PERTH AMBOY - The Perth Amboy Fire Department responded to a reported explosion at 454 State Street at 04:12 on 11/18/18. Units arrived, confirmed that an explosion had occurred and reported a working fire with residents above still exiting. 12 occupants were safely removed. The fire escalated to 4 alarms and was contained to the building of origin. Two tower ladders and numerous hoselines were used to bring the fire under control. Responding units were E-3, E-1, E-4, T-2, C-5, C-1, C-3, C-9, C-2 & C-8. Mutual aid from Keasbey, Hopelawn, South Amboy, Fords, Port Reading, Sayreville, Iselin & Edison assisted on location along with the Middlesex County Fire Marshal's Office. Middlesex, North Brunswick, Colonia & Piscataway covered the city during the incident. The fire is currently under investigation and crews are still operating awaiting the demolition crew to bring the building down to complete extinguishment. There were no civilian injuries and there were three firefighter injuries that were all treated and released from the hospital.

The criteria to name the school was it must be named after someone from Perth Amboy, and the person must be deceased.

Board Member Lissette Lebron stated, "The Perth Amboy Board of Education accepted applications for naming the new school (on Seaman Avenue). We had a meeting on August 14<sup>th</sup> and on September 26<sup>th</sup>. Three names were nominated: Austin Gumbs, Rose M. Lopez, and the Marcus & Rebecca Spring School. Rose M. Lopez School was the final vote. I would like to thank all the members and thank all who attended the meetings."

Board Member Tashi Vasquez then added, "I thank the committee. You realize all of the history (of Perth Amboy). It's important to keep the history of our town and the stories of it's people alive. Rose Lopez was my 4<sup>th</sup> Grade Principal. She brought a lot of positive changes to the school district."

Board Member Obi Gonzalez said, "I knew Rose Lopez. Ms. Lopez gave so much to our community. It's a wonderful choice."

The Board voted unanimously to adopt the name of Rose M. Lopez to the elementary school on Seaman Avenue and to report the naming to the SDA (School Development Authority).





# Tom's Tax Tips

#### **Five Annual Tax Essentials**

The more things change the more they stay the same. This is especially true when it comes to reviewing your tax situation. Mark your calendar to review these essential items each year to ensure you are not missing something that could cause tax trouble when you file your tax return:

#### 1. Required minimum distributions

If you are 70½ or older, you may need to take required minimum distributions (RMDs) from your retirement accounts. RMDs need to be completed by Dec. 31 every year after you turn the required age. Don't forget to make all RMDs because the fines are extremely hefty if you don't - 50 percent of the amount you should have withdrawn.

#### 2. Your IRS PIN

If you are a victim of IRS identity theft you will be mailed a onetime use personal identification number (PIN) as added security. You can expect to receive your PIN in the mail sometime in December. Save the PIN as it is required to file your Form 1040. If you would like to sign up for the PIN program, you can do so on the IRS website. Note that once you are enrolled in the program, there is no opt out. A PIN will be required for all future filings with the IRS.

#### 3. Retirement Contributions

You may wish to make some last-minute contributions to qualified retirement accounts like an IRA. This can be \$5,500 for traditional or Roth IRAs plus an additional \$1,000 if you are 50 or older. Contributions to traditional IRAs need to happen by April 15, 2019 to be deducted on your 2018 tax return.

#### 4. Harvest Gains and Losses

Profits and losses on investments have their own tax rates from 0 percent to as high as 37 percent. Knowing this, make plans to conduct an annual tax review of investment moves you wish to make. This includes:

- o Understanding investments held longer than one year have lower tax rates as long-term capital gains.
- o Trying to net ordinary income tax investment sales with long-term investment losses.
- o Making full use of the annual \$3,000 loss limit on investment sales

Timing matters with investment sales and income taxes, so having a year-end strategy can help lower your tax bill.

#### 5. Last-Minute Tax Moves

While your last-minute tax move opportunities may be limited, here are a few ideas worth considering:

- o Make donations to your favorite charities to maximize your itemized deductions.
  - o Consider contributions of up to \$100,000 from retirement accounts to qualified charities if you are older than  $70\frac{1}{2}$ .

  - retirement accounts if you are over 591/2. o Delay receipt of income or accelerate



# Tribute to Stan Lee

As everyone has heard, one of the greats has passed away. Just like Walt Disney, Jim Henson, and Fred Rogers, another has joined their ranks: Stan Lee. For those of you who don't know his name, he is the ambassador to comic books: a writer and the creator of Marvel Comics.

Born in New York City, Stan spent his life with his mother and father and his kid brother and love to read. He was inspired by many of the greats as a young man and he went to join the Army during World War II. He was a member of the signal Corps. Two big things happened to him after that: he met his wife and then he got involved with Timely or Atlas Comics. The company eventually became Marvel.

Like a lot of other writers, he worked in comic books. He was frustrated by just repeating the same stories and mostly during this era, popular culture was reserved for children. He was about to quit, but his wife said to him, "Why don't you write to your story your way?" With that, his editor wanted a group of superheroes that were inspired after the Justice League. He came up with his own brand of superheroes called The Fantastic Four: Sue, Reed, Johnny, and Ben who were a group of explorers who wanted to beat the Russians to the Moon. They came back with Cosmic powers, so they decided to dedicate their lives fighting wrongs and helping people with their fantastic powers. The difference between these Heroes and what happened at the time was that the Fantastic Four didn't always get along. Reed, Sue, and Johnny could walk around and have a normal life without having to use their powers. Ben was stuck in a rocky form. What does one do when one is stuck like that? That is what Stan Lee wanted to explore.

After that success, he helped

create Iron Man a modern medieval knight who uses gadgetry to fight against the weapons that he had created. The Mighty Thor, the Wasp and Ant-Man, a revamped Captain America and bringing them together in a group called The Avengers. And of course, his magnum opus: "The Amazing Spider-Man," a character that nobody wanted. The editor told him he was crazy and said people are afraid of spiders and you don't know anything about teenagers. They're sidekicks. Heroes are perfect. But once again, his loving wife told him, "Well, put it on the shelf. So, there was a book they were about to cancel called, "The Amazing Fantasy," a twilight zone or O'Henry like book that would have a twist ending. The great Jack Kirby drew the cover and Steve Ditko supplied the art inside. Then the legend was born. Spider-Man changed everything - not just comic books but for everything else. Marvel Heroes made their way from comic books to cartoons to television, even teaching kids to read with the public television show, "The Electric Company."

As most superhero fans know, Stan Lee has appeared in every Marvel movie since its beginnings. I love the scene with him and Tobey Maguire as he says to Spider-Man: "One man can make a difference." Enough said.

We are his children because he touched every single one of us whoever either read a comic book or seen one of Marvel's movies or cartoons.

So, all I have to say is: Excelsior Forever!





# This Week in World War II 75 Years Ago

On the Eastern Front, German troops retake Zhytomyr, in western Ukraine, on November 19, 1943, as Soviet forces withdraw. In the Gilbert Islands, carrier aircraft from U.S. Navy Task Force 50, commanded by Adm. Charles Pownall, conduct raids over Mili, Tarawa, Makin and Nauru islands, as a prelude to landings there. In all, four carrier groups — comprising 11 aircraft carriers, 5 battleships and 6 cruisers, as well as destroyers and submarines — are involved in the action.

"Operation Galvanic" — attacks on the Tarawa and Makin Atolls, in the Gilbert Islands, on October 20 — marks the beginning of U.S. Navy Adm. Chester Nimitz's drive through the Central Pacific. In the landings, U.S. Marines take heavy fire from Japanese shore guns. In Europe, the British evacuate the Greek island of Samos, in the Aegean Sea.

At Tarawa Atoll, the 2nd Marine Division lands on Betio Island on November 21. There are heavy casualties on the beaches initially, but by noon some progress is being made in successfully landing more troops. Elsewhere on the atoll, other American units land on Bairiki Island. At Makin Atoll, elements of the U.S. Army's 27th Infantry Division land and begin to advance on Butaritari Island.

U.S. President Franklin Roosevelt, British Prime Minister Winston Churchill and Republic of China President Chiang Kaishek meet in Cairo, Egypt, on November 22 to discuss ways to defeat Japan. In Germany, the RAF gives Berlin its worst pounding so far, with more than 2,300 tons of bombs dropped on the city in less than 30 minutes. In Lebanon, the French High Commissioner orders the release from prison of the nation's president, prime minister and cabinet members, all of whom had been jailed earlier in the month. The action ends the French Mandate and marks Lebanon's independence.

Tarawa and Makin Atolls are cleared of Japanese defenders and secured by American forces on November 23. Back in the U.S., the American public is shocked by the heavy losses of life as stories about the landings and casualty details begin to appear in newspapers. In 76 hours of intense fighting, 1,093 Marines have been killed and 2,193 wounded. Berlin is hit again by the RAF, making it the most-bombed city in Germany, with 12,000 tons of ordnance dropped on it in 1943 alone.

Japanese submarine I-175 torpedoes and sinks the American escort carrier USS Liscome Bay off Makin Atoll on November 24, claiming the lives of 54 officers and 648 enlisted men of the ship's complement of 916. Among the dead is Cook Third Class Doris "Dorie" Miller, the first African-American awarded the Navy Cross (for gallantry during the attack on Pearl Harbor in 1941). The U.S. Navy Department announces that very few Japanese are left alive in the Gilbert Islands. On Tarawa, only 100 Japanese have been taken prisoner out of a garrison of 4,836. Of the 100, only 17 are soldiers. On Papua-New Guinea, Sattelberg falls to the 9th Australian Division. Berlin is reported as a "sea of flames" this morning from bombings, with casualty estimates put at between 8,000 and 10,000 killed.

Rangoon, Burma, is bombed by American heavy bombers on November 25. U.S. aircraft operating from bases in China raid targets on Japanese-held Formosa. A destroyer action off Cape St. George, New Ireland — to the northwest of Bougainville — results in the Japanese being routed, losing three destroyers out of five. The action also brings an end to the "Tokyo Express," as Japanese night-time resupply missions had come to be known.


