South Amboy Trying Out New Bulk Garbage Pickup

By: Joseph L. Kuchie SOUTH AMBOY - South Amboy is experimenting with a new bulk garbage pickup plan that will allow residents to throw away all their bulk garbage at once rather than break it up over time.

Currently when a resident wants to throw away bulk items from their homes they must call the Department of Public Works to get stickers for each bulk item but are limited to how many items they can throw out per week. The city's new plan would allow residents to throw away an unlimited amount of garbage at once on a designated date based on their trash pickup schedule.

"We're trying an experiment this month with the bulk pickup," Business Administrator Glenn Skarzynski said. "We normally do once a week believe it or not, but it's limited to three or four items. What we're trying for September is hitting each neighborhood based on your trash pickup day and it's pretty much everything goes. If you get it to the curb and it's not hazardous, we'll take it."

September 5th was the first day of the trial run, with the "Monday zone" getting their chance to participate. Each

Wednesday a new zone will be able to participate until the end of the month, and then the city will decide what the next steps

Skarzynski noted that the numbers are consistent with the current pick up plan with less labor involved. The city has launched a poll on the South Amboy Facebook page to see which option residents would prefer moving forward.

"We normally do 24 tons a month doing that weekly thing, we did the Monday people to-

titions for the Nov. 6th council

The trio of candidates are emphasizing the importance of electing independent council members who put city residents first and are not beholden to the mayor. Petrick, Pabon and Tejeda are seeking three available City Council seats in the Nov. 6th election.

"People in Perth Amboy deserve independent leaders who actually listen to them and act on their behalf. They deserve bold leaders with a clear vision of our city's future and ener-

getic leaders, active in our com-PERTH AMBOY – Councilmen munity," said Council President Bill Petrick. "We are those leaders."

Councilman Joel Pabon agreed. "We are not a rubber stamp for the mayor or for any political party or special interest. We bring a fresh perspective on issues facing our city. We ask tough questions and seek for alternative, cost-efficient solutions," Pabon said. "That's what being independent means."

Milady Tejeda, a three-term Board of Education member, said her goal is a wider platform to serve city residents. "Like many people in Perth Amboy, I came here as an immigrant and worked hard to succeed. Perth Amboy has been good to me and my family," Tejeda said. "Serving on the City Council is another chance for me to give

23 years. He now supervises the U.S. Post Office at Perth Amboy. As a two-term Council member and former council



day and we did 21 tons, so the number is pretty consistent," Skarzynski said. "I've got a poll up actually on Facebook to see what people would prefer, the weekly with the limits or quarterly with no limits and right now quarterly is leading two to one but we're early, they've got a week to vote."

"That seems to be the direction we're looking to go in because not only is it a little bit easier to manage for us, it also will free up the DPW crew three additional days a week that we can use for something else," he added.

This new bulk pick-up plan comes just weeks after residents filed multiple complaints with the city regarding rat sightings in South Amboy. Skarzynski noted that the problem has improved since the city began their investigation and started cracking down on certain unkept properties.

"We had our recent rodent problem which seems to have abated," he said. "We haven't had a complaint in almost two weeks since we went in to the areas that were affected and engaged in some heavy enforcement and we're getting good compliance there."

All council members were in attendance for the business meeting. South Amboy's next city council meeting will be held on September 19th at 7:00 p.m.

The Memorials We Never **Would Have Imagined**

New York City World Trade Center Memorial, Washington D.C. Memorial for the Pentagon, Shanksville Pennsylvania, and memorials built in large and small towns mostly in New York and New Jersey, which I wish never had to be built.

Unfortunately, September 11, 2001 did happen, which is why all of these memorials had to be erected.

There now is a new memorial in Shanksville, PA. It cost \$6 million and is 93 feet tall and has 40 wind chimes for each of the 40 victims. Each chimes at a unique frequency to honor the victims of Flight 93.

This is now the 17th Anniversary of the day the world stood still. Even though some people said they have moved on, I'm sure there's a little piece of their hearts that we will always remember those that they lost.

Let's not forget there are still people living today who are suffering physically from the air that they inhaled that day. Lawsuits are still ongoing. In these instances, the money does help, but if they had their choice, they would rather have their loved ones back and their health.

Watching the televised ceremony at the World Trade Center Memorial in New York, you can hear the emotion of those who speak the names of the fallen victims. It's still gut-wrenching, especially to those survivors whose loved one's remains were never recovered (physical or material).

We are used to Memorials which have been built for people who have been victims of violence, but we could never imagine there could be such a massive attack on American soil. It was a big wake-up call and immediately security was tightened around airports and other ports of entry around the United States. People became more vigilant.

After a couple of years, the reigns became a little bit looser. It's a little bit scary when they have reports to see how vulnerable security checkpoints were at US airports. There were a lot of breeches of security where people posed a threat.

Often, you may be doing a search requested by someone else, and then all of a sudden, you're getting that information that you have no interest in. Profiling is the name of the game, and it's never going to change.

The scary part is when a person that doesn't hit the normal profile and commits a heinous



Historic Surveyor General's Office

PERTH AMBOY - The Historic Surveyor General's Office, which is adjacent to Perth Amboy City Hall, is now open for tours. At one time, this structure was the meeting place of the East Jersey Board of Proprietors & housed their records. Presently the Surveyor General's Office is displaying artifacts from the John Watson (1685-1768) archaeological site along with other items from Perth Amboy's rich history. 



Are You Sharing Too Much Information Online?

- Actively manage your security settings. Every app, social media site and web browser have multiple layers of privacy and security settings. This Week in World War II 75 Years Ago

On September 10, the Wehrmacht occupies Naples and Rome and announces that it is taking over "the protection" of Vatican City. British troops land on the Dodecanese Islands in the Aegean Sea. Twenty-two Italian warships — four battleships, seven cruisers and eleven destroyers — that fled Italy arrive at the British naval base at Malta and surrender to the Royal Navy.

Anti-Nazi Partisans in Yugoslavia on September 11 take over and secure the port city of Split, Croatia, on the Adriatic Sea. Across the Adriatic, British troops reach Brindisi, Italy. In the Atlantic, a German U-boat sets an extensive pattern of mines off the coast of South Carolina. Curiously, the floating weapons never result in damage to any vessel. In the Aegean Sea, the three-day Battle of Rhodes between Italian and German troops that had been on the island — originally as allies — ends in a German victory, with 446 Italians dead and 30,000 taken pris-

On August 12, Benito Mussolini, being held prisoner by the Italian government at the Campo Imperiale Hotel atop the Gran Sasso (a high mountain in the Abbruzzo region of central Italy), is rescued by SS Maj. Otto Skorzeny leading a daring glider attack by 100 German commandos and paratroopers. Il Duce is freed and taken to Germany. Hitler signs decrees appropriating Italian industry for German uses, as well as annexing to the Greater German Reich the German-speaking regions of northern Italy. The latter move violates the promise given by Hitler to Mussolini in 1940 that Germany had no territorial ambitions south of the Brenner Pass (the pass through the Alps between Italy and Austria). In Stockholm, Sweden, Soviet Deputy Foreign Minister Vladimir Dekanozov arrives on a secret mission, awaiting a German contact. In Germany, Foreign Minister von Ribbentrop — alerted that the Soviets might be open to discussing possible peace terms with the Third Reich — pleads with Hitler to be allowed to send an envoy to Stockholm to at least hear what terms Stalin might be willing to offer. Hitler refuses and Dekanozov — after waiting four days for someone to show up — returns to Moscow.

In Asia, Chiang Kai-shek on September 13 is elected to a threeyear term as President of the Chinese Republic. He retains his post as commander-in-chief of the Chinese Army. In Germanoccupied northern Italy, an anti-Badoglio, anti-monarchy Republican Fascist Party is established, replacing the National Fascist Party that was banned after Mussolini's removal. In Berlin, Adolf Hitler tells his aide, Karl Wolff, that he wants Pope Pius XII deported to Germany. Almost simultaneously, Ernst von Weiszacker, Germany's emissary to the Vatican, delivers "Hitler's personal assurances" that the city-state's independence as a sovereign nation will be protected and that its territory within Rome will be exempt from attack. Farther south, a German counterattack pierces the Allies' perimeter at the Salerno beachhead, but is turned back by a desperate defense about a half mile from the water's edge.

British troops on September 14 take Bari, a port on the Adriatic Sea in southeastern Italy. American troops land on Sardinia. Albania declares its independence from Italy, which had annexed the Balkan nation in 1939; two German divisions - moved there following the Italian surrender to the Allies — occupy the country.

On September 15, the Australian 7th and 9th Divisions capture Lae, in Papua-New Guinea, after very heavy fighting. Benito Mussolini, from Hitler's "Wolf's Lair" headquarters in Rastenburg, Poland, proclaims his return to power and re-establishes fascism in northern Italy. The German-Italian Axis is declared resumed and the death penalty is introduced for Italians carrying arms in German-occupied areas. Despite the Vatican's neutrality and Hitler's "personal assurances" of exemption from attack, German paratroopers take position in St. Peter's Square.

British troops begin landing on Italian-held Greek islands in the Aegean Sea on September 16 — Kos, Leros and Samos are among the first. The Red Army recaptures the Black Sea port city of Novorossiysk, Russia, from the Germans.


