2015 was the Perth Amboy Special City Council Election - last seat. There was a winner, but only by numbers. In all honesty, and this is my OWN opinion – BOTH candidates LOST.

When you check the statistics from the November 12, 2014 election where 7 candidates were vying for 3 seats on the Council, there was a larger voter turnout. With this do over on May 12, 2015 with only 2 candidates on the ballot, I truthfully expected a blowout for the victor. Instead it was dust in the wind. To top it off, there were actually more registered voters added between the 2014 election and the one held in 2015.

In November 4, 2014, Sergio Diaz had 1810 votes from the machine vs. 1298 votes that he received in May 12, 2015. (-512 votes) For the Vote-By-Mail in 2014, he had 421 votes vs. 78 votes in 2015. (-343) For the Provisionals Diaz had 55 votes as compared to 30 in 2015. (-25)

Fernando Gonzalez had 1596 votes in November 4, 2014 by machine vs. 1273 votes in May 12, 2015 (-323 votes). In 2014 he had 633 Vote-By-Mail vs. 215 in May 2015 (-418 votes). For Provisionals he had 67 in 2014 vs. 40 in 2015. (-27)

In 11/4/14 there were 25,052 registered voters and 4907 voted on the machine (20%). In May 12, 2015 the number of registered voters increased to 25,156 (+104). On the machine 2571 voted (10% of Registered Voters).

My question is: "What happened to the supporters you had in 2014? How did you manage to actually lose votes instead of gaining?" I've noticed there was a candidate from 2014 who didn't win who was supporting one of the two candidates in the May 12, 2015 election. You think that losing Candidate would encourage the people who sup-

ported him to vote for you. What happened?

Well, the BIG WINNER was the candidate under the banner: I DON'T CARE WHO WINS! It's always good to have a balanced Council. You always need someone to question the issues. That's a good thing. But, my father would always say, "If you criticize something, you should have some sort of solution or idea on how to solve the problem."

Residents have spoken that there are a lot of political favors being handed out.

Term limits are a solution. Citizens can petition to have all offices subject to term limits by petition. People might argue that sometimes terms of service are too short. Maybe extend the amount of years for a term, but limit the amount of terms that can be served consecutively. It definitely is worth looking into.

We have people that come up and have talked about making Perth Amboy into Partisan or a Ward System. Talk is cheap. Why don't you go into action and get a petition going? Have residents sign it to get term limitations on the ballot.

In last week's paper we reported about an election that took place in 1950 in Perth Amboy where 18,299 people voted. In 1954, 18,330 people went to the polls. There were 20 candidates with the top vote getter receiving 8535 votes with a low vote of 3715 at the bottom of the totem pole. I don't know if absentee ballots and provisional ballots were implemented back then, but a greater percentage had to actually make an effort to go to the polls.

Remember it's Memorial Day on Monday, May 25, 2015. And is this how we honor those who make the ultimate sacrifice? By staying home and not being heard by refusing to vote, especially when we make it so convenient. It's so sad. People in other countries are dying for this right that we take for granted.

The City of Perth Amboy Council is Heartless Against the Disabled

I suffer from diabetes, which causes bad circulation in my feet, creating frequent and severe foot ulcers. At this time, I have an ulcer on my left foot and "Charcot" foot illness on my right foot. I reside in an area where it is very hard to find a parking spot. Due to my illness, I was forced to retire in

2011, because my job required a lot of walking. On April 20, I received a letter from the Police Department denying a "handicapped" only parking spot in front of my home, because of an ordinance - Chapter 255-A-Section #1-Prohibits this. If you live in an area with parking meters, the City does not want to lose the income from the meter, so they will not give you the parking spot. The money is more important to the City than what happens to a disabled person.

Due to the extra walking, they are forcing on them, on May 13, I attended the Council Meeting and again requested the "parking spot." The Council stated "Sorry Charley." {Hit the Road} and denied my request. Recently reelected Councilman Fernando Gonzalez not included - > Perth Amboy City Council, Shame on you - You are heartless, cruel and inhuman.

Municipal Consolidation

There is a claim that consolidating municipalities into fewer and large municipalities would cure the high property taxes in NJ. I think consolidating smaller municipalities would require a new layer of top management to oversee the enlarged workforce. Assuming a reduction in the labor force, consolidation does nothing for material costs and supplies. What about any increased travel time from a central location?

NJ did not have the highest property taxes in the nation with the old 1844 state constitution where property was assessed at "true value" rather than "assessed value", which escalates over time. Didn't California use Initiative and Referendum a few years ago to adjust property taxes?

Should municipalities be consolidated across county lines? Should counties be consolidated as well? NJ had only thirteen counties in the 18th century. The number was increased to meet the voters requests. Townships were divided into smaller municipali-

ties so the citizens had more control over local political priorities and taxes.

Why stop at municipalities? The ultimate consolidation would be to unite with the state of Pennsylvania (which has a similar latitude). Their state constitution is more democratic, voters can elect state officials, judges, and county prosecutors. If giving more power to voters leads to lower taxes, maybe we need Initiative and Referendum in NJ to cure any other problem.



Presentation by Math Consultant Dr. Eric Milou

By: Katherine Massopust PERTH AMBOY – Dr. Eric Milou from Rowan University, New Jersey gave a presentation at the 4/2/15 Board of Education Meeting. He began by breaking the ice, "I'm a total geek. I had the honor of looking at your curriculum. It's great, but curriculum is a living document. By that, I mean it constantly needs updating."

"Teachers need to be more organized and assess every day." He began his report with Kindergarten thru 4th Grades. He visited all 7 schools (5 elementary and 2 middle schools). "I find that instruction is very lectured based. Teacher talk is not successful. Kids do not learn by listening - they learn by doing. Assessment needs to be done every day. You need to teach to kids at all levels – sometimes to remediate, sometimes to enrich. You have to address the kids to do more."

"At McGinnis School, there is a lack of vision. Teach To One is not working. Math is not about procedures. There is a lack of rigor (skill, concept and application)."

At Shull School there was way too much drill and skill websites being utilized. It is very teacher driven.

Dr. Milou's recommendations were: "At every level there should be full assessment, remediation and enrichment. Limit Teacher Chatter. There should be student centered instruction and mathematics instruction vison. We have to show them how it's done."

When it came to the ques-

tion and answer period, Board Member Obi Gonzalez stated, "Something is missing in our math. We're behind him (Milou). We need to know what we're doing right and what we're doing wrong. We're grateful for that. We all want to do the right thing for our kids. Dr. Milou being here is a start."

Resident Stanely Sierakowski asked, "Are there any schools that you would recommend to visit or observe?

Dr. Milou answered, "Japan. Teachers in Japan will walk in and the kids immediately do work. They support and guide – not talk. The Asian model is excellent."

Resident Sharon Hubberman asked about the PARCC exam, "In media, parents don't agree to pass this test is necessary."

Dr. Milou answered her, "In the USA, states have a right to educate anyway they want. The Federal Government has little to say. There is no common assessment. Every state has a different test. There are 50 different tests. All the governors got together to give us a national assessment of math. Some politicians view it as an infringement on State's Rights. It's nothing but politics. We are the only country in the world that does not have a National Test. Common Core are a set of standards – never methodology. There are different ways and different approaches. If a kid doesn't understand one approach, maybe that student can do it another way. There are different ways to reach different kids. Math is the most hated subject in the world."
