Reilly and McLaughlin **Speak Out About Manhattan Beach Project**

11/19/18 Council Meeting

By: Joseph L. Kuchie SOUTH AMBOY - South Amboy Councilmen Tom Reilly and Brian McLaughlin both spoke out against the Manhattan Beach Project at the November 19th city council meeting.

The Manhattan Beach Project would bring in 291 residential rental units to South Amboy by 2023 and an additional 210 units by 2025. Reilly was concerned that the PILOT included in the deal would not benefit the city's taxpayers.

"I would just ask that my colleagues on the council really look long and hard into the pilot as proposed and try to match it up to some of the other pilots, and the PILOT that was given to the Woodmont Properties," Reilly said. I think those PIthe PILOT Manhattan Beach is asking for and that currently is not the case."

"I wish we'd do our due diligence on those other pilots and determine that Manhattan Beach is low and they're not, in my opinion and from what I've seen, they're on the low end," he continued. "I personally don't think it's fair to the taxpayers in town, I think the PILOT should be higher."

Councilman McLaughlin raised concerns about the po-

tential strain the additional units and residents would put on the city's school system and first responders. He also touched on Manhattan Beach's construction labor plan, as there is no plan in the project agreement to use union trade labor when construction begins in 2020.

"We have 164 trades that live in this small town, so I think it's beneficial for us to do it under that," McLaughlin said. "It's been statistically proven that union trade labor gets the job done on time and on budget. The trades also do tremendous donations to people in need, organizations, and events."

There will be a public hearspecifically the one in Carteret ing on the ordinances regarding Manhattan Beach Project during the city's December 5th business meeting. Both ordi-LOTS should more resemble nances were approved on first reading during the city's November business meeting.

Residents will be able to speak on the project and give their opinion to the council before a vote is held on second reading. If approved by the council, it will be sent to Mayor Fred Henry for final approval.

All council members were in attendance for the council meeting. The business meeting on December 5th will be held at 6:00 p.m. at City Hall.





On Thanksgiving Day, they supplied over 1000 meals to those who attended the Thanksgiving festivities at Olive Street. 300 meals were delivered to shut-ins.

A Simple Way to Keep the Flu Away

You can prevent the flu this season by taking one simple step: Get a flu vaccine. The CDC recommends everyone 6 months and older get vaccinated. Unfortunately, some people think that getting a flu vaccine is too much trouble or costs too much. Or they are sure that a flu shot will make them sick.

The flu is also called seasonal influenza. It is caused by one of several strains of the flu virus (type A or B) that infect the nose, throat, and lungs. The flu makes life miserable for a week or two for many people. But, it is deadly for some. Flu season can start as early as October. It peaks anywhere from late December to early April. Your best defense against the flu is to get vaccinated.

- The flu vaccine is usually given by shot, most often into a muscle in the arm. This form of the vaccine has killed virus. Itis approved for most people older than 6 months of age. CDC recommends that some children get two full doses one month apart. This applies to children ages 6 months to 8 years who have never been vaccinated, or received only one dose of vaccine.
- A nasal spray may also be given for the 2018-2019 flu season. It is made of live but weakened flu virus. It is for healthy children 2 years or older who don't get the flu shot.
- A needle-free device called a jet injector can give the flu vaccine through the skin. This may be an option for people 18 to 64

A flu vaccine is especially important for people who are more likely to have problems if they get the flu. This includes, children younger than 5 years, and especially younger than 2 years, people 65 years and older, those with long-term (chronic) health conditions, anyone who lives in a nursing home or care facility and pregnant women and women who have had a baby in the previous two weeks. Some people shouldn't be vaccinated for the flu before talking with their health care provider, including people who have a severe allergy such as an anaphylactic reaction to chicken eggs, developed Guillain-Barré syndrome in the six weeks after getting a flu shot in the past, or if you currently have an illness with a fever. Wait until symptoms get better before getting the vaccine. Children younger than 6 months of age should not be vaccinated against the flu. Flu vaccines have not been approved for that age group.

Do not believe the rumor that a flu shot can give you even a mild case of the flu. It is impossible. The vaccine does not contain a form of the flu virus that can give you the flu. The injected form of the vaccine is made from pieces of dead flu virus cells. After getting the vaccine, some people have mild flu-like symptoms as a side effect. This is not the same thing as having the flu.

The main reason you should be vaccinated each year is that the flu virus is constantly changing

into new strains. Each year the CDC tries to figure out which flu strains will have the biggest effect and works with vaccine makers to create the specific vaccine that will fight the predicted strains for that year.

If you are concerned about the cost of a flu vaccine, check with your local health department for places near you where free flu shots are given. Many insurers also cover flu vaccines at no cost to their members. Discuss getting the flu shot with your

Step It Up to Cut Cancer Risk

Need a reason to lace up your sneakers and head out the door? Whether you prefer a neighborhood stroll, a yoga class, or a round of golf, exercise can do more than keep you fit—it may reduce your risk of developing cancer as well. Previous research found a link between exercise and a lower risk for breast, endometrial, and colon cancer. But, a study published in JAMA Internal Medicine found that exercise can reduce the risk for 10 other cancers as well, including lung, esophageal, and liver cancer.

If you are asking yourself how much exercise you need, the U.S. Department of Health & Human Services released new science-based guidelines for physical activity November 12, 2018. This is the first time the guidelines were updated since the initial guidelines were released in 2008, but the government says only 20 percent of Americans meet the activity goals. We know that the immediate benefits of exercise include reduced anxiety, improved sleep and blood sugar control, and long-term benefits (of regular physical activity), include cognitive benefits reducing the risk of dementia, and significantly lower risks of heart disease.

The new guidelines' 150 minutes a week of moderate-intensity physical activity for adults has not changed since 2008, but now include on emphasis on all movement that helps you stay physically active as important. Not just aerobic activity sessions count towards the goal, any activity that gets your heart rate up, including walking counts. These guidelines also call for adults to complete muscle-strengthening activities two or more days a week and exercises that maintain or improve balance three times a week. Balance exercises may include standing on one foot, heel-totoe walking, and slowly walking while raising knees high.

Here is the great part about physical exercise as cancer prevention and for improved health - it does not have to cost you a thing. Household chores, yard work, gardening, and walking all count as moderate-intensity activity. If you have physical limitations look for exercise options that will work for you. Adaptive yoga classes, water exercise, and moves that use exercise bands may all be a good

There are no excuses for not getting enough exercise, as research continues to add benefits to the list. Increase your level of physical activity now. How-



ever, no matter what your abilities, be sure to check with your doctor before starting a new exercise program.

Don't Let A Disaster **Derail Your Business**

With the recent frequency of hurricanes, earthquakes, tornadoes, floods and wildfires, it's worth reviewing ideas to ensure your business can survive if it faces its own disaster. Here are some steps you can take to create a disaster plan for your business:

- Identify your exposure. The first step is to conduct an evaluation of your business to identify possible threats. Threats will vary by business depending on geography, industry, size and other factors. Once the threats are identified, create lists of risks your business would face under each type of threat.
- Mitigate where possible. Once you understand your business risks, brainstorm steps you can take to mitigate your exposure. For example, if loss of data is a common risk, implementing an off-site backup system might be a good idea. The more you can minimize risks on the front end, the quicker you can get back to normal operations after a disaster strikes.
- Create a disaster plan. Decide in advance what steps you and the business will take if a disaster happens. Going through the motions in a test environment will increase your chance of success if you experience a real emergency.
- Understand tax deductions. If you incur losses from a disaster, there are many factors that go into how the losses are deducted on your taxes. Some of the considerations are insurance proceeds, basis adjustments, disaster classifications and improvement capitalization. Set up a meeting to discuss what is best for your situation.

Disasters are often unavoidable, but having a plan in place before they hit can reduce the impact they have on your business and employees.



This Week in World War II 75 Years Ago

HMT Rohna, a British troop transport, on November 26, 1943, is attacked in the eastern Mediterranean by a Luftwaffe plane using a radio-guided bomb. The ship sinks, killing 1,015 American GIs and 135 British and Australian servicemen. It is the largest loss of U.S. soldiers to enemy action at sea in the war. The disaster is kept secret, as the Allies do not wish to disclose that the Germans possess such an intimidating weapon. Consequently, the destruction of HMT Rohna will remain virtually unknown to the public until many years after the war.

The British Eighth Army on November 27 brings an armored brigade into the bridgehead it has made on the north bank of the Sangro River in eastern central Italy. The tanks will support the Allied forces fighting there. At the Cairo Conference, President Roosevelt, Prime Minister Churchill and Chinese president Chiang Kai-shek release the Cairo Declaration, which says among other things that "all the territories that Japan has stolen from the Chinese . . . shall be restored to the Republic of China." They also state that "in due course, Korea [a territory of Japan since 1910] shall become free and independent."

The Tehran Conference convenes on November 28 in Iran. U.S. President Franklin Roosevelt, British Prime Minister Winston Churchill and Soviet leader Joseph Stalin meet for the first time to discuss war strategy. In the Pacific, a battalion-sized force of U.S. Marines lands at Koiari, on Bougainville Island, to harass Japanese troops stationed there.

In Italy, the British Eighth Army continues to make progress along the Sangro River. Mozzagrogna is captured on November 29, as is Fossacesia, at the mouth of the river near the Adriatic Sea, later in the day. In the Bismarck Archipelago, four U.S. destroyers bombard Japanese positions on the south shore of New Britain island. On Papua-New Guinea, Australian troops take Gusika and Bongo. Sio, the site of a major Japanese operating base on the coast farther north, is shelled by Allied warships. The Anti-Fascist Council of National Liberation for Yugoslavia, meeting in Bosnia-Herzegovina, declares that the government-in-exile is illegitimate, the monarchy will not be restored after the war and that post-war Yugoslavia will consist of a federation of six republics headed by Josip Broz Tito.

In Tehran, Iran, Churchill, Roosevelt and Stalin hammer out an agreement on November 30 concerning "Operation Overlord," an invasion of western Europe, planned for May 1944. Finally, Stalin has gained what he has long sought: the opening of a second European front.

The U.S., the U.K. and China on December 1, 1943, issue a joint statement from the Cairo Conference, which ended five days earlier: They pledge to defeat Japan and strip Nippon of all territory gained since 1895. On the same day, the Tehran Conference concludes with the U.S., the U.K. and the U.S.S.R. in substantial agreement on the division of post-war Germany and the westward movement of Poland's western and eastern frontiers (without any input from the Poles). In Ukraine, Soviet forces isolate the Germans in the Crimea. The neutral Swedish ocean liner *MS Gripsholm* docks in New York Harbor, repatriating 1,223 Americans, 217 Canadians and a small number of Latin Americans brought from Mormugao, Portuguese India. They were trapped in Japan at the start of the war and were exchanged for Japanese civilians similarly caught in the U.S. at the outbreak of hostilities.

Bari, Italy, becomes the only European city to be exposed to chemical-warfare agents during the war — unintentionally. A Luftwaffe raid by 105 Junkers JU 88 bombers on December 2 hits the harbor at Bari, crowded with Allied ships. Over 1,000 people are killed in the attack and 38,000 tons of supplies are destroyed. Eighteen vessels are sunk, including the American Liberty ship SS John Harvey, which is carrying a highly secret cargo of 2,000 mustard-gas bombs (being brought to the front to retaliate in case the Germans initiate chemical warfare). In the explosion that destroys *Harvey*, liquid sulfur mustard is released into the harbor waters and a cloud of sulfur mustard gas blows over the city. Because the Americans never notified anyone of the presence of the sulfur mustard, doctors are unaware that many of the wounded, rescuers and sick civilians they are treating are victims of mustard gas rather than immersion, exposure or wounds (only). Deaths resulting from mustard exposure alone are hard to determine, but estimates indicate around 83 military (including merchant seamen) and over 1,000 Italian civilians died. (Per orders of both Roosevelt and Churchill, all records pertaining to the incident are destroyed and the entire affair kept secret for years [until 1959 in the U.S.].) British troops capture Lanciano, Italy, on the Adriatic, 100 miles east of Rome. In Germany, der Führer approves conscription of Hitlerjugend (Hitler Youth, the youth organization of the Nazi Party) for active military service. Members are aged 14-18.






