Menendez, Pallone Visited Union Beach to Push Sweeping Flood Insurance Reforms to Fix Problems Exposed by Sandy

Comprehensive, bipartisan legislation extends National Flood Insurance Program for 6 yrs., makes NFIP sustainable, affordable, fair & efficient

Press Release 8/17/17 UNION BEACH - U.S. Senator Bob Menendez (D-N.J.), chair of the Sandy Task Force and a senior member of the Senate Banking Committee that oversees the National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP), and Congressman Frank Pallone, Jr. (N.J.-06), traveled today to Union Beach—a community on Raritan Bay devastated by Superstorm Sandy—to lay out proposed sweeping reforms to address the waste, abuse and mismanagement plaguing the system that led to delayed recovery for Sandy survivors.

In June, Sen. Menendez introduced comprehensive, bipartisan legislation, cosponsored by nearly a dozen Republicans and Democrats including Sen. Cory Booker, to extend the NFIP for six years while instituting a series of sweeping reforms. Reps. Pallone and Bill Pascrell, Jr. (N.J.-09) later introduced companion legislation in the House. "This legislation puts the lessons we learned after Superstorm Sandy into action, levels the playing field for policyholders, and attacks the rampant waste and abuse in the National Flood Insurance Program to create real savings and greater investment in mitigation and resiliency efforts to make our residents and communities saf-

er," said Sen. Menendez. "If we want a more sustainable system, the answer isn't to slam homeowners with even higher premiums. Americans deserve a National Flood Insurance Program that is sustainable for taxpayers, affordable for homeowners, and accountable to everyone."

"Superstorm Sandy devastated many communities in my district. In the wake of the storm, too many of my constituents found that, after responsibly paying for their flood insurance, their policy failed to provide the coverage they needed and deserved when they needed it the most. Many were prevented from repairing their homes and resuming their lives by a claims review process that moved too slowly and was riddled with fraud. As this was happening and people were suffering, the flood insurance companies made record profits." said Rep. Pallone. "The SAFE NFIP Act takes concrete steps to make the program more affordable, increase oversight and transparency of the flood insurance companies, invest in mitigation efforts, and reform the claims process using lessons learned from Sandy. I look forward to working with my colleagues on both sides of the aisle to fight for this bill and our constituents."

"Americans rely on the National Flood Insurance Program to protect their homes and rebuild their lives in the aftermath of a disaster," said Sen. Booker. "We already know that NFIP reforms are needed to protect homeowners in New Jersey and across our nation from the waste and mismanagement we witnessed following Superstorm Sandy. This common sense, bipartisan legislation helps extend coverage to those who need it most while investing in resiliency and mitigation efforts that will help protect New Jersey families from future disasters."

"At every turn my constituents faced obstacles in getting the support needed to repair their businesses and homes after Sandy. And they were frustrated by the waste, fraud, and abuse that plagued the claims review process. I am pleased to find fixes to these issues by joining Senator Menendez and Congressman Pallone on the bipartisan SAFE NFIP Act," said Rep. Pascrell. "The SAFE NFIP Act creates investments in pre-disaster flood control and mitigation efforts, increases oversight and transparency of the flood insurance companies, and reforms the claims process in order to help protect New

Delilah's Den to Be Torn Down 8/16/17 Council Meeting

By: Joseph L. Kuchie SOUTH AMBOY - Last Wednesday the city of South Amboy announced that the construction project to tear down Delilah's Den on Route 9 is now underway.

Councilwoman Zusette Dato broke the news to residents during last Wednesday's city council meeting, ending a long battle with the property owners to have the now closed property removed from the major highway.

"Finally, we can say hallelujah that building is coming down," Dato said. "We feel it's good for the city and it will make the appearance so much better, it's a wonderful thing."

"I'd like to thank the Mayor, our staff at city hall, our code enforcement and everybody for making that happen and pushing it along," she added.

"I know this building has been an eyesore for a while but it goes back even further than that with years of litigation that we had to try and close that place down," Mayor Fred Henry said. "It finally took place and now after quite a while it's finally being demolished and I'd like to thank the people that were involved in all of that."

The city also passed an ordinance approving a Historical Preservation Committee in South Amboy.

"They are there to advise the city planning board on differ-

ent areas they identify as historical sites," Mayor Henry said. "It allows them to apply for different grants and it is a step closer in helping preserve South Amboy's great history."

"I was very happy to see that the historical preservation ordinance is moving forward, I think it's a good thing for the town," Councilman Tom Reilly said.

Mayor Henry read a proclamation declaring August 31 as Overdose Awareness Day in South Amboy. FED UP! 2017, a community event to bring awareness to the opioid addiction epidemic in South Amboy and the United States, will be held at South Amboy Middle High School on August 31 at 5:00 p.m.

All council members were in attendance. The next city council meeting will be held on September 20th at 7:00 p.m.

Why Now?

Time for Conversation - Not Confrontation!

In wake of the events that recently happened in Charlottes-ville, Virginia, and all around the Country we want to give our views on the matter of defacing and removing statues of Confederate Generals that have been around for over 100 years.

Why were these individuals demanding that these statues be torn down not insulted 50 years ago?? 25 years ago??? 10 years ago??? 10 months ago??? 1 month ago??? Why now??? What is the reason why these statues are suddenly so offensive?

A lot of people on both sides of the political spectrum were upset when Trump got elected President. Some still are upset. Many who supported him are now against him. Some people blame Trump as an excuse to deface and destroy statues.

Do any of these protestors even know what they are talking about or anything about the Civil War?

Listening to these different organizations and their representatives their argument is simple: these men fought for slavery; slavery is evil – we want these statues down. But things are not that simple.

These fields supplied the starving Irish during the Potato Famine with food. We sent them corn. This is Fredericksburg, and we want to protect our land and our heritage."

Although a slave owner, Lee believed slavery was wrong. Slaves had little to do with Lee's life. After the war, his plantation became Arlington National Cemetery.

When his church became integrated, a black man knelt at the railing for communion and no one came near him. A greyhaired man came up from the rear of the church and knelt beside him. It was Robert E. Lee.

Stonewall Jackson was not a slave owner. He was a teacher at Virginia Military Academy and a very religious man. He fought for the Confederacy since he was from the South and a soldier.

Okay, so you knocked down a statue. What did this accomplish? Attacking people and destroying property is a crime. Those committing these crimes should be arrested. You've even get some people who mistakenly defaced or vandalized the wrong statues – dumbbells! Maybe they should read the inscriptions first.

People forget that the first thing that the Taliban did when they took over Afghanistan was to destroy all the religious statues. Sound familiar?

Worse of all are the politicians and leaders from other professions who are jumping into the fray. How is this helping your constituents? But several years later she was pleasantly surprised when two of those people came back to apologize and to say how ashamed they were for their beliefs. One of the ex-skinheads said shortly after that show, he was arrested, jailed and was assigned to a work crew that was all black. Even the jailer was black. Even though they knew he was a skinhead because of all of his tattoos proclaiming this, they did not hold this against him. Because of the way they treated him in spite of his history, it gave him respect for

black people and their willingness to give him a chance.

When one of the ex-skinheads came back to tell his story, he began to choke up and start crying. Sometimes when you look at yourself from the outside, you see things that you didn't before and have an epiphany.

Another Oprah show had the Little Rock 9 (Black Students) who integrated a school in Arkansas in 1957. In 1996 on Oprah, the Little Rock 9 appeared along with their former tormentors of 40 years ago. Now all adults, those tormentors apologized to the Little Rock 9 for their behavior when they were young. They explained their unacceptable behavior and how they just followed what everyone else was doing without giving it much thought. One of the former tormentors came on stage and started to cry and began to hug each member of the Little Rock 9 that was present.

What will this world be 20 years from now if things proceed as they are? Will it be Ray Bradbury's <u>Fahrenheit 451</u> where all books are burned because everything is offensive to everyone? Or George Orwell's <u>1984</u> where history is constantly being rewritten and freedom is just an illusion?

It's time that we start listening to each other. Enough of the mob mentality and the confrontations which are getting us nowhere. The time is now to put hatred aside and have a face to face conversation with all sides

We'd love to have a roundtable discussion with all sides represented. It could be videotaped and shown on YouTube. We just need the participants who will follow the rules that will be set in place. So are you in?

To quote the well-known philosopher Confucius. "A journey of a thousand miles begins with a single step." Will you make the first step? *C.M. & K.M.*





This Week in World War II 75 Years Ago

Marshal Philippe Pétain, head of the Vichy French government, on August 21, 1942, praises German forces for repelling the Allied attack on the French port of Dieppe. President Roosevelt says the perpetrators of barbarism in occupied countries "will have to stand in courts of law, in the very countries which they are now oppressing, and answer for their acts." U.S. Marines repulse the first major Japanese land offensive on Guadalcanal at the Battle of the Tenaru River. Some 765 (85%) of the 900 Japanese attackers are killed, at a cost of around 43 Marine lives.

Under heavy pressure from the U.S., Brazil declares war on Germany and Italy on August 22. Also tipping the scales on the Brazilian decision are attacks made by German submarine U-507 in Brazilian waters that have killed over 600 people from neutral countries inside of a week. Japan is excluded from Brazil's declaration of war. In Europe, stiff resistance by the Red Army slows the German advance into the Caucasus.

On August 23, Hitler orders that Stalingrad be captured. The Luftwaffe begins a 48-hour-long air raid there that involves over 4,000 sorties with incendiaries and explosives. The city erupts into a sea of fire as oil-storage tanks pour their flaming contents into the Volga River that flows for some 25 miles through the city. Over 40,000 civilians perish in the attack, as the city is reduced to rubble. The German 6th Army punches a five-mile-wide gap in the Soviet 62nd Army's defenses as the 14th Panzer Corps crosses the Don River and reaches the Volga, north of Stalingrad. Hoth's 4th Panzer Army is held up by stiff Red Army resistance south of Stalingrad. The Germans make further progress on the Kuban Peninsula on the Black Sea. A German platoon hoists the swastika flag on the top of Mt. Elbrus, the highest peak in the Caucasus.

The Naval Battle of the Eastern Solomon Islands takes place on August 24. The American aircraft carrier *USS Enterprise* is badly damaged; the Japanese lose one light carrier. To alleviate a labor shortage because of American farm workers going off to war, the U.S. and Mexico formally agree to permit Mexican temporary laborers to work on U.S. farms in every U.S. state. An exception is Texas, where Mexican authorities are concerned about discrimination. Some 200,000 Mexican *braceros* (manual laborers) will work in the U.S. during the war. The German Sixth Army moves into the northern suburbs of Stalingrad. A thousand miles to the north, Soviet forces launch a major offensive in the Leningrad area. In Germany, Hitler appoints Otto Georg Thierack as Reich Minister of Justice and gives him the power to set aside any and all laws.

On August 25, the Swedish ship *SS Gripsholm* arrives in New York, carrying 287 Allied officials, missionaries, correspondents and teachers who have been exchanged for Japanese diplomats. Among them is America's longtime ambassador to Japan, Joseph Grew. Grew issues a statement describing the treatment that the ship's passengers had endured while interned in Japan, many "in solitary confinement in small, bitterly cold prison cells, inadequately clothed and inadequately fed and at times subjected to the most cruel and barbaric tortures." In the Soviet Union, the city of Stalingrad is declared to be in a state of siege. Efforts are made to evacuate some citizens.

On August 26, two thousand Japanese troops accompanied by small tanks land at Milne Bay, on the tip of New Guinea, southeast of Port Moresby. Their goal is to capture Allied airfields there and then move on toward Port Moresby. In Europe, the Soviet Air Force launches raids over Berlin and other German cities. Meanwhile, German Army Group B moves closer to its target of the oilfields of Grozny, in the Caucasus. The *Times of London* publishes an article describing a new antibiotic drug called penicillin, discovered in 1928 by Alexander Fleming and developed at Oxford University.

The Red Army on August 27 launches counterattacks from the Leningrad pocket. At the same time some 440 miles to the southeast, the Red Army's offensive on the Moscow front continues. Gen. Georgy Zhukov is appointed Stalin's First Deputy Commissar for Defense. In France, the Vichy government begins cooperating with German authorities to "deport" Jews to Auschwitz, in Occupied Poland. Cuba declares war on Germany, Italy and Japan.




