PERTH AMBOY - 4 p.m. Tuesday, 9/4/12 was the deadline for candidates for Mayor and Council to hand in their petitions. One Council Candidate, Zeny Cruz who was on Judge Jose Cameron's ticket dropped out for personal reasons. One new candidate for Council came in with Frank Salado. Salado was the first Mayoral candidate to hand in his petitions on Thursday, 8/30/12. That new candidate was James Francis Aleck. The City Clerk had to verify that all petitions handed in were eligible. Each candidate was required to hand in 217 signatures of registered voters from Perth Amboy for them to be placed on the ballot. Any candidate not meeting that quota would be given until Thursday, 9/6/12 Noon to rectify the situation. Eligible candidates may drop out of the race prior to the day the ballots positions are drawn. That tentative date is Thursday, 9/13/12 at 3 p.m.



All of the ladies attending the ball Are requested to gaze in the faces Found on YOUR dance cards Please then remember And don't get to close To one special one He will take your defenses and run.


*So we change partners* Time to change partners You must change partners Again

Part of the lyrics of "Change Partners" by Stephen Sills, one of my favorite songs. In the first line "All of the ladies attending the ball" you can substitute the word "participants" for ladies. Where it says "He" change it to "They." Wherever it says partners substitute the word "parties" instead.

Republicans, Democrats, Independents, Libertarians and so on: there are politicians who started with a mainstream political party and then switched sides just to win an election. On the national scene, former Senator Arlen Specter of Pennsylvania was a Republican who switched to being a Democrat. Yes, there are politicians who stay true blue to their party until their career is over. Contrary to what you may believe, it is not against the law to change your party affiliation.

There are good and bad in all parties. I remember when people used to talk about the days when the Dems and Republicans would go after each other in public and then afterwards go and have a drink or dinner together. It was show time in the public arena.

## **The Fisherman's Corner**

PERTH AMBOY - I am back! Due to PC technical difficulties. I was not able to do my weekly reports. Sorry for that.

Now down to business. Let's start with something I have not seen in Perth Amboy's local waters in about six years weakfish. Yes, they are back making being caught off the piers and beaches on squid and peanut bunker. Weakfish regulations are 1 fish at 13" few locals brought in up to 17".

Spot fish have been abundant being caught on small pieces on bloodworms and sandworms. A great alternative to live worms are Fish bites or gulp sand or blood. I've tried them myself and they do work well though I favor the fish bites a little more.

Snapper blues and cocktail blues are still running strong chasing poppers, spearing and peanuts all along the bay fluking has slowed down quite a bit with a catch here and there the bigger fish seeking cooler waters with more oxygen in depths of 80 pulse feet.

Schoolie stripers are also being caught on sandworms at night average size is 17"-19". Soon the big boys will be back for the fall run mid October through December depending on water temps until then I recommend using circle hooks for a safe release to many fish are injured using J hooks and end up dying needlessly. It's up to us to do the right thing. Circle hooks by design hook the fish on the side of the mouth avoiding them to swallow the hook injuring themselves. Since I'm

on the topic of doing the right thing. Over-catching baitfish -It's easy to do but always keep in mind take what you need. Too many times I've seen people going nuts catching snagging netting bait and when the smoke clears they have all this bait they don't know what to do with. The school of bait scared off with the fish under them gone so then what? Exactly.

September 15th is the annual youth fishing derby held at the second pier closest to the Armory, you know the one that's been making all the papers. This is yet another great opportunity to take your kids fishing or introduce them to fishing. It's a lot of fun great prizes and memories made. I can't stress the importance of what a impact something like fishing means to a kid. I know it always meant something to

me as you all know from my previous reports I hold very dear. The times me and my dad went fishing and the times spent by the water.

This week's catch of the week is a hardcore fisherman if I ever saw one. His name is Jesse Menna. This young man fishes in all weather and conditions blistering heat freezing

cold nice sunny days to hurricane advisories all day all night that is a true hardcore fisherman which reminds me of a little something I read a long time ago.
