Perth Amboy Officer Saves Man's Life *Officer Kyle L. Savoia Saves Man from Being Struck by Train on July 19, 2018*

PERTH AMBOY, New Jersey (July 24, 2018) – Officer Kyle L. Savoia's body camera captures footage of his life saving actions on Thursday, July 19, 2018, as he saved a man who was just moments away from being struck by a moving train.

Below is a brief description of what took place:

- Incident took place on 7/19/18 at 8:19 a.m. (as shown on the video)
- Officer (Patrolman) Savoia, was dispatched to check on the welfare of someone on the tracks
- Upon arrival, a bystander pointed out a man laying down on the North bound tracks approximately 200 yards South from the train station's platform. Officer Savoia observe

the oncoming train on the North bound track where a man was laying facedown. He then started to run towards the train and as he was getting closer used verbal commands to alert the man. He began to also signal at the train to stop, as he waved his arms.

- The train was alerted and began to slow down. As Officer Savoia approached the man, the man jumped out of the way of the train just prior to being struck.

- The man was transported to Raritan Bay Medical Center for further treatment.

"As police officers, our job is to make quick decisions in difficult situations and to act on them. At the end of the day, all that matters is everyone gets home safe. Also at such an early stage of my career, to be able to make an impactful difference in a person's life is incredible

and makes me love what I do every day," said Officer Kyle L. Savoia.

Officer Kyle Savoia was sworn in on January 18, 2018. His father, Sgt. Kevin Savoia Sr. who passed away in 2016 served as a Perth Amboy police officer for over 28 years.



Raritan Bay Medical Center Receives American Heart Association's EMS Gold Plus Award *Award Recognizes Exceptional Treatment of Patients Experiencing Severe Heart Attack*

PERTH AMBOY - For the second consecutive year, Hackensack Meridian Health Raritan Bay Medical Center-Old Bridge and Raritan Bay Medical Center-Perth Amboy received the American Heart Association's (AHA) Mission: Lifeline® EMS Gold Plus Award for implementing quality improvement measures for the treatment of patients who experience severe heart attacks.

Raritan Bay has been recognized with the EMS Gold Plus Award after demonstrating at least 75 percent compliance of each required measure over a three-year span. "We are extremely proud of this recognition of our dedication and achievement in emergency medical care for all our cardiac patients," said Scott Powers, MBA, NRP, director of Operations and MICU, Alert Ambulance Service, Inc. and Raritan Bay Medical Center. "The Mission: Lifeline program is helping us achieve our goal of making our emergency services among the best in the country." Raritan Bay has received annual recognition for its compliance with Mission: Lifeline quality improvement measures since 2014.

Every year, more than 250,000 people experience an ST elevation myocardial infarction (STEMI), the most deadly type of heart attack caused by a blockage of blood flow to the heart. To prevent death, it's critical to restore blood flow as quickly as possible, either by mechanically opening the blocked vessel or by providing clot-busting medication. Unfortunately, a significant number of STEMI patients don't receive this prompt reperfusion therapy, which is critical in restoring blood flow. Mission: Lifeline

seeks to save lives by closing the gaps that separate these patients from timely access to appropriate treatments. Its EMS recognition program recognizes emergency medical services for their efforts in improving systems of care and quality of life for these patients.

Emergency medical system providers are vital to the success of Mission: Lifeline. EMS agencies, like Raritan Bay Medical Center's, perform 12-lead ECGs which measure the electrical activity of the heart and can help determine if a heart attack has occurred. They also follow protocols derived from AHA/American College of Cardiology guidelines. These tools, training, and practices allow EMS providers to rapidly identify suspected heart attack patients, promptly notify the medical center, and trigger an early response from the awaiting hospital team members.

"EMTs and paramedics play a vital part in the system of care for those who have heart attacks," said Tim Henry, M.D., chair of the Mission: Lifeline Acute Coronary Syndrome Subcommittee. "Since they often are the first medical point of contact, they can save precious minutes of treatment time by activating the emergency response system that alerts hospitals to an incoming heart attack patient. We applaud Raritan Bay Medical Center for achieving this award in following evidence-based guidelines in the treatment of people who have severe heart attacks."

Hackensack Meridian Health's JFK Emergency Medical Services and Hackensack University Medical Center's Emergency Medical Services also received the AHA Mission: Lifeline® EMS Gold Plus Award in 2018.

The Guardian’s Odyssey

This past Friday 7/27/18 Carolyn and I went on a journey – to Woodbridge. It started out around 4 p.m. on Friday when we went to the Credit Union. When I came out of the building, I heard thunder and lightning, then it started to rain, and rain, and rain some more.

We went up Rte. 35 to Rte. 1, then proceeded to go to Capital One Bank in Iselin. Carolyn did her banking, then stayed inside for around a half hour as the rain poured down and then poured some more. Then it stopped a little, so we went down Rte. 1 to Woodbridge Center Drive, which was blocked off by the police a little down the way. We turned into Woodbridge Center Parking lot and drove down a little by Macy’s. Woodbridge Center Drive was flooded and there were three cars almost completely submerged under water. We took some photos, then it started to rain again and again.

We decided to go to the next light, thereby avoiding the flooded portion of Woodbridge Center Drive. While in the car, Carolyn said, “Maybe we should call one of the news stations and maybe they would want some photos.” So, Carolyn decided to Google CBS News, New York and found a general number. She then called CBS News and an operator answered. When she explained she had pictures of submerged cars and asked if they would be interested. She said, “Hold on,” and transferred her to a man in the newsroom. He said he was interested and sent a phone number to send the photos to. The photos were featured on Channel 2 News about a half-hour later. Carolyn gave him an update on the weather situation in the area and how the police had other roads between Perth Amboy and Woodbridge blocked off and how we could see other vehicles submerged in water. Carolyn communicated back and forth by texting for almost an hour, and he told her to be safe.

We went down Woodbridge Main Street and continued, turning into CVS parking lot. I quickly went in and picked up a few things, then we decided to go down South Fulton Street to Amboy Avenue. It turns out Amboy Avenue was flooded and blocked off by the police. We then turned the other way to go towards Rte. 35. Rte.35 was blocked off by police going towards Perth Amboy. We turned back up Rte. 35

North to Woodbridge and went down towards Sewaren and drove towards Perth Amboy on outer State Street.

When we got to State Street, there was a huge line of vehicles. Many people got tired of waiting and turned around. It continued to rain on and off. After waiting around an hour and half, the rain stopped for 15 minutes. I went and asked the police officer who was blocking off State Street how long it would be. He said, “I can’t give you an answer.”

So, we turned around and had supper at Moby Dick’s. As soon as we walked in the door, we spotted Fernando and Obi Gonzalez who were in the same situation as us, and decided to wait it out and get some food. They offered us some of their pizza and we sat down to talk. After they left, Carolyn and I had some supper and watched the weather and the Mets on TV.

We decided to take a chance and do what our friend, Joe had suggested before and try to go on Rte. 9. So, we went back up through Sewaren, then to Woodbridge Main Street, then on to Rte. 9 South, then through Keasbey, then onto Smith Street into Perth Amboy. After I dropped Carolyn off, the icing on the cake was I couldn’t find a parking space at first, but thankfully someone left on the first time I went around the block. I got home around 9:45 p.m. Time elapsed since we first left in the afternoon: 5hrs 45min.

I haven’t seen such intense rainstorm in 18 years. Four ways into Perth Amboy were blocked (Amboy Avenue, Rte. 440, Rte. 35, and State Street). When driving by, we saw the Turnpike and Parkway at a standstill. The flooding was intense and terrible. We passed by several accidents on the roads and some vehicles in distress. The conditions were treacherous.

It felt like Odysseus and his journey in the Odyssey. Just when you thought you were five minutes from home, you’re stuck turning back and keep continuing on your journey.

Between this storm and Sandy, with Sandy, there was a warning. With this storm, we got hit out of the blue. No one expected these torrential rains, especially those people who had to evacuate their cars quickly when as the water was rising.

Hope everyone stayed safe.

Worth Repeating

I wrote this a few months ago, but I think it needs to be revisited. I don't think the proposed high density zoning for downtown Perth Amboy is good for anyone. We are not New Brunswick, Hoboken, Jersey City or Metuchen and never will be. I don't think any of the reasons or conditions have changed and the mayor is still pushing for this.

Rezoning Perth Amboy

Last week my husband, Bob Sottilaro and I attended the meeting regarding the rezoning plans for the future of Perth Amboy. Several people spoke and raised important questions and suggestions. The first question or problem that came to mind was how many section 8's would be permitted in the apartments proposed above the stores?. That also raises the question of how many children will live in these apartments and most importantly, where will they go to school? Our schools are already beyond capacity and the new schools being built will already be over crowded when they are finished. Will people with children be restricted from renting these apartments? When young people have children, they will most likely want to move out of an apartment to a house.

There was much emphasis on "millenials" and college graduates and artists. This seems unrealistic. The cost of rent was brought up as was the large

amount of illegal housing where people prefer to rent a room in a private house because they can't afford an apartment. Someone mentioned that the owners of the buildings don't maintain them properly and only care about collecting high rents. How many millenials, artists, college graduates, young professionals are currently living in King Plaza?

Last night Perth Amboy made the news again and I watched Ed Mullen and Larry Cattano speak about the fire on Commerce Street. A resident said she didn't realize there were 10 people in that house! Fires seem to be happening more frequently. Does the fire department have the apparatus to reach the higher stories of the existing buildings and the stories proposed on the other buildings? This also raises the question of water pressure, water pipes and sewers. Was Middlesex Water Company apprised of this plan and what was their reaction? Can the water pressure be sustained in the case of a fire? Can the firetrucks move through the city fast enough given the existing traffic problems?

Mention was made of the police with a substation at the train station. That was one positive plan mentioned.. However, a friend mentioned that there used to be a substation but it's gone, what happened to it? Mention was made of police on bicycles and segues. I haven't noticed a police presence anywhere except at council meetings. I used to notice cars patrolling the streets all around town. We used to have police walking the streets. One place police should

be visible in in front of the library where homeless congregate.

The plan focuses on residential density. When people are jammed together, there is more aggressive behavior and problems. The high rises at Stockton and Huntington were torn down because of problems.

There is a glaring omission of the Department of Public Works in the list of representatives. This department will be responsible for handling garbage which is already a huge problem.

Parking was brought up several times. Wilma Matey and other mentioned that the deck and parking lots are not being utilized. Traffic is already a major problem. Linda Ferreira reiterated the problem with overcrowded schools and also brought up the hospital's ability to handle more patients.

Several people mentioned that the city should fix what exists, improve education, attract stores that offer better merchandise. A suggestion was made by Stanley Sierakowski to bring in a Rutgers University Annex. He also warned that the city could use eminent domain regardless of what residents want.

BJ Torres asked "who did the study", they should be reviewed by the council and the residents of the city should be made aware of them.

This is an enormous undertaking and everyone should consider all the ramifications this plan will bring.

This Week in World War II 75 Years Ago

Hamburg, Germany, is bombed for a third time on July 30, 1943. Meanwhile, at Bentlage, in northwestern Germany, the German Arado Ar 234 — the first jet-powered bomber — takes to the air. Used mostly for reconnaissance, the airplane has a maximum speed of 480 miles per hour, can fly at 36,000 feet and has a range of 1,240 miles.

On July 31, the freight-carrying passenger ship *SS Bagé* — en route from Belém to Rio de Janeiro, and the largest vessel in Brazil's commercial fleet — is torpedoed and sunk by German submarine U-185. Of the 129 passengers and 102 crew members aboard, 41 passengers and 37 crew members are killed in the explosion or drown. In Sicily, American troops capture Santo Stefano di Camastra, about 62 miles east of Palermo and 83 miles west of Messina.

Heavy fighting continues on Sicily on August 1, with some of the fiercest battles yet seen. The USAAF loses 54 out of 178 Libyan-based B-24s in a disastrous raid (the longest yet attempted) on the Ploiești oil fields in Romania while inflicting only superficial damage on 40% of the refining facilities. Hitler orders the immediate evacuation of the Orel salient in Russia. Lydia Litvyak, 21, the top-scoring Russian female fighter pilot of the war (12 kills) — known as “The White Rose of Stalingrad” — is shot down and killed while flying her fourth sortie of the day against German positions. The Germans take over the defense of the island of Crete from Italian troops. Italy repeals all anti-Jewish laws of the previous Fascist government; 12,000 Jews that had been arrested are ordered released.

On August 2, U.S. Navy Lt.(j.g.) John F. Kennedy's torpedo boat, *PT-109*, is rammed by a Japanese vessel, splits in two and sinks off the Solomon Islands. Two crewmen die in the accident; Kennedy and ten others are ultimately rescued. Hitler orders that German armies are to hold fast in Russia and Ukraine, but Field Marshal Erich von Manstein ignores him and uses a “flexible defense” in the Kharkiv sector. The fourth and final bombing raid on Hamburg, Germany, is made. The final tally: 50,000 killed and 800,000 left homeless. Canadian troops capture Regalbuto, in eastern Sicily.

The Red Army on August 3 launches an offensive from the Belgorod area in Russia after the failure of the Germans' “Operation Citadel.” The Italian government puts out peace feelers to the Allies, who lay down the following conditions for an armistice: the Italian fleet is to be handed over; all Italian territories are to be made available to the Allies for military operations; Allied prisoners in Italy are to be freed and not be allowed to fall into German hands; and all air and ground forces are to be disarmed. In New York City's Harlem, three days of rioting — triggered by a black soldier being shot, falsely rumored as fatally, by a white NYC policeman — come to an end. The tally: 6 dead, nearly 400 injured, 500 arrested and \$5 million in damages.

On August 4, U.S. bombers drop 153 tons of bombs on Kiska Island, in the Aleutians, in preparation for an assault against the Japanese forces there. At the V-2 rocket-assembly plant in Peenemünde, Germany, it is decided to use concentration-camp slave labor to build the missiles. Ten of each 11 workers at the factories will be camp inmates provided by the SS.

Catania, Sicily, is captured by British forces on August 5. In the Soviet Union, Red Army troops retake Belgorod, only 25 miles from the Ukrainian border, and drive towards Kharkiv, Ukraine. The Russian town of Orel is also recaptured by the Soviets after 23 days of fighting.



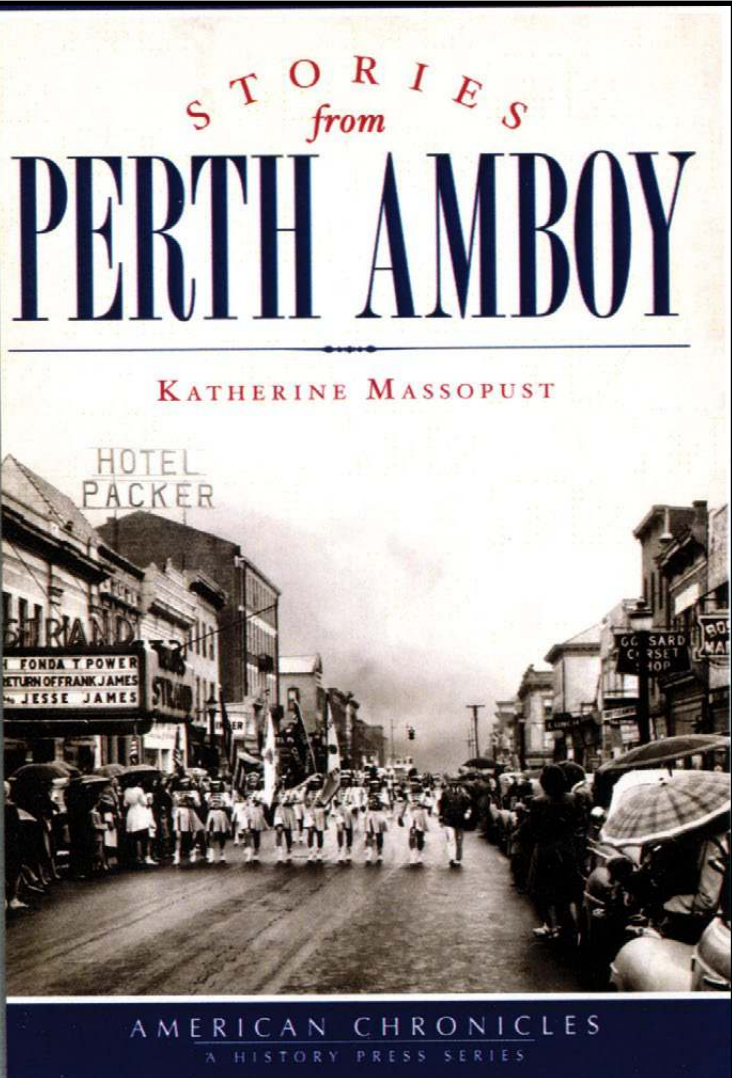

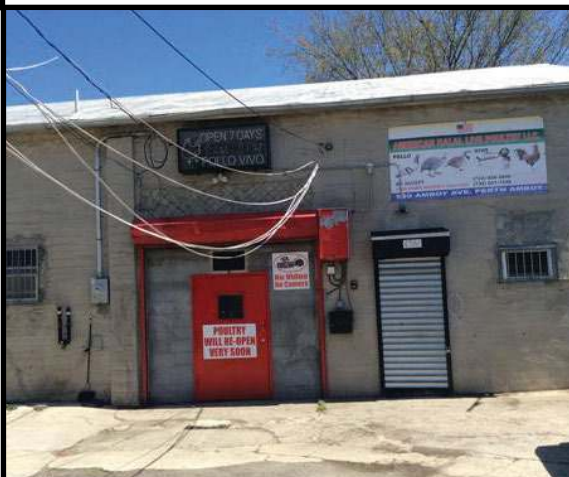
